TRABOUCTICN Reference is made to the office memorandum to the Chief from Acting SAIC Maurice G. Martineau, Chicago, dated Nov ober 26, 1963, under file No. 2-1-511.0. That memorandum, confirming a Pong distance telectone call to Deputy Chief Paul J. Poterni, Washington, D. C., verified that this mat-ter had been discussed with Deputy Chief Paterni, who had directed that inserved as this information related to the conssinction of the late Presid at Kennedy, and that this information also could involve the protection of Provident Lyrdon B. Johnson, that all information developed by the U. S. Secret Service chould be made available to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and that a joint investigation should be conducted with an exchange of reports and a free flow of information. GENERAL INQUIRIES

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Ca November 26, 1963, at the Chicago Police Department, inquiries were made regarding Themes Hosley & Tom, and Homer S. Echevarria & Homero Samuel Valdivia Echevarria; however, no record could be found for either one of these men.

On November 26, 1953, 2-1-265 advised that he believed that Thomas Mosley and Homer Echevarria, described below, were going to attend a meeting in order to negotiate for the sale of automatic weapons to Echevarria's group.

On the evening of November 26, 1963, 2-1-266 met with Special Agents Joseph E. Moenen and Edward ?. Tucker, U. S. Secret Service, and Special Agents Walt Regers and Rob Eaker, FBI, Chicago. 2-1-266 stated that Meeley allegedly had approached Echevarria scare time in September 1963 on the poscibility of Echevarria's being able to use same machine gens which Mosley could supply, in order that Fehevarria's group of Oubers could invade Guba. 2-1-266 advised that the day before President Kennedy was assessinged Mosley again had approached Rohovarria about the purchase of these machine guns, at which time Rohovarria allegedly stated, "We now have planty of money -- our new backers are Jaus -- as soon as 'wa' (or 'they') take care of Kennedy...." 2-1-266 also alleged that Echevarria advised Mosley that before any deels could be consumpted, Echevarria's superiors would have to approve Mosley and satisfy themselves that he was not a CIA agent.

2-1-256 advised that Mosley and Echevarria wave going to have a meeting -on the evening of November 25, 1953, for the purpose of introducing Mosley to Echevarria's superiors. However, it use subsequently learned that Mosley attempted to telephone Echevarria and it was determined that Echevarria was working and Mosley could not get in bouch with him.

After 2-1-255 had departed, in a discussion between Special Agent Notain, Secret Service, and FBI Agents Regers and Taker, it was concluded by Special Agent Faker that inasmuch as this investigation reflected a threat to President Johnson, who has annotheed his intention of continuing the late President Kennedy's policies, the Secret Service should have primary jurisdiction in this case but that we should keep the FBI informed of our investigation.

Subsequently, on this same evening, 2-1-266 advised that Themas Mosley had talephoned Rohevarria, and that Rohevarria had directed Nosley to most him at Rohevarria's house at 12:00 o'clock mean on November 28, 1963, at which time Mosley and Rohevarria were going to most Februarria's superiors, who would confer with Mosley.

On November 27, 1963, Special Agents Nooman and Fucker proceeded to the Imalgration and Naturalization Service, Main Post Office Fullding, Chicago, Illinois, to check the files of that beyondy in the name of Nomer S.Echeverria. It was determined that Nover Second Networks and entered the United States on July 6, 1900 at Micri, Florida, via Covern Airlines flight No. 803. This file also reflected that Echevarria's align Mander is A 12 236 h00.

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The file showed that upon entry to the United States, Echevarria had indicated that he was going to work for the C. J. Simpson Drilling Company at Dallas, Texas, and that he intended to live at 10353 Denton Drive, in Dallas.

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The file also reflected that Echeverrie had been living with one Alejandro Biersey, No. 159 Zoga Del Mesio, Las Villes, Cube, and that Echeverria's wife's maiden nome is Teresita Del Sino Jesus, Castellanos Guiterreze decording to the file, tenevarue has one son nemed Evelio Carlos Echevarria's and Echeverria's parents are listed as father, Evelio; and Mother, Orelia Valdivia... The file also reflected that Echevarria had belonged to the Union of Socio de Vocal y Muscrario.

The file should that Echevarrit fied moved from Miami to Ballas, Texas; from Ballas to 428 Wildwood Drive, "Apertacit 3. Jackson, Michigan; and then to 140 East Chickey Bond, Jonasville, Michigan (unile in Jonasville he allegedly Worked for the J. E. Wegstoff Corpany). He then lived at 1204-A Quintard Avenue, Anniston, Alebana. On July 23, 1951 Am allegedly Yes living at 1908 Most Superior Street, Chicago, Milanis; he then lived at 2555 North Millandes Avenue, Chicago, Thinnis. A confidential source advised that Echevarria now resides at 2301 North Albany Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

Investigation has established that Fohevorria's telephone, No. 278-2922, V was installed on September 20, 1963. No toll calls have been made from that phone.

