Paul, Because of the length and absnece of annotation of accompanying records I'm not copying them but the last page of your 3/24/75 memo and your memo on the federal intelligence agencies and the JFK assassination through footnote 63 are in 62-109060 Section 179 and apparently part of Serial 7224. I so it is with stuff sent to the FBI by one Bonahue in Scoop Jackson's office. Part of the envelope to Jackson is outside the copied material so the name is missing. Elsewhere it appears to be J.C. Louis or Levis, with a 94114 SF mip. It is alsong with what to me is Popkinky stuff. If by any chance I see any other reference I'll copy it. But here there is not even a mark on a page. Only what you have. However, it appears to be more remote than a second or third generation copy in each case, so remote as to suggest a black carbon copy This volume also holds the beginning of the 1975 Hosty flap. There is an entire volume of bulkys on that, my helper Rae tells me. ... I've been busy on catching up on appeals and such with the two in-court days of the past week behind and am a little behind volumes she's brought up for me to examine. Examining them has been fruitful for prospective litigation. Or for getting things done outside litigation. ... The possibility of working out problems with the NO and Dallas records appears to be pretty good. Better than litigating everything, too. ...I think I'll have an acceptable compromise on the "previously processed" deal which will consist of a cross reference. Working on it a long time, administratively, and I think somewhat effectively by illustrations. ... By the way, do you recall the Hosty story on when he got the LHO file from NO? I seem to recall he said about the very day of the assassination ... His last sounding off was after his retirement.
