NOTE: By letter dated 5/13/75, to the Director, Congressman Morris K. Udall questions the handling of new allegations regarding the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. He makes reference to a letter of 4/21/75, to him from Acting Assistant Attorney General John C. Keeney, which he enclosed. He states that Mr. Keeney invites anyone having materials on the assassination to present it to the FBI, but he points out that Mr. Keeney in his letter makes mention that the FBI has no intention of reopening the investigation. The Congressman ends his letter by saying he does not want to make a hassle, but needs clarification as to whether or not the FBI does or would examine any new study. This letter to the Congressman advises him that the FBI continually reviews new information in this case and conducts follow-up inquiries when warranted, but there have been no developments which would necessitate the reopening of a full investigation. Copy of the Congressman's letter and the Director's reply are being furnished to the Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, for his information.
