The Scientific and Technical Services Division is also requested to translate the August 18, 1975, Spanish letter. IRS has already tentatively translated same and a copy of this translation is enclosed.

At the end of last year I gave Mr. Kelley, the Director of the FBI, a letter from Lee Oswald. To my understanding he could have brought out the circumstances to the assassination of President Kennedy.

Since Mr. Kelly hasn't responded to that letter, I've got the right to believe something bad might happen to me, and that is why I see myself obligated to to keep myself away for a short time.

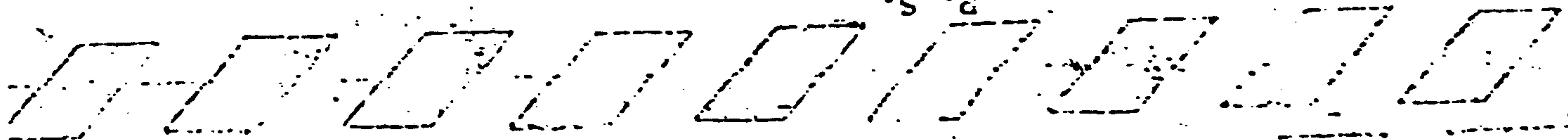
Convinced of the importance of that letter mentioned and knowing that you have been doing some investigation independently of the assassination, I'm sending you a copy of the same letter.

