Dear Sir.

I guess by now my reports to local F.B.I. office have reached you. I called in my last one Nov 23rd 1967 11 P.M. by phone. I told them to contact me if they wanted to hear more. It seems as tho they don't. I'll start from the very frist of my doing's. 6 days or more before Pres. J.F.K. went to Dallas, Tex. I told my friend Phil Conley Gen. M. worker at So. Gate, Cal. where we worked, that I should send J.F.K. a tele-gram & tell him not to go to Texas. I told him they would kill him. He ask who. I told him I don't really know but it could be Mr. K of R & Castro of Cuba, or it could be the Johnson bunch or a million other people from Tex. just on the race issue alone. Well as you know he talked me out of it. I loved J.F.K. & felt it was my fault in a way he was killed, by not sending tele-gram. I told around when my pension paid me enough to live on, I was going to retire from G.M. & find out who killed J.F.K. as good a men as was on the Warren Com. I could never take there words as final. I knew I had to work out or on a plan that maybe I would be killed in my mission. I always beleived that God would see to it I lived. In the back of my head I had something to work on, but I had forgot just what it was. I took a \$3,000 or more cut in pay to try & fullfill my mission as I'll call it.
