ReWFO telephone call to the Bureau, 3/4/77.

On 3/2/77, [redacted] Author and Historian, Bayside, New York, telephonically contacted WFO and stated that in the process of researching material for his book "[redacted]" he went over the BYRD papers of Senator HARRY BYRD of Virginia. In those letters are several letters from H. L. HUNT. One of the letters from HUNT to Senator BYRD relates to the disposal of KENNEDY "in 64." [redacted] stated this letter and others may have some connection with the assassination.

[redacted] advised the letters of Senator BYRD are now at the University of Virginia at Charlottesville. The library number of the letter in question is Box 270. The letter is quoted in [redacted] book "[redacted]" on page 217.