On November 27, 1953, Special Agents Nooman and Tucker proceeded to the Chicago office of the FMI and conferred with FMI Agent Malt Rogers. A copy of the photograph of Echevarria, appearing in the files of the Intergration and Naturalization Service, was given to Agent Regars. During this interview Agent Rogers advised that he knew Evolio Echevarria prior to this date, and that that very Lorning he had been introduced to Fourie Echevarria. This mosting took place at a grocery store located at 2001 West North Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. Agent Regars advised that this grocery store was could by Cubans and was a favorite mosting place for these people. He stated that the mosting with Homer Echevarria was by chance, and that he was introduced as a agent of the Federal Fureau of Investigation.

Agent Robers believed that since he had met Homer Echevarria that very morning, he, Rogers, should probably stay in the background of this investigation.

Special /gent Rogers stated that from the information provided by the interview with 2-1-265 on the provides night, it was his belief that the organization to which Echevatria belonged was the 2010 of November-group; w and that this group was primarily interacted, at least in the Chicago area, in obtaining money and disseminating providenda of an anti-Castro nature. From his conversation it appeared that the Eureau had reliable information

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regarding the activities of this group. It was also felt by Special Agent Rogers that it was highly doubtful that this 30th of November group would be involved in illegal activities.

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Special Agents Noonan and Tucker pointed out to Special Agent Rogers that, since they had not been briefed on the activities of Ouben groups in the Chicago area, it would be left to his agency to determine if and when this investigation involved matters of denestic security, and that the U.S. Secret Service should be notified if this developed. In the absence of such notification the investigation would continue, if warranted.

On the same date, a confidential source advised that Teresita Echevarria was employed at the Vells Gardner Company, 2701 North Mildare Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

On November 28, 1963, Special Agent Tucker telephoned the FBI and advised that 2-1-256 was going to meet agents of this Service et approximately 3:30 p.m. to advise of any meetings between Tom Hosley and Homer Echavarria. Although Special Agent Rogers, FBI, could not be contacted at this time Special Agent Tucker was subsequently advised that this SBI would not be at this meeting with 2-1-266 and that they would rely on this Service and its findings.

On November 28, 1963, at approximately 11:55 a.m., Special Agent Noonan observed suspect Thomas Hosley arrive in his personal automobile at the residence of Homer Echevarria. As previously agreed, the surveillance was discontinued at this point. This action was decided upon because the area in which Echevarria resides is heavily populated, and it is highly probable that if a vehicular surveillance had been attempted the investigation might have been jeopardized.

Subsequently on November 28, 1963, Special Agents Meanen and Tucker rat with 2-1-265, at which time he provided the following account of the meeting between Echevarria and Thomas Mosley.

22-1-265 stated that Mosley had gone to Echevarria's residence, at which time Mosley and Echevarria discussed the policies of President Johnson. Echevarria allegedly described President Johnson as a common person who would get things done. Echevarria stated that President Kennedy was an intellectual, a rich man's son who "did not give a damn about people," while President Johnson would work with people. In any case, Echevarria stated that President Johnson would not stand in their way.

Echevarria made a telephone call which he participant complete. He allogedly then asked his wife for the correct running. "Then this was provided, Echevarria supposedly said, ."Oh, I must have been walking the beauty shop." After completing the second call, Echevarria and Mosley departed in Mosley's care

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Near the intersection of Hilvaukee Avenue and Logan Seuere, Chicago, Illinois, Echevarria told Mosley to pull over and park. After parking, an unnamed Guban, described below, entered the car. This party dominated the conversation from this point.

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South Marine

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This unknown Cuben first asked Mosley what he could provide, to which Mosley stated that he had on hand 100 Stan machine guns. Model 2, 9 mm. parabellum. These he would sell for \$100 apiece. He stated he had the P-38 machine pistols, 9 mm., which would sell for \$175 apiece, and seven 55 caliber enti-tank rifles. The cost of these also was \$175 apiece, and \$1 per round . of amounition.

The Cuban then asked Mosley if he could obtain material for sabetage, and Mosley told him to write down what he wanted and he would attant to obtain it. This individual made the following list of items in which he was interested:

2.1-266 obtained this list from Hosley's person and it was turned over to this Service, to be processed for whatever fingerprints might be contained thereon.

The unknown Cuban then told Mosley that he was going to ask him two questions, the answers to which would determine whether or not his organization would do tusiness with him. The first question was, "How do you feel about the assassination of Fresident Kennedy?" to which Mosley shrugged his shoulders and said, "Hi's no skin off my nose either way." The second question was, "Mino do you know from Caba and how can we check up on you?" to which Mosley replied that he knew Michael Fonce (phonotic) and that he, Mosley, had been arrested by the Chicago Police Department for this very same activity in which he was now engaged, and that to verify this all that had to be done was to check the records of the Chicago Folice Department. The unknown Cuban stated that he knew Michael Pance and why, the organization to which he belongs would check the records of the Chicago Folice Department.

2-1-265 stated that Michael Ponce had four six bases a regular Haval of officer in the Cuban Navy under the Dictator fattable and that he knew that Tom Mosley had been involved in gun-running activities with Ponce in the early 1950's.

