
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

ASAC Sylvester, New Orleans, called at 3:10 PM today to advise that additional investigation had failed to definitely determine Oswald's whereabouts on 9-18. A check of all airlines from New Orleans to Mexico and Latin America was negative, but Sylvester has determined that connecting flights could be made at Miami and Houston and on the bare possibility something might be uncovered at these locations had telephonically asked the offices to check airline manifests for the 17th and 18th.

Sylvester is also checking with regard to possible bus travel, but Oswald is definitely known to have been in New Orleans the 17th and bus travel to Mexico City is 48 hours. U

Sylvester raised the question of having airline insurance companies checked to see if there might be any record of an insurance policy for 9-17 and 18 and he advised that the insurance companies are located in New York and Washington, D.C. I told him to telephonically have these offices check the insurance companies today as we want to make every effort

to place Oswald on 9-18. He said this would be done.

Oswald's wife being conducted today we should make an effort to determine from her whether Oswald was in New Orleans 9-18, whether she knew of any trips to Mexico by him other than the one from 9-26 to 10-3, whether she had any information about his activities in Mexico, and whether he ever had any large sum of money or there was any indication he had received money in Mexico. I said that any information with regard to his activities in Mexico were important and especially we were anxious to determine whether he was or was not in Mexico on 9-18. Malley said Agents were already en route in an attempt to interview Mrs. Oswald and it was questionable whether she would be cooperative and that they would try to obtain the desired information from her.

President John F. Kennedy was shot and killed by an unknown assailant at approximately 12:30 p.m., November 22, 1963, in Dallas, Texas. Investigation was immediately instituted in an effort to identify and apprehend the person responsible for this assassination.

that a suspicious person had entered the Texas Theater which is located about six tenths of a mile from the four hundred block of East 10th Street in Dallas where J. D. Tippitt, a Dallas Police Department patrolman had been shot and killed about 1:13 p.m. Officers of the Dallas Police Department and FBI Agents converged on the theater and took into custody Lee Harvey Oswald who resisted arrest and attempted to fire a .38 caliber revolver which was taken from his person.

State complaints were filed on November 22, 1963, charging Oswald with the murder of President Kennedy and Patrolman Tippitt.

Investigation has established that Oswald was employed: at the Texas School Book Depository which has been identified as the building from which the fatal shots were fired at the President. A fellow employee stated he took Oswald to work on the morning of Nevember 1963, at which time Oswald was carrying a package of sufficient length to contain a disassembled rifle and which Oswald said consisted of curtain rods." Oswald was observed on the fifth floor of the building in which he was employed at approximately 11:58 a.m., November 22, 1963. Oswald was again observed inside the building shortly after the shooting but could not be igued thereafter. Another fellow employee stated shots were fired "right over hig back; while this employee was watching the car occupied by President Kennedy passing in front of the building. a white man from a window on the sixth floor of the building in which Oswald was employed. This witness later selected Oswald in a line-up as the person who resembled the individual he observed fire the rifle from the window. The witness could not make a positive identification. Mrs. Earlene Roberts, 1026 North Beckley Street in Dallas, stated Oswald, using the name of O. H. Lee, had lived at her residence since October 14, 1963, and at about 1:00 p.m., November 22, 1963, came to her residence, picked up a jacket and left hurriedly.

A 6.5 caliber Italian carbine rifle with a four-power scope was found on the sixth floor of the building in which Oswald was employed and from which the shots at the President were fired. Investigation by our Chicago Office has revealed that a weapon of this description and identical serial number was sold to one A. Hidell, Post Office Box 2915, Dallas, Texas, on March 28, 1963, for \$21.45. This Post Office Box at that time was rented by Mrs. Lee H. Oswald, believed to be the mother of suspect. Oswald, at the time of his arrest, had in his possession a Selective Service card in the name of Alex Hidell. The recovered rifle as well as the 38 caliber revolver taken from Oswald, were immediately brought to the FBI Laboratory for examination.

