Dear Director Kelly:

According to recent news reports the Federal Bureau of Investigation
will be making public its files on investigations concerning the assassination
of President John F. Kennedy.

In a previous letter to you of April 25, 1977, I indicated that a Dutch journalist, Willem Oltmans, had made serious charges against my father, the late H.L. Hunt, based upon an alleged relationship which my father was supposed to have had with one George de Mohrenschildt. Mr. Oltmans then quoted de Mohrenschildt as saying my father had in some way been connected with the President's death. The adverse publicity resulting from that unsubstantiated charge reflected very negatively upon my father's memory.

Not as widely reported, but nevertheless of major significance, was a subsequent report by <u>Dallas Morning News</u> reporter, John Geddie dated August 31, 1977 in <u>The Dallas Morning News</u>, following a stormy press conference which Mr. Oltmans had had with American journalists in Washington on August 30.

As the enclosed newspaper report indicates, along with a prepared statement released from our offices, Mr. Oltmans has now changed his story and has admitted that his initial charge was incorrect and inaccurate and that H.L. Hunt was in no way involved. Thus, Mr. Oltmans has withdrawn his prior allegations.

I have enclosed material which was reported in the press and may be of interest to those individuals who will be reviewing the Kennedy data from the FBI files. I would like to request that this letter and the accompanying exhibits, along with my prior correspondence with your office be made public along with the other data which you will be releasing in the weeks ahead.