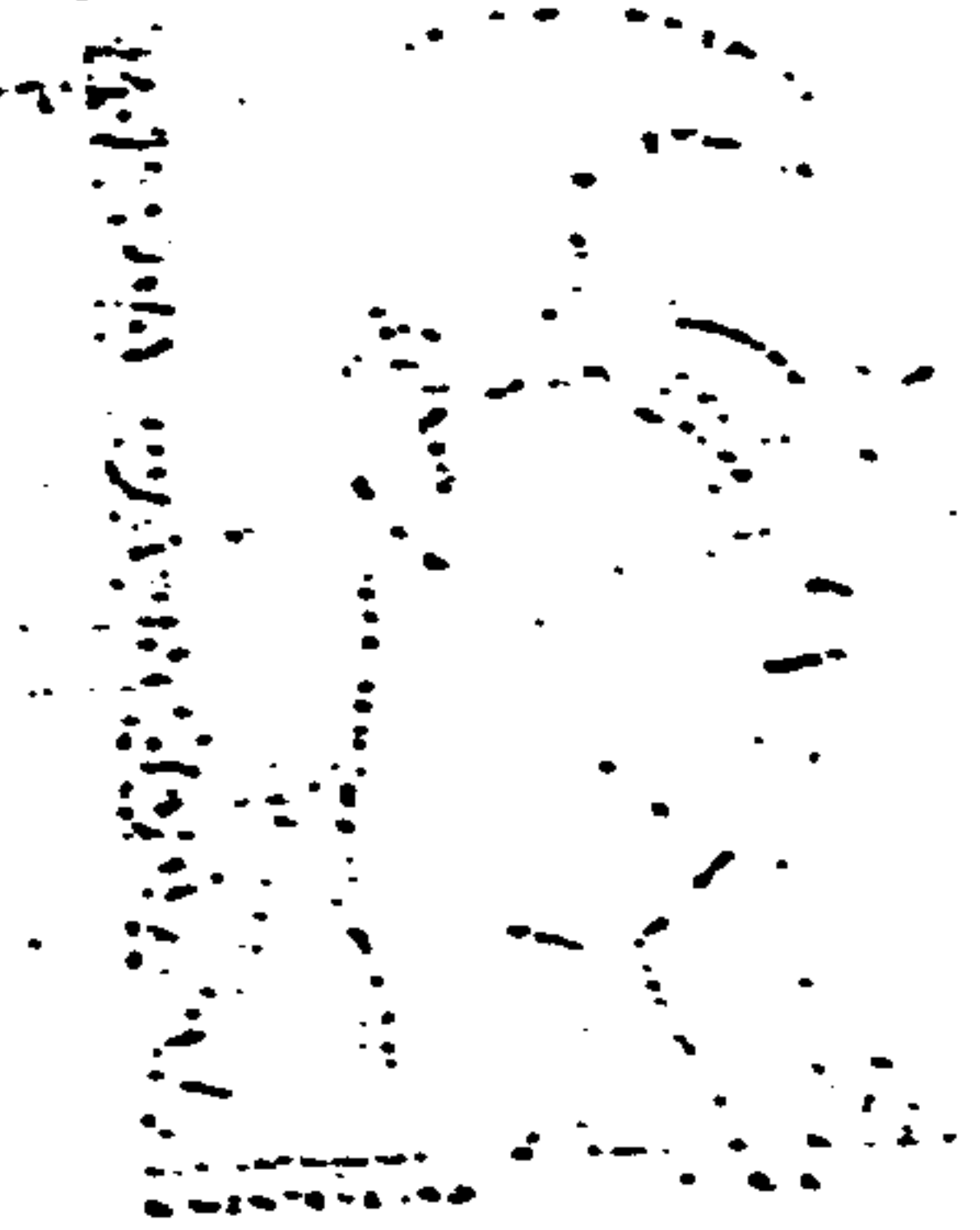

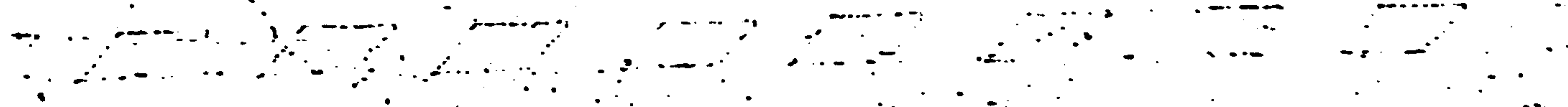

ENVELOPE AND SPANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER BUT HAS BEEN UNABLE TO LOCATE IT IN HIS FILES. JONES ADVISED HE RECEIVED A COPY OF THE ALLEGED LETTER TO MR. WINT, SIGNED BY MARTIN GONZALEZ, DATED NOVEMBER 8, 1963, ALONG WITH A DANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER SOMETIME AROUND AUGUST 18, 1975. HE ADVISED THAT HIS YOUNGEST SON TRANSLATED THE TRANSMITTAL LETTER INTO ENGLISH. JONES STATED THAT A COPY OF THE NOVEMBER 8, 1963, LETTER WAS SENT TO HIM COMPLETELY UNSOLICITED AND THAT HE HAS NO IDEA WHO THE SENDER IS. HE ADVISED THAT THE TRANSMITTAL LETTER BORE THE INITIALS, P. S., AND THE TRANSMITTING ENVELOPE HAD THE RETURN ADDRESS OF P.S., INSURGENTES SUR NO. 30, MEXICO, D.F., MEXICO.

JONES ADVISED THAT HE ACKNOWLEDGED THE AUGUST 18, 1975, LETTER, BUT HAS NEVER HEARD FROM THE SENDER AGAIN. HE ADVISED THAT HIS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT LETTER WAS NEVER RETURNED AND THEREFORE, ASSUMES SOMEONE MUST HAVE RECEIVED IT. JONES STATES THAT AFTER HE DID NOT RECEIVE ANY ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THE BASIS OF HIS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT LETTER, THAT HE DID NOT PUT A LOT OF FAITH IN THE LETTER. HE ADVISED THAT HE JUST DID NOT HAVE THE RESOURCES TO CHECK ON THE LETTER ANY FURTHER.

HE FURNISHED COPIES OF HIS NOVEMBER 8, 1963, LETTER, SPANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER, ENVELOPE, AND HIS OWN SPANISH TRANSLATION TO CARL GOLZ AND NUMEROUS OTHER INDIVIDUALS WHO HE THOUGHT MIGHT HAVE AN INTEREST IN THE MARIANO FERRER AND THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY.

JONES ADVISED THAT THE REASON HE FEELS THAT SOMEONE SENT HIM A COPY OF THE NOVEMBER 8, 1963, LETTER, IS BECAUSE HE HAS BEEN OUTSPOKEN ABOUT THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY SINCE 1965, AND HAS WRITTEN FOUR BOOKS ON THE SUBJECT, ENTITLED, "FORGIVE MY GRIEF", VOLUMES ONE THROUGH FOUR. JONES USED TO BE THE OWNER OF THE MIDLOTHIAN MIRROR WHICH HE SOLD IN OCTOBER, 1974. HE PRESENTLY PUBLISHES A MONTHLY NEWS LETTER ON THE ASSASSINATION ENTITLED "THE CONTINUING INQUIRY".

