Judge to Rule On Subpenas For Shaw Panel

Criminal District Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. was scheduled to rule at 10 a. m. today on a motion by attorneys for Clay L. Shaw to subpena about 1,300 prospective jurors in the move to have Shaw's conspiracy trial transferred at least 100 miles from New Orleans.

The 54-year-old retired businessman has been charged by District Attorney Jim Garriwith conspiring to murder the late President John F. Kennedy. Shaw and his attorneys claim that he cannot get a fair trial here and have filed for a change of venue.

The hearing on the change . of venue was recessed Wednesday by Haggerty after Shaw's attorneys filed a motion to subpena the entire jury. wheel as witnesses.

The defense asked that the jurors be subpensed after the judge ruled repeatedly during questioning of newsmen, news executives and other witnesses that the only relevant question is whether prospective jurors feet they can hear the Shaw case fairly.
