Tracer Investigative Products, Inc., 256 Worth Avenue, Palm Beach, Florida 33482 has been engaged for several years in the commercial manufacture and sale of good quality microphone and telephone surveillance equipment. In the last few years the #10-8 automobile tailing device and the #195 concealed transmitter detector (neither of which are thoroughly reliable) have been added to Tracer's products.

Item 236-L is in the form of a cube tap which is plugged into a 110-volt outlet. The #252 is a thin pocket transmitter about the size of a large book of paper matches. The #235 is a miniature microphone transmitter about the size of a rectangular lump of sugar. The #272 is an acrtation of the #252 for concealment in automobiles and operation off a car battery. All are FM transmitters and the bid solicitation specifies a frequency range of between 30 to 50 megacycles. On special order, other frequencies may be obtained.
