Enclosed herewith for the Scientific and Technical Services Division (STSD) are the following:

1. One roll of developed 35 mm Kodak Panatomic-X film. (ASA 32; camera-attache photocopy unit, Minolta SR-1; Frame Number 6 at 1/15 of a second at f.11; Frame Number 7 at 1/15 of a second at f.8; Frame Number 10 at 1/15 of a second at f.11; and Frame Number 11 at 1/15 of a second at f.8).

2. One developed Royal Pan Sheet film negative. (Double exposure) (ASA 400; Polaroid MP-3 land camera; 1/2 of a second at f.11; light-4 150 watt bulbs, low setting.)

3. Two black and white photographs of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, to "Dear Mr. Hunt" printed from enclosed item number 1.

4. Two black and white photographs each of the front and back of an envelope addressed to Sr. Penn Jones, Jr., Editor, P. O. Box 70, Midlothian, Texas, 76065, printed from enclosed item number 1.

5. Two black and white photographs of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, to "Dear Mr. Hunt" (Double exposed) printed from enclosed item number 2.

6. One newspaper article appearing in the "Dallas Morning News", Dallas, Texas, 4/2/77, bearing the headline, "Handwriting Experts Agree Oswald wrote 1963 letter to a 'Mr. Hunt.'"

7. One Xerox copy of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, to a "Dear Mr. Hunt" made from Mr. WILLIAM PENN JONES' photographic copy.

On 3/28/77, WILLIAM PENN JONES, JR., 119 North Fifth Street, Midlothian, Texas, voluntarily came to the Dallas, Texas FBI Office and made available the following documents to be copied:

1. A letter dated Agosto 18 de 1975, addressed to Sr Penn Jones., Editor, Midlothian Mirror, Midlothian, Texas, USA. The letter is typed in Spanish.

2. A photographic copy of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, to "Dear Mr. Hunt", signed LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

3. A letter dated Sept. 4, 1975, addressed to Sr. P. S., Insurgentes Sur No. 309, Mexico, D-F., Mexico, from PENN JONES, JR.

The above described documents were photographed by Dallas photographic clerk [REDACTED] under the supervision of SA [REDACTED]

A Xerox copy was also made of the above described documents.

Mr. JONES did not wish to release custody of his copy of the Nov. 8, 1963 letter or the transmittal letter typed in Spanish, which accompanied same. Mr. JONES advised he did not bring the envelope which had contained these two letters, but would make a copy of this envelope available at a future date.

On 3/29/77, Dallas photographic clerk [REDACTED] discovered that the photograph he made of the photographic copy of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, to "Dear Mr. Hunt", signed "LEE HARVEY OSWALD" was double exposed.

On 3/29/77, the photographic copy of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, in the possession of Mr. JONES at Midlothian, Texas, was rephotographed (see enclosure number 1, frames 6,7, 10 and 11) using portable photographic equipment and 35 mm Kodak Panatomic-X film. Also photographed on that roll of film were the following:

1. The front and back of an envelope addressed to Sr. Penn Jones, Jr., Editor, Midlothian Mirror, P. O. Box 70, Midlothian, Texas, 76065. (Frames 2,3,4 and 5).
2. Typed letter written in Spanish, dated Agosto 18 de 1975, addressed to Sr. Penn Jones, Jr., Editor, Midlothian Mirror, Midlothian, Texas, USA. (Frames 8 and 9).

The STSD is requested to compare the photographs of a letter dated Nov. 8, 1963, to "Dear Mr. Hunt", signed "LEE HARVEY OSWALD" as set forth in enclosures number 1, 2, 3, 4 and 7, with all known handwriting available at the Bureau of LEE HARVEY OSWALD in an effort to determine whether or not LEE HARVEY OSWALD prepared same. It should be noted that the enclosed newspaper article reflected that the "Dallas Morning News" has commissioned handwriting experts to examine the Nov. 8, 1963, letter and who have concluded that the letter is "the authentic writing of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and was written by him."

The STSD is also requested to analyze enclosure number four and frames number 2,3,4 and 5 of enclosed item number 1 in an effort to determine if this envelope was postmarked. Visual observation of the original of this envelope in possession of Mr. JONES appears to indicate that the envelope was not postmarked.