THE BUREAU IS REQUESTED THROUGH THE LEGAT, MEXICO CITY, TO DETERMINE PERTINENT BACKGROUND INFO ON AN INDIVIDUAL WITH THE INITIALS, P.S., HAVING THE ADDRESS OF INSURGENTES SUR NO. 33, MEXICO, D.F., MEXICO, WITH SPECIAL EMPHASIS DURING THE TIME FRAME OF AUGUST 17, 1975.

PURPOSE: To provide a resume of investigative and research results obtained pertinent to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) information furnished re captioned matter as known to the Bureau by close of business 2/2/77.

SYNOPSIS: Investigation and research has been conducted to resolve the following allegations:

1. That a November, 1963, letter was written by Lee Harvey Oswald to a Mr. Hunt.
2. That the original of such a letter was furnished to the FBI.
3. That a Jim Braden or Eugene Braden and Jack Ruby were in Nelson Bunker Hunt's office on 11/21/63, and signed a "sign out book" there.
4. That Jim Braden, aka, was involved in a kill squad organized by Nelson Bunker Hunt.

Thus far, investigation and research have failed to corroborate the specifics of these allegations, but have developed information concerning possessors of copies of the alleged Oswald letter and peripheral information relating to the persons and time frames involved in the allegations.

DETAILS: By letter dated 12/30/76, IRS, Washington, transmitted to HQ a 12/9/76, IRS, Dallas, memorandum of [redacted] enclosing a copy of a letter dated 11/8/63, allegedly written by Lee Harvey Oswald to a Mr. Hunt stating "I would like information concerning my position. I am asking only for information and suggesting that we discuss the matter fully before any steps are taken by me or anyone else." [redacted] stated that he had been informed that the original of this letter was in the FBI's possession.

In his 12/9/76, memorandum [redacted] contended that he received a copy of this letter on 12/9/76, and that during a 1971 IRS inquiry he received information that Nelson Bunker Hunt had organized a kill squad and that Jack Ruby and a Eugene Braden had been in Hunt's office and signed a "sign out book" there on 11/21/63.

By memorandum dated 1/6/77, Special Assistant to the Attorney General, Jack W. Fuller, furnished the IRS information to the Bureau.

Upon receipt of this information in the Congressional Inquiry Unit (CIU), General Investigative Division (GID), an immediate search of files was instituted. This search determined that a Jim Braden, aka Eugene Braden, was present in Dallas on 11/22/63, in the vicinity of the Texas School Book Depository Building, was interviewed by the Dallas Sheriff's Office on 11/22/63, and by Bureau Agents at Los Angeles, California, on 1/28/64. Information was also located that while in Dallas (11/63) Braden contacted United States Parole Officer Roger Carroll and indicated that he might or would contact H. L. Hunt. In addition, Braden was found to have a three page identification record under FBI Number 799 431, was convicted of Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property and

Mail Fraud violations in 1952, was involved with criminal elements and was known to them as a con man. The search failed to corroborate the specific information received from IRS and no original or copy of the purported Oswald letter was located in Dallas or Bufiles.

On 1/11/77, information from IRS was furnished to our Dallas office in order that a thorough search of its files could be conducted. The Dallas search located information re Eugene Braden but no information that corroborated the IRS information.

Bureau letter and memorandum 1/14/77, advised the Assistant Attorney General (AAG), Office of Legislative Affairs (OLA) of the file searches and that investigation was being conducted in an effort to resolve the ~~IRS~~ allegations. Between 1/12-14/77, contact was effected with the former Dallas case Agent in the John F. Kennedy (JFK) assassination, Robert P. Gemberling and former FBI document examiner, James Cadigan. Neither one recalled any information pertaining to a letter allegedly written by Oswald to a member of the Hunt family. Both insisted that the significance of such a letter, had it been brought to their attention, would have been immediately recognized and not forgotten.

An FOIA request made by Braden during 1976 disclosed an address of 3224 Peach Tree Road, Northeast, Atlanta, Georgia, which Atlanta Division has determined to be a mail drop or convenience address and the exact whereabouts of Braden at this time is unknown.

On 1/19/77, Dallas interviewed [REDACTED] who would not furnish specific information and alleged that disclosure might be prohibited by the Tax Reform Act of 1976 (Section 6103 (I)).