It was determined that a bullet found on one of the stretchers at the hospital following the admittance of President Kennedy had been fired from the rifle referred to above. Examination also identified two bullet fragments found in the Presidential car as having been fired from this same weapon. Other examinations in the FBI Laboratory are continuing.

A brown paper bag possibly used to carry the rifle was found near the window on the sixth floor of the building from which the shots were fired. A latent fingerprint developed on this bag by the FBI Identification Division was identified with the left index finger impression of Lee Harvey Oswald.

With respect to background information concerning Oswald, his birth date has been verified at New Orleans, Louisiana, as October 18, 1939. He attended high school at Fort Worth, Texas, and according to records of the Office of Naval Intelligence, enlisted in the United States Marine Corps at Dallas, Texas, on October 24, 1956, for a three-year term. He was released to inactive duty on September 11, 1959, but his military obligation continued until December 8, 1962.

According to information received from the State Department, he indicated to the American Embassy in Moscow on October 31, 1959, that he wished to renounce his American citizenship. He claimed at the time that he had been a radar operator in the Marine Corps and had told Soviet officials that if he were granted Soviet citizenship, he would make known information concerning the Marine Corps, which was in his possession. On this occasion he declared, 'I am a Marxist." The United Press on November 15, 1959, reported that Soviet authorities had refused to grant Oswald Soviet citizenship, but would permit him to live in Russia as a resident alien.

Office of Naval Intelligence reported that Oswald had been undesirably discharged from the Marine Corps Reserve on August 17, 1960.

On January 30, 1961, Oswald corresponded with the then Secretary of the Navy John B. Connally, with respect to his undesirable discharge requesting that appropriate action be taken to change his status and indicating he intended to return to this country. This was followed by a letter dated March 22, 1962, directed to Assistant Director of Personnel, Brigadier General Tompkins, United States Marine Corps, at which time he made a similar complaint.

Information has likewise been received from the Office of Senator John G. Tower (Republican - Texas) that during 1961 Oswald had requested that Senator Tower intercede in his behalf with Soviet authorities, so that they would allow him to return to the United States.

According to information received from the State Department on May 17, 1962, Oswald and his wife, a Soviet citizen, had been granted exit permits to leave Russia, and the State Department had given approval for their travel to the United States accompanied by an infant child.



Oswald was interviewed by Special Agents of this Bureau at Fort Worth, Texas, on June 26, 1962, at which time he was curt, sullen and arrogant. He declined to answer questions as to why he made the trip to Russia or his experiences while there. He indicated that he had been employed as a sheet metal worker in a television factory and admired the Russian form of Government. He claimed familiarity with the theories of Karl Marx, but denied being a member of the Communist Party or having renounced his United States citizenship. According to Oswald, the Soviets never attempted to obtain information from him nor did he make any deals with the Soviets in order to obtain permission to return to the United States. He disclaimed any affiliation with Soviet intelligence.

Upon reinterview on August 16, 1962, he acknowledged recently visiting the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C., but indicated his visit was solely to register his wife's current address as required by Soviet law. He again denied requesting revocation of his United States citizenship or allegiance to the Soviet Government.

According to information developed by this Bureau, Oswald was arrested on August 19, 1963, for disturbing the peace in New Orleans, Louisiana, as a result of distributing a pamphlet for an organization known as "Fair Play for Cuba." He pleaded guilty and elected to pay a few of \$10.

Oswald was interviewed on August 10, 1962, at which time he indicated he was unemployed and had been in New Orleans for approximately four months. While there he read literature distributed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee which he considered not to be communist dominated or controlled. He corresponded with the Committee at 799 Broadway, New York City, and paid a \$5.00 membership fee. He received a membership card in the New Orleans chapter dated June 6, 1963, signed A. J. Hidell.

The Fair Play for Cuba Committee is a pro-Castro organization founded during the Spring of 1960, whose function is to propagandize the Castro regime.

