Kennedy The Sunday Star and The Washington Post, April 3, 1977, editions both contained articles concerning the identification of a letter allegedly written by Lee Harvey Oswald to a 'Mr. Hunt" by 'three handwriting experts' commissioned by the Dallas Morning News and certified with the International Graphoanalysis Society (IGAS). The purpose of this memorandum is to set forth background information on IGAS and the news articles. DETAILS: In news articles appearing in the Washington Post and Sunday Star, on April 3, 1977, the Dallas Morning News reported that three handwriting examiners commissioned by that paper identified a letter written to a "Mr. Hunt" as being the authentic handwriting of Lee Harvey Oswald. These articles stated that the handwriting experts were certified by the IGAS. Bufiles contained no record concerning the three handwriting experts involved. handwriting to determine character or personality. In conjunction with this course of instruction, IGAS also sells an "advanced course" dealing with handwriting identification in which its members become "certified" as "Master Graphoanalysts". Members of this organization who are employed in handwriting identification problems are not highly regarded in the questioned document field since the basis of their work, graphology or graphoanalysis, is not regarded as having scientific validity, certitude or accuracy.

Efforts to obtain the original document in question have been negative to date although FBI Dallas was able to obtain a copy which is too indistinct for adequate examination with Oswald's handwriting exemplars by our own Laboratory personnel. A photocopy of this letter is attached together with the Washington Post and Sunday Star articles. Dallas is attempting to re-interview William Penn Jones regarding his copy of this letter. There is no record in Bureau files of this letter ever being received by the Director or anyone else in the FBI.
