JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY NOVEMBER 22, 1963, DALLAS, TEXAS The purpose of this memorandum is to report an allegation that Ross Scaccia, an Assistant United States Attorney in New Orleans, recently planned to hold a secretmeeting with Clay Shaw and Eugene Davis, both of whom have received considerable publicity in connection with James C. Garrison's probe in New Orleans, Louisiana. Letter to Department attached. Clay Shaw is the individual who has been charged by Garrison as being involved in a conspiracy to assassinate President Kennedy. Garrison claims Shaw is identical to the Clay Eertrand who allegedly contacted New Orleans attorney Dean Andrews immediately after the assassination and requested Andrews to go to Dallas to defend Lee Harvey Oswald. has denied that Clay Shaw is Clay Bertrand and has been 6) 62-109060 Enclos Tre & 62-109060

convicted of perjury in the Criminal Court, Parish of Orleans, New Orleans, Louisiana. Eugene Davis'is a homosexual who owns Wanda's Ear in New Orleans. At one time Andrews claimed Davis

Wanda's Dar in New Orleans. At one time Andrews claimed Davis was Clay Bertrand. Davis has denied this.

Ross Scaccia has been an Assistant United States Attorney in New Orleans since early June, 1967. Prior to that, from November, 1963, to Narch, 1967, he worked for New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is not known if the information furnished in this matter by correct. Our contacts with lave been instance to determine his reliability. If the allegations of are correct, it would appear that scaccia is involved in some manner with the Garrison probe in New Orleans. It is felt we should disseminate this information New Orleans. It is felt we should disseminate this information to the Department but that we not initiate any active investigation to attempt to ascertain the validity of the allegations or the significance of Scaccia's activities involving Shaw and Eugene Davis, if the allegations are true.
