The three include a Secret in the car with the President when he was shot to death in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963, and two Federal Bureau of Investigation agents who did research for the Warren Commission.

Information filed by the office of District Attorney Jim Garrison with the subpenas alleges their testimony will show the President was "struck by bullets fired by more than one individual."

GARRISON DISPUTES the Warren Commission's finding that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in killing Kennedy, and charges Shaw plotted the slaying with Oswald and others here in 1963.

The calling of these witnesses indicates that the state will attempt to reconstruct the Kennedy slaying itself in Shaw's trial, which begins Tuesday, challenging the Warren Commission's version of

The defense also subpensed 13 witnesses today, the most prominent being former Garrisoff aide William Gurvich.
