JOHN WALL, the alleged head of the so-called "federal task force", each

between the first day of January, 1971, and the late of the Parish of Orleans ~~on~~ the thirtieth _____ day of _____ June _____ in the year

of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and seventy one with force and arms in the Parish of Orleans aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of the Criminal District Court for the Parish of Orleans, did wilfully and unlawfully violate R.S. 14:134 relative to malfeasance in office in that they did intentionally perform their various duties in an unlawful manner, and knowingly permitted other public officers and public employees under them, to intentionally perform their duties in an unlawful manner; all to the end and objective of aiding the federal government in its harassment of the District Attorney of New Orleans, Jim Garrison, and in order to inhibit and obstruct him from performing the duties of his office, among which are included the investigation of assassinations of Presidents of the United States when part of the preparation of an assassination occurred, in the District Attorney's judgment, within the City of New Orleans,

contrary to the form of the Statute of the State of Louisiana in such case made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the same.
