U. S. Secret Service referred a letter from Ruth Louise McAllister of Anderson, Indiana, which was addressed to Senator Bayh of Indiana. Senator Bayh's Office referred the letter to U. S. Secret Service and Secret Service indicated they are conducting no investigation. In McAllister's communication she claims she knows who killed John F. Kennedy and that he was in Chicago during March, 1969. Secret Service requested to be advised if the subject was known to the Bureau and whether any investigation was going to be conducted. By separate communication, Indianapolis has been instructed to locate and interview McAllister and the results of this interview will be furnished to U. S. Secret Service.