On 1/21/77, Senator Gary Hart, Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSC) initiated Committee Request Number 6250 asking for prompt access to FBI material on Nelson Bunker Hunt and Jim Braden. Committee staff members were granted access to material immediately available on 1/21/77, and were advised on 1/26/77, that additional material was available and had been prepared for access. This was confirmed by letter.

Prior to and following receipt of the results of the [redacted] interview on 1/19/77, the Office of Congressional Affairs (OCA), Legal Counsel Division, successfully initiated efforts (1) through the Deputy Assistant Attorney General (DAAG) Callaghan, OLA, to convince SSC that there was no need for independent inquiry by SSC into this matter as the FBI was already conducting active, expeditious investigation and would furnish results to the Committee in a timely fashion and (2) through DAAG Keuch, Criminal Division, to resolve any disclosure problems raised by IRS under the Tax Reform Act of 1976.

At 5:00 p.m. on 1/26/77, DAAG Callaghan advised OCA that IRS would instruct [redacted] to supply all pertinent, non tax information in this matter to the FBI and that IRS would gather pertinent recorded information from its files to be available to the FBI.

In response to Bureau instructions, Dallas SAs [redacted] and [redacted] interviewed [redacted] on 1/27/77, after [redacted] received written confirmation of IRS Headquarters instructions. [redacted] stated he received a copy of the alleged Oswald letter from [redacted] on 12/9/76, who advised he received it from Earl Golz, "Dallas Morning News" reporter, who got it from a FNU Hernandez, Midlothian, Texas, who claimed to have sent a copy of the Oswald letter to the FBI in late 1974 and who claimed to have received the letter from a person in Mexico.

[redacted] stated the sources of his information during the 1971 inquiry were [redacted] and another source which he declined to identify since that source may still be close to the Hunt family. Following termination of the interview [redacted] recontacted the Dallas office and stated [redacted] had furnished copies of the Oswald letter, a transmittal letter in Spanish and the envelope. [redacted] stated that the addressee's name appeared on the letter and envelope but had been blocked out. [redacted] furnished these documents to FBI, Dallas, which submitted them to the FBI Laboratory for examination. The Spanish language transmittal letter is dated 8/18/75, and bears the initials "P.S." (apparent sender) and the address: "Insurgentes, Sur No. 30, Mexico, D. F., Mexico." (It is to be noted that the sender ("P.S.") indicates that he, not a "Hernandez" sent "a letter from Lee Oswald" to the FBI "at the end of last year" (1974)).

██████████ speculated that ██████████ received these documents from Golz. Additionally, ██████████ stated he had received his 1971 records in this matter from the Federal Records Center and was reviewing same, but would require specific authority from IRS Headquarters for release of any non tax information.

A search of Bufiles disclosed information on 10/6/75, alleging that ██████████ and former ██████████ may have furnished documents to Golz during 1972 which came into ██████████ possession while in ██████████ (Bufile 62-109060-7376). Following receipt of this allegation ██████████ was interviewed by a Bureau Agent on 10/30/75, and furnished details concerning an 11/4/63, memorandum he had written concerning possible violence during the 11/22/63, JFK visit to Dallas. ██████████ stated his intention in writing the memorandum was to preclude Hunt family involvement in anti-Kennedy activities. Bufiles show that both ██████████ and ██████████, et al, were carried as victims in Bufile 139-3573 with Nelson Bunker Hunt and W. Herbert Hunt, et al, as subjects in an ██████████ investigation initiated in 1970. On 1/28/77, Dallas was telephonically instructed to interview ██████████ concerning his possession of documents which he may have furnished to Golz.

In Bufile 62-109060-7376, dated 10/6/75, the informant also advised that Golz was of the opinion, but never proved, that H. L. Hunt financed assassins including one Eugene Brady or Bradley who is alleged to have visited Hunt a few days before the JFK assassination.

Information pertaining to the 11/21/63, presence of Jack Ruby in the Mercantile Bank Building in Dallas, which also houses the office of Hunt Enterprises, has been located in Bureau files and was furnished to the Warren Commission where it appears as Warren Commission Exhibit Number 2, Volume XX, Page 41. It was ascertained that Ruby transported Connie Trammel, an acquaintance, to the Mercantile Bank Building where she had an appointment to see Lamar Hunt about a job. On interview, Ruby stated he had business with his attorney on that date in the same building.

