Asks Dismissal of Shaw Defense Motion

.The district attorney's office Tuesday attacked the legality of a defense motion to have Clay L. Shaw's conspiracy trial moved to another jurisdiction and asked that the motion be thrown out of court.

Instead of answering the motion, Assistant District Attorneys James L. Alcock and Richard V. Burnes filed a motion of their own claiming that the defense move did not comply with state law, and that it should be stricken from the record. from the record.

The state's counterattack came as Shaw appeared before Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. to go through the formality of requesting a continuance.

POSTPONEMENT NEEDED The trial was to have begun Tuesday but the change of venue motion necessitated a

postponement.

The state's move could mean further delays in the case, already nearly one year old. Judge Haggerty gave the defense until Monday to an-swer the state's motion.

In the judge ruled in the state's favor, and the defense files a second motion, a hearing already set for March 5 on the matter could be pushed back.

Shaw, charged with criminal conspiracy in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, was, neatly dressed in a blue suit and two-tone blue striped tie for Tuesday's appearance. He declined to talk to reporters. WANT TRIAL MOVED

His attorneys want the trial moved at least 100 miles from New Orleans because of their argument that publicity concerning the case has made a fair trial impossible.

The state's motion Tuesday charged that an attempt to incorporate a motion for a change of venue with one for a continuance was improper.

The state also contended that the latest change-of-venue motion was not sworn to by the defense, but merely presented as "to the best of his knowlsufficient under the law, Alcock said.

The legal provision that the statements must be sworn to prevents the delense "from filing their application with patently false and spurious allega-tions of the fact," Alcock claimed.

NOT FOR DELAY

Alcock said the code required that the change of venue motion contain a statement that "the application is not made for the purpose of delay but to obtain a fair and impartial trial."
