ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JCHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, NOVEPPER 22, 1963 DALLAS, TEXAS

Cn Movember 18, 1976, Roswell, New Mexico, advised that during 1957 he was assigned to-Division Headquarters, Fublication Department, at Fort Hood, Texas. stated that he was befriended by (First Name Unknown) (T.U) JOHNSON due to their mutual interest in playing pool. related that during the summer of 1957 JOHNSON had returned from leave in Dallas, Texas, and indicated that his father had attended a meeting during which time the future of Senator LYNDON JOHNSON was discussed. Stated that "OHNSON told him he was told by his father that LYNDON JOHNSON would possibly run for the Presidency; however, Senator JOHN F. KENNEDY from Massachusetts was also attempting to run and there was a strong possibility that JOHNSON would be beaten by KENNEDY. further stated that JOHNSON related to him that his dad told him if KENNEDY were to be elected President, that he would be killed. Continued stating that it was his understanding through [JOHNSON] that the perpetrators of the assassination would be gangster types. Stated that through the conversation JAMES HOFFA's name was mentioned; however, [IOHNSO!] appeared to make a sincere effort to discount the fact that POFFA would have any connection with the possible ated that from + death of KENNEDY.

stated that from the impression he got from JOHNSON, all the information he had was from JOHNSON's father and none was first-hand knowledge.
