# Bradley Denies Key Role, Says 'Off Rocker'

not come up in the federal investigation of the assassination, nor is his name mentioned anywhere in the 26 volumes of the Warren Report inquiry into the case, Garrison's office said. Garrison, registered at a Los Angeles hotel under an assumed name, according to the Associated Press. He declined comment.

Edgar Eugene Bradley, North Hollywood, Calif., radio station's representative, has denied a charge by District Attorney J. Garrison that he conspired to assassinate President John F. Kennedy at Dallas Nov. 22, 1963. The man (Garrison) is either being highly paid to do "he's off his rocker," said after the district attorney's office filed the charge late yesterday. Bradley is the second man named by Garrison in the Orleans district attorney's lengthy probe of the assassination of the President.

Garrison's office did not say whether the charge against Bradley has any connection with a similar case against Clay Shaw. Shaw was indicted for conspiracy with Lee Harvey Oswald, David Ferrie and "unknown others" to kill the president. The charge against Bradley's office states that Bradley conspired willfully and unlawfully with others to murder John F. Kennedy.

Assistant District Attorney James L. Alcock, who filed the charge against Bradley on a bill of information, recommended a fine of \$10,000. There was no indication by the district attorney's office that Bradley had been in New Orleans when the charge was filed. However, Alcock handed out photographs of Bradley. Bradley denied any part in the shooting.

BRADLEY IS a West Coast representative of the Rev. Carl McIntire, a syndicated radio broadcaster and presi-

dent of the American Council of Churches. McIntire, of Collingswood, N. J., said he was astounded and added: "I'm sure that nobody that has any connection with our movement would have anything to do with something like this." Bradley said that McIntire "has been described as a right wing broadcaster." "BUT I'M NEITHER a right-wing extremist or a left-wing extremist," Bradley added. "I don't belong to anything and I don't know anything about Garrison or the Kennedy affair." The name of Bradley did
