ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN VITZGERALD KRNEDY POVEHERN 22, 1963, DALLAS, TEXAS

Reference is made to my communication dated
December 28, 1967, and to the memorandum also dated
December 28, 1967, which was enclosed with that communication.
The memorandum analysed allegations made by New Orlpans
District Attorney James C. Garrison in a press conference
held by him in New Orleans, on December 26, 1967.

Carrison, at the December 26, 1967, press. conference, alleged that Loran Hall of California had inside knowledge of the assassination the day it happened. The analysis of this allegation is set forth on pages 3 and 4 of the above-mentioned mesorandum. This analysis included pertinent information developed by this Bureau concerning Loran Eugene Hall and Lewrence Howard.

Garrison had subpossed three wes as material witnesses in his investigation. They were reported as Loran A. Hall, of Keraville, California; Lawrence J. Boward, Jr., of Los Angeles; and Thomas Seckham, of Quaha, Rebrusks. I thought that you would want to know the pertinent information from the files of this Bureau concerning Thomas Beckham, im-addition to that already furnished concerning Hall and Boward.

The name of Thomas Beckham never appeared during our invostigation of the assassination of President Kennedy. Nowever, on January 13, 1967, we received information that Garrison had located a vitness. Thomas Beckham, who was allegedly associated with Oswald and assisted him in passing out leaflets. Our files contain a reforence to a Thomas Edward Beckham of New Orleans who in 1962 was speking funds for a religious group aiding Cubans. This man allegedly had a record with the New Orleans Police Reportment for being involved in such activities.
