I have just finished reading the December 2nd issue of the Saturday Evening Post regarding "Six Seconds in Dallas" by Josiah Thompson.

I believe that the assassination should be investigated until there is not one small discrepancy in the story; and if in the end there are discrepancies which cannot be explained, that they be noted as such. I never could understand why a group of lawyers would be given the job of sifting through that information. It has appeared that no one has really been in complete charge of finding all the answers - neither the FBI nor the Secret Service. Who in the government is trying to cover up the truth? Why is not more cooperation given for instance to the Garrison charges - if not cooperation, unflagging interest until he is disproved?

It is a frightening thing to have something that important to our country left with so many details unexplained, and with the most important witnesses ignored. Governor Connelly disagrees with the Warren Report.

Surely there are thousands of citizens asking you, as I am, to reopen this investigation and investigate with every known fact at hand, as we always expect the FBI to do. And if there is someone in government who is preventing this, make it public so that the general public can force something to be done. It is just impossible for us to accept the Warren Report.