The Central Intelligence Agency advised that on October 1, 1963, an individual identified and contacted the Soviet Embassy in Mexico City A Letter D T D 7-1-67 Alexandra Classified.

Oswald during previous interviews with FBI Agents claimed to have married his wife, Marina Nikoleavna Oswald, nee Prusakova, at Minsk, Russia, on April 30, 1961. He likewise claimed an American passport, number D092526, issued at New Orleans, Louisiana, on June 25, 1963, for proposed travel of three months to one year as a tourist to England, France, Germany, Holland, USSR, Finland, Italy, and Poland. He indicated an intention to depart from New Orleans suring the latter part of 1963.

Additional information developed by this Bureau indicated one Lee Oswald during September, 1962, was a subscriber to "The Worker" an east coast communist newspaper.

Investigation in New Orleans disclosed that Oswald had been arrested as reported in the newspaper (it is noted that this is the only arrest disclosed in the Identification Division records) He claimed to be a member of the "Fair Play for Cuba Committee" (FPCC) and became involved in an argument with 3 Cuban emigrants while passing out circulars. He entered a plea of guilty and elected to pay the fine of \$10. The 3 other persons arrested with Oswald The arrest took place on 8-9-63. were discharged.

Oswald was interviewed on 8-10-63 by agents of the New Orleans office and advised that he was unemployed and had come to New Orleans about 4 months previously. There he began to read literature distributed by the FPCC which he considered was not a communist or communist-controlled group. He had sent a letter to the headquarters of this Committee at 799 Broadway, New York City with \$5 advising that he wished to join the Committee. During the latter part of May, 1963, he received through the mail a card made out in his name and signed by V. L. Lee which showed that he was a mamber of the rectional arguments. member of the national organization. A short time later he received a white card which made him a member of the New Orleans chapter. This card was dated 6-6-63 and was signed A. J. Hidell. He had not seen Hidell but talked to him on the phone and had attended meetings of the local committee but did not know any of the other persons who attended because they were known only by their first names.

Investigation also disclosed that on 8-21-63 Oswald appeared on a radio program called "Conversation Carte Blanche" on radio station WDSU in New Orleans with Edward Scannell Butler, staff director of the Information Council of the Americas which organization specializes in distribution of anticommunist educational During the program, Oswald material to Latin American countries. stated that the FPCC is not communist-controlled and that he, Oswald, is a Marxist.



Reaction by Cuban Exile Community to President

Kennedy's Death

- 1. This office in the aftermath of President Kennedy's death has initiated efforts to monitor the reactions of the local Cuban Exile Community, which have resulted in the following initial results:
- 2. It appears that the Miami Cuban Exile Community has begun accommodating itself to the realities of world politics and has initiated speculation on the future US policy re Cuba. Rumors are circulating among exile Cubans concerning the possible involvement of the Government of Cuba in President Kennedy's death. While the authors of these rumors have not been pinpointed, it is becoming evident that these rumors are directed primarily at provoking strong US action against Cuba. On the possibility that these rumors may have some shred of evidence to substantiate their objective, this office will continue to keep track of them and to conduct at least preliminary investigations of the more plausible ones to forward to your office.
- 3. In the above correction, one of our sources reported that he heard from one I r Causa that Eloy Gutierrez Menoyo had stated on 21 November 1963 that "something very big would happen soon that would advance the Cuban cause." Dora Causa's sister is married to Rafael Dominguez Caballero who is a member of the Segundo Frence del Escambray of which Eloy Gutierrez Menoyo is the chief.
- When taken out of context, the above remark becomes impossible to evaluate but it is typical of the rumors to which Cuban exiles tend at present to adhere to support whatever theory they may be expounding at the given moment.

Reference is made to Miami teletype dated December 8, 1963, setting forth information received from Central Intelligence 3 7 He 50, Agency (CIA)

This CIA information was obtained by the usc, Section 403, Agency from (2) usc, Section 403a Agency (CIA)

Agency from a diplomat, unidentified, alleging that the assassination of President Kennedy was the result of a plot executed jointly by Chinese Communists and Fidel Castro through intermediaries. Liaison was instructed to press CIA for additional specifics concerning the source and reliability of the information.