By communication dated 2/2/77, the FBI Laboratory advised Dallas Division that the blocked out portions of the aforementioned transmittal letter to Midlothian, Texas, read "Penn Jones, Jr. Editor Midlothian Mirror."

Bufiles disclose that Penn Jones was the subject of Bufile 100-395874 wherein rumors accused him of [REDACTED] and he was also a victim in Dallas file 157-187 captioned "Unsub; Incendiary Device Thrown Into 'Midlothian Mirror,'" Midlothian, Texas, 4/30/62. In the book "The Scavengers and Critics of the Warren Report" by Richard Warren Lewis, Penn Jones is described as reportedly convinced that the JFK assassination involved 18 persons who are now dead and two riflemen firing simultaneously at JFK. Jones has also authored "Forgive my Grief" and lectured on his assassination theories.

Dallas will submit results of interviews of [REDACTED] Golz and Jones.

**PURPOSE:** To advise that Eugene Braden, the subject of various allegations as a co-conspirator in the assassination of John F. Kennedy, the most recent of which was furnished to the Office of Legislative Affairs, Department of Justice, by IRS by letter dated 12/30/76, intends to be in Washington, D. C., on 2/7/77. An attempt will be made by FBIHQ personnel at that time to interview Braden pertaining to the recent allegations and to request that Braden voluntarily submit to interview utilizing the polygraph technique. This has been coordinated with the Scientific and Technical Services Division and with SAC, Washington Field Office where polygraph will be administered.

**RECOMMENDATION:** That approval be granted for FBIHQ personnel to interview Braden and thereafter with Braden's consent to conduct further interview utilizing polygraph technique.

Re: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

Information recently received by Office of Legislative Affairs from IRS by letter dated 12/30/76, contained allegation that Jack Ruby and Eugene Braden were in the office of Nelson Bunker Hunt the day prior to the assassination, were involved with a "kill squad" and that Lee Harvey Oswald had corresponded with Hunt prior to the assassination.

Allegations concerning a conspiracy involving Braden were also published in a book by Peter Noyes entitled, A Legacy of Doubt.

Efforts to locate and interview Braden in Atlanta, his last known address, pertaining to these allegations have been negative. On 2/4/77 ASAC Edmond J. Pistey, Atlanta Division, telephonically advised that he received a long distance call from Braden who advised that he would be in Washington, D. C., on Monday, 2/7/77, to speak with someone in the Attorney General's Office and with Congressman Gonzales (Henry Gonzales, Chairman of the House Select Committee On Assassinations) pertaining to these allegations involving Braden.

[REDACTED] Polygraph Subunit, Scientific and Technical Services Division, has reviewed a series of questions prepared anticipating an interview with Braden, in the event Braden consents to interview utilizing polygraph.

In view of the fact that Braden will be in Washington, D. C., on 2/7/77, FBIHQ personnel knowledgeable pertaining to the assassination investigation and to the allegations involving Braden, will interview Braden and with his consent thereafter will arrange for polygraph examination to be administered by SA [REDACTED] Washington Field Office.

[REDACTED] COULD FURNISH NO PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE INFORMATION CONCERNING THE ALLEGED LETTER OF NOVEMBER 8, 1963 OR THE PRESENCE OF EUGENE BRADEN, AKA, AND JACK RUBY IN THE OFFICES OF THE HUNT OIL COMPANY, DALLAS, TEXAS, SHORTLY PRIOR TO THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY.

[REDACTED] ADVISED THAT HE HAS HEARD OF THE NOVEMBER 8, 1963 LETTER BEFORE, BUT THAT HE DOES NOT RECALL FROM WHOM AND WHEN. ~~HE~~ COULD HAVE HEARD ABOUT THE LETTER FROM EARL GOLZ, REPORTER, "DALLAS MORNING NEWS," BUT THAT HE CANNOT RECALL.

[REDACTED] ADVISED THAT IF HE WOULD HAVE HEARD ABOUT THE LETTER PRIOR TO THE ASSASSINATION, OR FOR ANY SUBSTANTIAL PERIOD THEREAFTER, IT WOULD HAVE BEEN FIRMLY IMPLANTED IN HIS MEMORY.

