On October 16, 1975, captioned individual appeared at the Seattle Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and furnished the following information in the Polish language through interpreter [REDACTED]

She is a Canadian citizen, born July 27, 1910. She was born in Poland and immigrated to Canada in 1959. She obtained a job as a housekeeper in Winnipeg, Manitoba, and in 1960 she obtained a job as a housekeeper at the residence of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

Subject worked at the [REDACTED] residence until 1963. She quit, she said, because she felt that the [REDACTED] were giving her sleeping pills and on one occasion, according to subject, she slept for four days without awakening. She then went to work at various restaurants in Montreal. The following summer, 1964, she returned to Winnipeg and worked for the Canadian Pacific Railroad as a kitchen helper, which job she held until 1970. She has been a pensioner since 1973 and currently resides at [REDACTED] Regina, Saskatchewan.

Subject advised that she feels the [REDACTED] were giving her sleeping pills because the day before President KENNEDY was assassinated she overheard a radio conversation through a closed door which Mr. [REDACTED] was having with unknown persons in Cuba. During the conversation she said [REDACTED] made arrangements to have OSWALD and a Mr. PENTELUK a Ukrainian, assassinate President KENNEDY. According to subject the

assassination was going to be carried out at the request of "the Russians." Subject did not actually know PENTELUK or meet him until 1970, at which time PENTELUK was living in the same apartment complex as subject.

Subject advised that she had decided to come to the United States to furnish the above information since the police department at Regina had been thoroughly infiltrated by Ukrainian Jews, who could not be trusted to take any action on the information she furnished.

It is noted that the acting interpreter in this matter indicated that subject was furnishing information in a desultory manner and appeared to him to be "disturbed". Subject indicated she would be returning to her home in Regina.
