U. S. Secret Service referred a letter from Ruth Louise
McAllister of Anderson, Indiana, which was addressed to Senator
Bayh of Indiana. Senator Bayh's Office referred the letter to U. S.
Secret Service and Secret Service indicated they are conducting
no investigation. In McAllister's communication she claims she
knows who killed John F. Kennedy and that he was in Chicago during
