On 11/24/75, Sheriff

Texas, advised he had recently arrested
on local burglary charges. He stated that
white questioning Mrs.

concerning several
burglaries, she volunteered certain information about
property she stole during a burglary which occurred
somewhere in Beaumont, Texas in early 1975. Sheriff

learned from Mrs.

that she had stolen
three guns, along with other miscellaneous property.
Upon sorting out the property, she found two hand
drawn maps, one of the Louisiana Tech Campus and
another concerning KENNEDY's route in Dallas. While
Sheriff

provided the Louisiana map for review,
he indicated that Mrs.

had been unable to
find the Dallas map after talking about it.

Sheriff provided the Louisiana Tech Campus map for review and it was found to contain a reference to Interstate Highway 20, as well as other highways apparently in Central Louisiana.

Sheriff stated that the three weapons stolen by Mrs. were a 30-06 Remington rifle, a 32-20 Winchester rifle and a Beauing Sweet 16 shot-gun. He indicated that Mrs. had told him that the rifling had been removed from the barrels of the rifles. Sheriff noted that at last report the rifles were being held at the National Pawn Shop at 470 Pearl Street in Beaumont, Texas. He-further noted that Mrs. has been released on bond and that her

attorney should be ableto provide information concerning her whereabouts.

In a telephone conversation with the Dallas Office on 11/24/75, SA was advised of pertinent details of this matter and indicated that the aforementioned type weapons were not being sought regarding captioned matter.

on 11/24/75,

at-Law, P.O. Boy 67 Yountze, Texas, advised that he represented and that she was presently residing at in Dayton, Texas, telephone Mr. stated that based on his handling of her legal matters, he felt that she should be classified as a "nut". He contacted her telephonically, arranged an interview, and told her to cooperate with the FBI investigation.

on 11/24/75, was interviewed at her residence and was unable to add any significant information to the account of the burglary given by the Sheriff above. She reiterated however, that she no longer had the "Dallas-KENNEDY route" map and she felt she had detroyed it shortly after the burglary thinking it was of no significance. Searching her memory, she recalled it was a precisely executed work of art, made with drafting tools which did not specify Dallas streets, but only indicated a couple of key points from the KENNEDY investigation.