[REDACTED] ADVISED THAT AN INDIVIDUAL BY THE NAME OF BRADEN OR BRADLEY, CAME TO HIS ATTENTION A COUPLE OF YEARS AFTER THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY. THE ALLEGATION WAS MADE BY EITHER JIM GARRISON, FORMER DISTRICT ATTORNEY, NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA, OR PETER NOYES, A REPORTER FROM CALIFORNIA, THAT A BRADEN OR BRADLEY HAD VISITED THE HUNT OIL COMPANY A DAY OR TWO PRIOR TO THE ASSASSINATION. HE DOES NOT HAVE A CLEAR RECOLLECTION

OUT THAT WHEN THOSE NAMES CAME TO HIS ATTENTION, HE EITHER REVIEWED THE VISITOR LOG BOOK FOR THE HUNT OIL COMPANY OR CHECKED WITH BOBBY DRAKE, THE RECEPTIONIST OF THE HUNT OIL COMPANY, AS TO BRADEN OR BRADLEY. HE ADVISED HE EITHER SAW BRADEN OR BRADLEY'S NAME IN THE PERTINENT LOG BOOK OR THAT BOBBY DRAKE TOLD HIM THAT ONE OF THESE NAMES WAS REPORTED IN ONE OF THE LOG BOOKS. [REDACTED] DOES NOT HAVE A CLEAR RECOLLECTION AS TO WHICH EVENT TOOK PLACE. [REDACTED] STATED HE HAS READ SEVERAL ARTICLES OVER THE YEARS ABOUT THE BRADEN CONSPIRACY THEORY, AND THAT IT IS HARD FOR HIM TO SEPARATE WHAT HE RECALLS PERSONALLY FROM WHAT HE HAS READ ABOUT THIS.

INITIAL LETTER FROM EARL GOLZ, REPORTER, "DALLAS MORNING NEWS,"  
SOMETIME IN JULY OR AUGUST, 1976. [REDACTED] ADVISED THAT TO  
THE BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION, HE HAS NEVER DISCUSSED THE  
ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY WITH EARL GOLZ. HE ADVISED  
THAT GOLZ HAS BEEN TRYING TO ROMANCE HIM FOR SEVERAL YEARS IN  
AN EFFORT TO GET BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON THE HUNT FAMILY  
ON OTHER MATTERS. [REDACTED] ADVISED HE FEELS GOLZ FURNISHED  
HIM THIS INFORMATION TO SEE WHAT HIS REACTION WAS AND TO PERHAPS  
TRY TO DEVELOP HIM AS A FUTURE SOURCE. [REDACTED] ADVISED THAT  
PRIOR TO THE TIME HE RECEIVED A COPY OF THIS LETTER, AND  
RELATED DOCUMENTS FROM GOLZ, THAT HE HAD NO KNOWLEDGE CONCERNING  
THE NOVEMBER 8, 1963 LETTER. HE DID NOT ASK GOLZ WHEN OR WHERE  
HE GOT THE LETTER. [REDACTED] ADVISED HE FURNISHED A COPY OF  
THIS LETTER TO [REDACTED] IRS INTELLIGENCE, DALLAS, TEXAS,  
SOMETIME PRIOR TO CHRISTMAS, 1976, FOR GENERAL INFORMATION  
PURPOSES ONLY. [REDACTED] ADVISED THAT HIS RECOLLECTION IS  
THAT AN INDIVIDUAL BY THE NAME OF BRADEN AND WILLIAM CIES  
WERE IN NELSON BUNKER HUNT'S OFFICE A COUPLE OF TIMES DURING  
1962-1963. HE CANNOT PINPOINT A MORE DEFINITE TIME PERIOD.  
HE RECALLS THAT NELSON BUNKER HUNT HAD SOME KIND OF FINANCIAL



TRANSACTIONS WITH EITHER CIES OR BRADEN. HE ADVISED THAT HE BELIEVES [REDACTED] IRS, DALLAS, CONDUCTED INVESTIGATION CONCERNING THIS. [REDACTED] HAS NO FIRSTHAND KNOWLEDGE AS TO WHAT NELSON BUNKER HUNT, BRADEN, AND CIES DISCUSSED AND SPECULATES IT MIGHT HAVE HAD SOMETHING TO DO WITH NELSON BUNKER HUNT'S FINANCING CERTAIN CONSERVATIVE CAUSES THAT WERE CONSISTENT WITH HIS POLITICAL PHILOSOPHY.

