Dear Sir:

It is with deep concern for the moral structure of our government that I write you.

After having listened extensively, read everything I could get hold of, and seeing some of the photographs of the assassination of your brother, I am wondering why it is that the members of his family have not insisted on a more thorough investigation than the one presented in the Warren Report. Surely there is reasonable doubt about a whole lot of things in this connection. While you may, as a family, wish this interest would die down and let a much loved president lie in peace, it is in a greater interest that matters should be further resolved. When 32 persons who were involved in one way or another are now missing, and some under rather curious circumstances, it seems to me there is a great deal that has not been done in this matter.

For instance, why have certain matters been sealed in the National Archives by President Johnson. Surely there is no information that could not now be brought out, or is there some special reason President Johnson prefers these remain in hiding? Surely the Senate could demand the release of these papers. Did Oswald have a connection with the CIA or with the FBI? There are so many unanswered questions.
