Your : : communication enclosing a letter dated December 10, 1907, bearing the signature of Timothy R. Lowe was received on December 14, 1967.

Mr. Lowe wrote to this Bureau on August 3, 1967, indicating he had knowledge regarding the assassination of President Kennedy. Subsequently he was interviewed by a Special Agent of this Bureau and Captain James Steinman, Logansport, Indiana, Police Department, on August 10, 1967.

Mr. Lowe stated he was 48 years old and had had He knew that John Fitzgerald Kennedy was going to be assassinated long before President Kennedy was a national figure.

He mentioned it was his opinion a person in Logansport, Indiana, named "Richard Schoenradt" was responsible for the assassination of President Kennedy. lie claimed he had visions of "Schoenradt" in 1923 and first observed him in October, 1961. He said the only evidence for his statement is in his body and he could not produce anything to substantiate his comments.

In view of the comments made by Mr. Lowe during the course of the interview, no further action was taken. His letter is returned herewith as requested.
