MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION RE [REDACTED]

Enclosed are the original and four copies of an LHM on GERALD L. SMITH dated 4/7/77.

Alexandria files disclosed [REDACTED] and his daughter, [REDACTED] have been chronic letter writers and telephone complainants for several years to various congressmen, Federal agencies, U. S. Postal Service, and various police departments in the Washington Metropolitan Area. He claims to have been harassed and threatened by the [REDACTED] since his medical retirement from that organization in 1974. He has been unable to substantiate with specific facts any incidents of alleged harassment.

By Alexandria airtel dated 2/3/76, captioned [REDACTED] - VICTIM; POSSIBLE EXTORTION" the Bureau was furnished the results of an interview with him on a possible extortion case on which the U. S. Attorney declined prosecution. For several weeks thereafter, both [REDACTED] and his daughter [REDACTED] were almost daily complainants to the Alexandria Division on non-specific allegations on various individuals and organizations, which they claimed threatened [REDACTED] life.

In view of the foregoing, [REDACTED] is not being reinterviewed.
