C., en route to Columbus, Ohio, where he now resides. Mr. Novel, a former night club owner in Now Orleans, Louisiana, has been prominently mentioned in news media in recent months in connection with the investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy by New prieans District Attorney James C. Garrison. Mr. Novel has enounced Garrison's investigation as a complete fraud. On February 7, 1968, Mr. Novel stated that he had ecently been in contact with Clay Shaw's attorneys in giow Orleans, Louisians. Mr. Hovol claimed that these ttorneys advised him that they plan to subpoens many Federal fficials and Federal investigative personnel who were directly or indirectly involved in the investigation of the assassination of President Kennedy. Mr. Novel added that Show's attorneys feel that testimony of reputable Government witnesses regarding the lack of evidence that there was a conspiracy in the assassination of President Kennedy will be their best defense for Clay Shaw.
