ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, DALLAS, TEXAS, NOV. TWENTYTWO, SIXTYTHREE, MISCELLANEOUS - INFO CONCERNING, 00: DALLAS.

NEW ORLEANS STATES-ITEM FINAL EDITION, DEC. TWENTYSEVEN, INSTANT REPORTED THAT EDGAR EUGENE BRADLEY SURRENDERED TODAY TO LOS ANGELES AUTHORITIES TO FACE CHARGES OF CONSPIRING TO KILL PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY AND WAS RELEASED BY LOS ANGELES MINICIPAL JUDGE DAVID J. AISENSEN ON HIS OWN RECOGNIZANCE. ACCORDING TO THE ARTICLE, LOS ANGELES ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY JOSEPH CARR TOLD THE JUDGE HE HAD NO OBJECTION TO THE RELEASE OF BRADLEY BECAUSE HE HAD LIVED IN THE SAME HOUSE SINCE NINETEEN FORTYONE.

ACCORDING TO THE ARTICLE GEORGE JENSEN, BRADLEY'S ATTORNEY, ACCOMPANIED BRADLEY TO THE OFFICE OF LOS ANGELES SHERIFF PETER PITCHESS TO SURRENDER AND REITERATED HIS VOW TO "FIGHT TOOTH AND NAIL" TO PREVENT HIS CLIENT'S

EXTRADITION TO LOUISIANA.

THE ARTICLE REPORTED THAT JENSEN IN A NEWS CONFERENCE AFTER THE ARRAIGNMENT PROCEEDINGS SAID THE DEFENSE IS SEEKING A COLLEGE STUDENT WHO HE SAID SAT BESIDE BRADLEY ON A BUS TRAVELING FROM OKLA. TO EL PASO ON NOV. TWENTYTWO, SIXTYTHREE, THE DAY OF THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY. JENSEN, A FORMER FBI AGENT, ISSUED AN APPEAL FOR THE STUDENT TO COME FORWARD AND TESTIFY BUT DID NOT FURNISH THIS STUDENT'S NAME. JENSEN ALSO REPORTED THREE OTHER WITNESSES WHO SAW BRADLEY THAT DAY ARE ALSO BEING SOUGHT. JENSEN MADE PUBLIC A LETTER HE SAID WAS SENT TO CALIF. GOVERNOR RONALD REAGAN ASKING GOVERNOR REAGAN TO NOTIFY LOUISIANA THAT BRADLEY WILL NOT BE EXTRADITED UNTIL CLAY SHAW IS BROUGHT TO TRIAL.

THE ARTICLE REPORTED THAT EXTRADITION HEARING WILL NOT BE SET UNTIL GOVERNOR JOHN J. MCKEITHEN FILES A FORMAL REQUEST WITH GOVERNOR REAGAN.
