Garrison Says **Ruby Spotted** Af JFK Slaying

NEW YORK (AP)-New-Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison says that a woman identified Jack Ruby as being at the scene of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in Dallas.

Garrison made the statement Wednesday during a taping of Johnny Carson's "Tonight" show for broadcast in late evening on NBC-TV.

According to the Warren Commission report, Ruby was at the offices of the Dallas Morning News when the President was shot Nov. 22, 1963. Two days later Ruby shot and killed Lee Harvey Oswald, named by the commission as Kennedy's slay-

Garrison named the woman witness as a Julia Ann Morrer. whom he did not otherwise identify.

The woman told him, Garrison said, of reporting to the FBI that she saw a man with a gun get out of a truck at the assassination scene. Shown four photographs by the FBI, Garrison said that the woman selected one as the man she saw, and that Ruby's name was on the picture.

Garrison contends that a group of at least seven men carried out the assassination, and that some elements of the Central Intelligence Agency were involved.