On December 9, 1963, the Liaison Agent informed CIA, that the Bureau would like to have the following:

Identity of the diplomat

(2) Access to him

Identity of the diplomat's original source

Any other details which might assist us in evaluating the allegation.

Subsequent to the above action, Tadvised the Liaison rand [5 Agent that the diplomat was connected with because of his position, his identity could not be furnished at this time. CIA does not know the diplomat's original source but is endeavoring to obtain such information. The diplomat has furnished CIA information in the past and much of his information "has not been too reliable."

Under further questioning by the Lizison Agent, explained that the diplomat was not in the U.S. and was in an area where he could not be contacted by the Bureau. In addition, CIA does Inot deal directly with him

1. Attached is an article which appeared on page 2 of the 29 November 1963 issue of the Washington Daily News. The article contains information which implies that two persons might have been involved in the assassination of President Kennedy. According to the article, two men had been involved in placing an advertisement in The Dallas Morning News. Set inside of a black border the fullpage ad appeared on the day of the President's assassination and levied a variety of charges against the President. The ad, according to the Washington Daily News, was signed by "Bernard WEISSMAN. the American Fact-Finding Committee, an Unaffiliated and Non-Partisan Group of Citizens Who Wish Truth, P. O. Box 1792, Dallas."


2. The Washington Daily News article also states that the full-page ad which presumably cost \$1250.00 was placed by WEISSMAN, that he paid cash for the ad, and that WEISSMAN resided in Dallas at a small apartment house. The article indicates he claimed to have been a salesman from New York, that he roomed with one William BURLEY, that \$125.00 in cash was paid for a month's rent and that WEISSMAN moved out on about 26 November 1963, ostensibly to return to New York. An article concerning this topic also appeared in the Washington Post of 30 November 1963.

The records of this office contain information about one Bill BURLEY, a U.S. Air Force Tech Sergeant, stationed in Libia in 1958 who may have been involved in nefarious activities. You are referred to the Office of Special Investigations, USAF, for possible additional information. enolosur**e**



- 4. Our information indicates that BURLEY had contact with persons whose activities seem to have been questionable. These persons are shown in our files to be:
 - a. fnu BABINGTON, a British soldier and his German wife Irene. The BABINGTON's reportedly left Benghazi sometime after March 1958.
 - b. Heipz KOLIECHIK of KOLIECISKI (phonetic). He was a German national, born circa 1913-1918. In 1958 he was employed as an engineer by Posts and Telecommunications in Benghazi. His wife, who is about five years older than her husband, was an Englishwoman employed at the NAAFI shop in Benghazi.



6. The above information is provided as a result of a preliminary check of our records. The records of this office contain no additional information which at this time can be identified as pertaining to the persons who might be identical with the men who placed the newspaper ad, or to persons who might have been in contact with them.

DALLAS, Nov. 29handbill was circulated a week ago today on two college campuses here. It showed front and side view pictures of John F. Kennedy. It said:

"Wanted for Treason."

A full-page advertisement was printed the same day in The Dallas Morning News. Set inside an ominous black border, it charged President Kennedy with being "soft" on enemies of America.

FBI agents are checking into the reasons for the appearance of the sinister hand-bill and newspaper ads on the day President Kennedy was assassinated here.

FAR RIGHT

The dire words in both notices obviously were inspired by extremists of the political far right.

Were the handbills "plant-" by Lee Harvey Oswald, the leftist, or by his confederates if he had any, to cast suspicion on the fanatics of the far right on the day of the assassination?

The newspaper advertisement was headlined: "Welcome, Mr. Kennedy, to Dallas." It was signed at the bottom: "Bernard Weissman, the American Feet Finding the American Fact-Finding Committee, an Unaffiliated and Non-Partisan Group of Citizens Who Wish Truth, P. O. Box 1792, Dallas."
