Dear Congressman:

Your letter to Attorney General Levi asking whether the Department has designated anyone to receive material or to review the evidence about the assassination of the late President John F. Kennedy has been referred to me.

No one in the Department has been specifically designated for this activity. Of course, anyone having materials or evidence about this assassination can present it to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

As you probably know, it has been publicly reported that Federal Bureau of Investigation Director Clarence Kelley stated that the Bureau had reviewed all the evidence which is being currently discussed and has no intention of reopening the investigation. The Warren Commission findings were confirmed.

I hope that this information will be of assistance to you.