2-1-265 stated that the meeting produced the following results. Mosley informed Echevarria and the unknown Guben that he was a member of a group of six persons, and that they had one "benker." Two of the members of the group owned a small screw machine factory. (It chould be noted at this point that automatic Meapons can readily be obtained as convenirs if the borrels have been plugged, and that it is the practice of gun-runners to obtain these plugged Meapons, take them to an unscrupping is mainly lead.;

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Hooley informed the two Oubers that since the assassination of President Kennedy a great deal of "heat" has been created, and that his party was willing to provide the guas to the Gabars for a nominal down wayment if the taban group could provide them with a responsible party in the Chicago ford with would vouch that the respinder of the noney would be paid to them there the deal had been consummated. Mosley informed the Cubers that his group was saving six guns, and should they be double-crossed they intended to take retribution.

The unnexed Owhen stated that this deal sounded receivable to Lin, and that if Mosley checked out at the police department their organization would get in touch with him through an altornay. This attorney would provide Mosley with a list of equipment which they desired, and all dealings from this point on, between Mosley and the organization, would be handled through the attorney. The unnamed Cuban also stated that the list of equipment would be written in a code which would be taught to Mosley by Homer Echevarria.

Kosley was asked how he could be contacted. He stated that in the past it had been his practice to enter an ad in the personal colume of a local newspaper, using the orden name, "Flack Foot." It was agreed that should this group at any time in the future when to contact Hosley they would run an ad in the personal column of the Chicago Tribune, which would read, "Black Foot call (a telephone number would be entered) after (a time would be entered)." The unnamed Cutan stated that the telephone number would be a pay phone, which would be covered by either him or a member of his organization for one-half hour before and one-half hour after the time stated in the ad. It would be Koshey's responsibility to contact them within this time. Hosley agreed to this.

Also discussed at the time was the subject of the backers. It is the feeling of 2-1-266 that at least some of the backers of this group are hoodlum elements, and that the backers are not restricted to Chicago.

2-1-266 stated that the unnamed Cuban allegedly is a member of the Student Federation of Revolutionaries.

On November 29, 1963, Special Agant Hoons - 442 Conversed by Special Agent Walt Rogers, FBI, and Agent Rogers was briefed on why information received from 2-1-266 on the previous day. Agent Rogers shaked that the Student rederation of Revolutionaries may very possibly be the Student Revolutionary Directorate; and that the unnexed Cuban fit the description of one Francisco Directories a representative of this group whom he not at the grocery store Docated at 2351 Mest North Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, shortly after his introduction to Nomer Echevarrie on Rovember 27, 1963.

It was learned from igent Rogers that Lee Hervey kreak has a transfed to join the Student Revolutionary Directorate in New Schweis; that while Oswald was under consideration by this group, he was concreded by members of the group distributing literature for the Fair Play For Ouba Committee; avithat, in addition to this, Oswald had taken part in a debate of the Cubic problem against members of the Student Revolutionary Directorate.

Agent Rogers stated, in regard to an attorney who might be jorking with the Student Revolutionary Directorate, that one Paulino Sierra, an attorney in the Chicago area who became interested in the Luti-Castro movement, could possibly be the contact for Tom Mosley. Spent Rovers stated that Sierra has claimed to have a great deal of financial backing and has attempted to organize the great number of anti-Castro movements in Wis country. There are allegations that the <u>financial backing</u> of <u>Sierra it hoodlum schery</u>, but that Sierra has denied this and states that his backary are American businessmen.

Through a confidential source the name of anyons making inquiries at the Chicago Police Department regarding Themas Mosley will immediately be made available to this Service. It should be noted that this source is extremely reliable and fully aware of the importance of secrecy in this investigation.

THEMAS MOSLEY @ Tom - white; male; American; 40 years; 6 feet; 180 pounds; black hair; mustache; usually wears a bow tie; a bus driver for the Ghicago Transit Authority; resides at 1400 West Summerdale Avenue, Chicago, Ellinois; drives a 1960 black Thunderbird, 1963 Illinois license 212 958.

EGNOWN CUBAN - white; male; about 30 to 32 years of each approximately 517"; -170 points; black hair; dark, clear complexion; have, inwide.

UNDEVELOPED LEADS

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It is anticipated that an undercover special agent will be introduced by informant 2-1-266 to Tom Nosley, and that this agent will be present at whatever meetings may take place in the future between Nozley and the Gaban group.

Copies of this report are being sent to the Mini office for a check of Insignation files, as that was Honer Echevarria's port of entry.

Additional copies are being sent to Dallos, Detroit, Grand Rapids, and Birmingham with the request that investigation be made at Echevarria's places of rer dence and employment, as stated above, in the districts of said officent, and that background information on the suspect be obtained.

Copies of this report are also being forwarded to the Springfield office with the request that they make an investigation at the Eureau of Motor (Vehicles regarding Echevarria's car. If at all possible, the entire history of this car should be obtained.

Investigation is continued in Chicago for further contacts with 2-1-766 relative to additional meetings between the several suspects.

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