[REDACTED] ADVISED THAT HE HAD NEVER SEEN JACK RUBY IN THE OFFICES OF THE HUNT OIL COMPANY, BUT THAT TO THE BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION, STREET TALK WAS THAT RUBY HAD BEEN IN LAMAR HUNT'S OFFICE ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS PRIOR TO NOVEMBER 22, 1963. HE DOES NOT PERSONALLY KNOW ANYTHING TO SUBSTANTIATE THIS ALLEGATION.

ON FEBRUARY 2, 1977, EARL A. GULZ, INVESTIGATIVE REPORTER, "DALLAS MORNING NEWS", DALLAS, TEXAS, ADVISED HE RECEIVED A COPY OF THE ALLEGED NOVEMBER 8, 1963 LEE HARVEY OSWALD LETTER TO MR. HUNT, AS WELL AS A COPY OF THE ENVELOPE, A COPY OF THE SPANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER, AND A COPY OF THE ENGLISH TRANSLATION OF THAT TRANSMITTAL LETTER FROM PENN JONES, FORMER EDITOR OF THE "MIDLOTHIAN MIRROR", APPROXIMATELY SIX MONTHS AFTER AUGUST 18,

1975, WHICH WAS THE DATE ON THE SPANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER. GOLZ ADVISED THAT JONES HAS DONE A LOT OF RESEARCH ON THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY WITH EMPHASIS ON VARIOUS CONSPIRACY THEORIES. JONES FURNISHED GOLZ A COPY OF THE LETTER FOR GENERAL INFORMATION PURPOSES SINCE JONES KNOWS GOLZ HAS ALSO DONE RESEARCH ON THE ASSASSINATION. JONES DID NOT KNOW WHO THE INDIVIDUAL IN MEXICO WAS WHO SENT HIM THE LETTER. JONES HAS APPARENTLY CONDUCTED INVESTIGATION TO ATTEMPT TO VERIFY THE ORIGIN OF THIS LETTER, BUT ALL INVESTIGATION HAS LED TO A DEAD END. THE RETURN ADDRESS ON THE ENVELOPE OF "INSURGENTES SUR, NO. 30, MEXICO CITY" APPARENTLY CHECKED OUT TO A MEXICAN VERSION OF A POST OFFICE BOX WHICH WAS NO LONGER IN EXISTENCE.

GOLZ ADVISED TO THE BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION, THAT SHORTLY AFTER HE OBTAINED A COPY OF THE LETTER FROM PENN JONES, HE SENT COPIES OUT TO [REDACTED], AND [REDACTED] FORMER HUNT COMPANY EMPLOYEES, TO DETERMINE IF THEY KNEW ANYTHING ABOUT SUCH A LETTER. GOLZ ADVISED HE HAS NOT DEVELOPED ANY ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THESE INDIVIDUALS OR ANYONE ELSE AS TO A Y KNOWLEDGE OF SUCH A LETTER.

GOLZ ADVISED THAT OVER THE YEARS, HE HAS TRIED TO CHECK OUT

ENVELOPE AND SPANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER BUT HAS BEEN UNABLE TO LOCATE IT IN HIS FILES. JONES ADVISED HE RECEIVED A COPY OF THE ALLEGED LETTER TO MR. HUNT, SIGNED BY HARVEY OSWALD, DATED NOVEMBER 8, 1963, ALONG WITH A SPANISH TRANSMITTAL LETTER SOMETIME AFTER AUGUST 18, 1975. HE ADVISED THAT HIS YOUNGEST SON TRANSLATED THE TRANSMITTAL LETTER INTO ENGLISH. JONES STATED THAT A COPY OF THE NOVEMBER 8, 1963, LETTER WAS SENT TO HIM COMPLETELY UNSOLICITED AND THAT HE HAS NO IDEA WHO THE SENDER IS. HE ADVISED THAT THE TRANSMITTAL LETTER BORE THE INITIALS, P.S., AND THE TRANSMITTING ENVELOPE HAD THE RETURN ADDRESS OF P.S., INSURGENTES SUR NO. 32, MEXICO, D.F., MEXICO.

