Assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY NOVEMBER 22, 1965, DALLAS, TEXAS MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATON CONCERNING

Enclosed for Seattle and Dallas is a Xerox copy of a letter received from the Department and a Kerox copy of a telegram which accompanied this communication, both of which are self-explanatory.

Based on information furnished, Seattle, Washington, was not identifiable in Bureau files. Bureau files reveal a reference in the Jack L. Ruby case to Mr. and Mrs. Texas. This name was furnished on November 29, 1963, when Mrs. Moward Summers, 1407 Wilshire Prive, Odessa, Texas furnished information to the effect that on September 4, 1963, she along with the Lees and others was at a table in the dining room of the Cabana Motel, located near the Trade Mart, Dallas, Texas, in September, 1963, and at that time observed a person who resembled Jack L. Ruby at an adjoining table. According to Mrs. Summers, the person who she believed resembled Jack L. Ruby was in the company of two men and a woman, one of whom was described as a gray-haired man with a flat-top haircut, wearing heavy glasses, age, approximately fifty years and dark complexion.
