New Orleans is referred to Bureau letter to New Orleans dated March 6, 1967, enclosing a copy of a letter dated March 6, 1967, to Mr. Frank W. Manning and a copy of a memorandum which was sent to the White House and the Attorney General.

Since the anonymous communication does not come within the jurisdiction of the Bureau and pertains to conditions existing in New Orleans relative to Jim Garrison, New Orleans should furnish copy of the anonymous letter in writing to Mr. Frank Manning, Chief Inspector for Attorney General Jack P. F. Gremillion of Louisiana for information and any appropriate action.

In the event Manning is no longer affiliated with the Louisiana Office of the Attorney General, then the communication should be directed to the appropriate person within that office. A copy of your communication is to be furnished to the Bureau for completion of Bureau files.

NOTE:

Frank W. Manning on March 1, 1967, furnished former Inspector H. Lynn Edwards information relative to investigation being conducted by Jim Garrison in New Orleans. He also furnished information concerning sex deviates and the possibility of a "shake down" racket involving individuals in New Orleans, Louisiana, area. In a letter to Manning on 3/6/67, he was advised there was no violation within our jurisdiction and that there appeared to be a more serious violation of state laws concerning the "shake down" racket of sex deviates, which information they had for sometime and investigation would be more appropriately made by state authorities.

Since the anonymous letter contains similar allegations, New Orleans is being instructed to refer this anonymous letter that we received from the Department to the office of the Attorney General of Louisiana. Information pertaining to our previous communication in this matter is contained in 62-109060, serials 4601, 4646, 4661, and 4748.
