(Tip) O'Heill, Jr., advised he "believes" some witnesses of the Warren Commission gave incomplete testimony when they testified about the assassination of President Kennedy. O'Heill was quoted as saying I don't believe they gave a full and honest description, I think they were reporting the will of the FBI." O'Heill did not elaborate on his comment. Review of files relating to the assassination and discussion with members of the Congressional Inquiry Unit, FBIEO, who are familiar with the assassination investigation fails to reflect any information concerning the person or persons O'Heill refers to.
