NOTE: A review of Jack Ruby's testimony before the Warren Commission on 6/7/64, indicates that Ruby testified that he was at the "Dallas Morning News" building at the time of Kennedy's assassination on 11/22/63. Ruby advised he went to the News building at approximately 11:00 a.m. on the morning of 11/22/63, to arrange for advertising space for his night club. Ruby's testimony was corroborated in part by the testimony of John William Newnam an Advertising Department employee of the "Dallas Morning News." Newnam testified before the Warren Commission on 6/26/64. No further attempts being made by our Dallas Division to interview at this time.
