ASSASSINATION OF JOHN FITZGERALD  
KENNEDY, DALLAS, TEXAS, 11/22/63

OO, DALLAS

At approximately 4:30 p.m., on 9/3/75, SA [redacted] was standing at the corner of Harwood and Commerce Streets, Dallas, en route to the Dallas Office from the Dallas Police Department, while standing at the corner, LT. JACK REVILL, TACT Squad, Dallas PD, walked up and engaged SA [redacted] in conversation. LT. REVILL expressed sympathy for Special Agent JIM HESTY and his present publicity in the press concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY. In the conversation, REVILL made reference to the fact he has been contacted by several newsmen and REVILL stated he has refused to cooperate in furnishing them any information regarding the assassination. REVILL also made reference to the fact he was recently contacted by former Chief of Police JESS CURRY, Dallas PD, at which time Former Chief CURRY told REVILL he (CURRY) still has the impression that two men were involved in the shooting of President KENNEDY. REVILL said he asked CURRY on what basis he formed this opinion, and CURRY made reference to a statement made by one of the motorcycle officers at the scene of the assassination who said he had ridden through a spray of blood at the time the shots were fired.

LT. REVILL advised SA [redacted] that a few minutes before meeting SA [redacted] on the corner, he had interrupted Dallas Police Officer JIM CHANNY about the shots on the day of the assassination. REVILL stated CHANNY was one of the motorcycle officers assigned to the motorcade on the day of the assassination. In referring to the assassination, REVILL said he asked CHANNY what information he had furnished to investigating officers following the assassination. CHANNY told REVILL that he had never been interviewed by anyone following the assassination to obtain his observations as a witness.

Dallas indices and references from Dallas indices regarding the assassination fail to indicate that CHANEY was interviewed by Agents of this Bureau following the assassination.

A check of the index to the "Hearings Before the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy," indicates JAMES A. CHANEY, motorcycle officer, Dallas PD, is referred to in Volume II, pages 43-45, Volume III, page 266, Volume IV, page 161, Volume VI, page 294, and page 266, Volume XII, page 28. A check of these references fails to indicate CHANEY testified before the President's Commission. The reference in Volume III, page 266, reflects that in the testimony of motorcycle officer MERRICK L. MAKER, he testified before the Commission that Officer JIM CHANEY at the time the shots were fired was "on the right rear of the car or to the side."
