ALSTON and GILBERT G. BENJAMIN. stated that he had important information regarding the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, which he had received from "unrevealed sources". He said that the CIA was responsible for the assassination and that JACK RUBY was a "Manchurian Candidate in the affair". He further advised that "two men that Director J. EDGAR HOOVER had second guessed" could give confirmation of the above statements. He named the men as ROBERT WELCH of the John Birch Society, and General WALKER. further advised that he was offering his services to the Bureau as part of a committee to investigate the assassination without charge today; however, anytime after today, if his services are accepted, it will cost the FBI two million dollars. He asked Agents if they could assure him of what Mr. HOOVER's reaction to his offer would be.
