Re Dallas airtel to Bureau, 12/15/67; New Orleans airtel to Bureau, 12/14/67; Dallas teletype to Bureau and New Orleans, 12/15/67; Dallas airtel to Bureau, 12/14/67; Bureau telephone call to Dallas, 12/14/67; and New Orleans teletype to Bureau and Dallas, 12/13/67.

Referenced communications deal with recent revelations by District Attorney JAMES GARRISON, of New Orleans, concerning his allegations that a .45 caliber bullet killed President KENNEDY, and that a "Federal Agent" was depicted in a photograph picking up such a bullet in the vicinity of Texas School Book Depository shortly after the assassination, and that information about such a bullet had been concealed by the Federal Government.

Referenced New Orleans airtel of 12/14/67 and Bureau instructions in referenced Bureau telephone call requested that a canvass of Agents who participated in the assassination investigation be made to determine if an identification could be made of the alleged "Federal Agent."

*C. C. Bishop* A number of Agents who participated in the assassination investigation have reviewed the above-described photograph without effecting an identification.

SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING, who was coordinator of the assassination investigation cannot effect an identification.

On 12/15/67, SAC FORREST V. SORRELS, U. S. Secret Service, Dallas, voluntarily commented to SA GEMBERLING, while being contacted on another matter, that he did not know such individual in the photograph and that such individual was definitely not a Secret Service Agent.

It should be noted that Deputy Sheriff EDDIE RAYMOND "BUDDY" WALTHERS, of the Dallas County SO, is reflected in this same photograph and has been interviewed by news media, as set forth in Dallas teletype to Bureau and New Orleans dated 12/15/67, but no specific mention is made as to whether WALTHERS could identify the alleged "Federal Agent."

No contact will be had with WALTHERS concerning the identity of this individual, UACB.