JONES ADVISED THAT HE ACKNOWLEDGED THE AUGUST 18, 1975, LETTER, BUT HAS NEVER HEARD FROM THE SENDER AGAIN. HE ADVISED THAT HIS ACKNOWLEDGEMENT LETTER WAS NEVER RETURNED AND THEREFORE, ASSUMES SOMEONE MUST HAVE RECEIVED IT. EARL GOLZ was interviewed by SAS [redacted] and [redacted], and at no time did either Agent make any reference as to how the information concerning the alleged letter came to their attention. Neither Agent made any type of reference to GOLZ that the letter had been delivered to a former aide of the late H. L. HUNT.

The Bureau has been made aware by previous communications that EARL GOLZ received a copy of the 11/8/63 letter and related documents from WILLIAM PENN JONES, Midlothian, Texas, approximately six months after 8/18/75. GOLZ, in turn, made available a copy of this letter and related documents to [redacted] a former aide of H. L. HUNT..

GOLZ knew all along that a copy of the 11/8/63 letter had been delivered to a former aide of the late H. L. HUNT, namely [redacted], since GOLZ himself delivered a copy of the letter to him in either July or August, 1975.

The above is being furnished to the Bureau for information purposes in view of the above outlined misleading implications in the EARL GOLZ article of 2/6/77.

# Alleged Oswald letter checked for its authenticity by FBI agents

A letter purportedly written by Lee Harvey Oswald asking a "Mr. Hunt" for "information concerning my position" two weeks before the assassination of President John F. Kennedy is being checked for its authenticity by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

FBI agents said they had no knowledge of the letter until several days ago when they acquired a copy that had been delivered to a former aide of the late H. L. Hunt, Dallas billionaire oilman.

The script of the cryptic note, written and signed under the date of Nov. 8, 1963, closely resembles the style of Oswald's handwriting as reproduced in the Warren Report.

The letter in its entirety, read: "Dear Mr. Hunt,

"I would like information concerning my position.

"I am asking only for information. I am suggesting that we discuss the matter fully before any steps are taken by me or anyone else."

IT WAS SIGNED "Thank you, Lee Harvey Oswald."

An unidentified source of the letter asserted he "gave" FBI Director Clarence Kelley a copy in late 1974, but FBI agents told The News this week they have no record of such a delivery.

Two of the federal agents questioned this reporter extensively after learning that the copy of the letter had passed through his hands before reaching the former Hunt aide.

The contention that Kelley was given a copy was made in an unsigned cover letter typewritten in Spanish and mailed in August, 1975, from Mexico City to Penn Jones Jr. of Midlothian, Texas.

Jones, a retired newspaper editor, has been a longtime critic of the Warren Commission's conclusion that Oswald acted alone in assassinating Kennedy in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963. Translated, the anonymous sender told Jones in his cover letter:

"To my understanding it (Oswald letter) could have brought out the cir-

"SINCE MR. KELLEY hasn't responded to that letter, I've got the right to believe something bad might happen to me, and that is why I see myself obligated to keep myself away for a short time.

"Convinced of the importance of that letter mentioned and knowing that you (Jones) have been doing some investigation independently of the assassination, I'm sending you a copy of the same letter."

Jones said he replied in writing to the return address on the envelope, which was "P.S., Insurgentes Sur No. 309, Mexico, D.F., Mexico."

"ALL I did was answer the letter and got no reply," Jones said. "I never did hear from him again. Of course, it did not come back to me so apparently it was delivered to somebody."

A spokesman for the U.S. Department of Justice said he hadn't known of the letter, but would "check with the FBI and get back to you."

"THERE IS NO REOPENING of the investigation of the Kennedy assassination," the spokesman said. "If this (letter) came up, I suppose they (FBI) just to run it down."

Later FBI official Tom Harrington in Washington, D.C., called to say "no comment" when asked whether his agency had reactivated an ongoing investigation of the Kennedy slaying.

King, said the committee has never seen a copy of the alleged Oswald letter and didn't know the FBI was probing its authenticity.

Tanenbaum said he had heard a report that former U.S. Atty. Gen. Edward Levi had asked the FBI to conduct investigations into the Kennedy as well as King case "once he found out this (congressional) committee was established."

H. L. Hunt, who died in 1974, had repeatedly denied any knowledge of Oswald or the assassination.

However, Hunt had assigned a member of his staff to conduct a private investigation of the Kennedy slaying. The ongoing probe in part monitored government investigations, including the Warren Commission's, and continued through the inquiry directed in the late 1960s by New Orleans Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison.

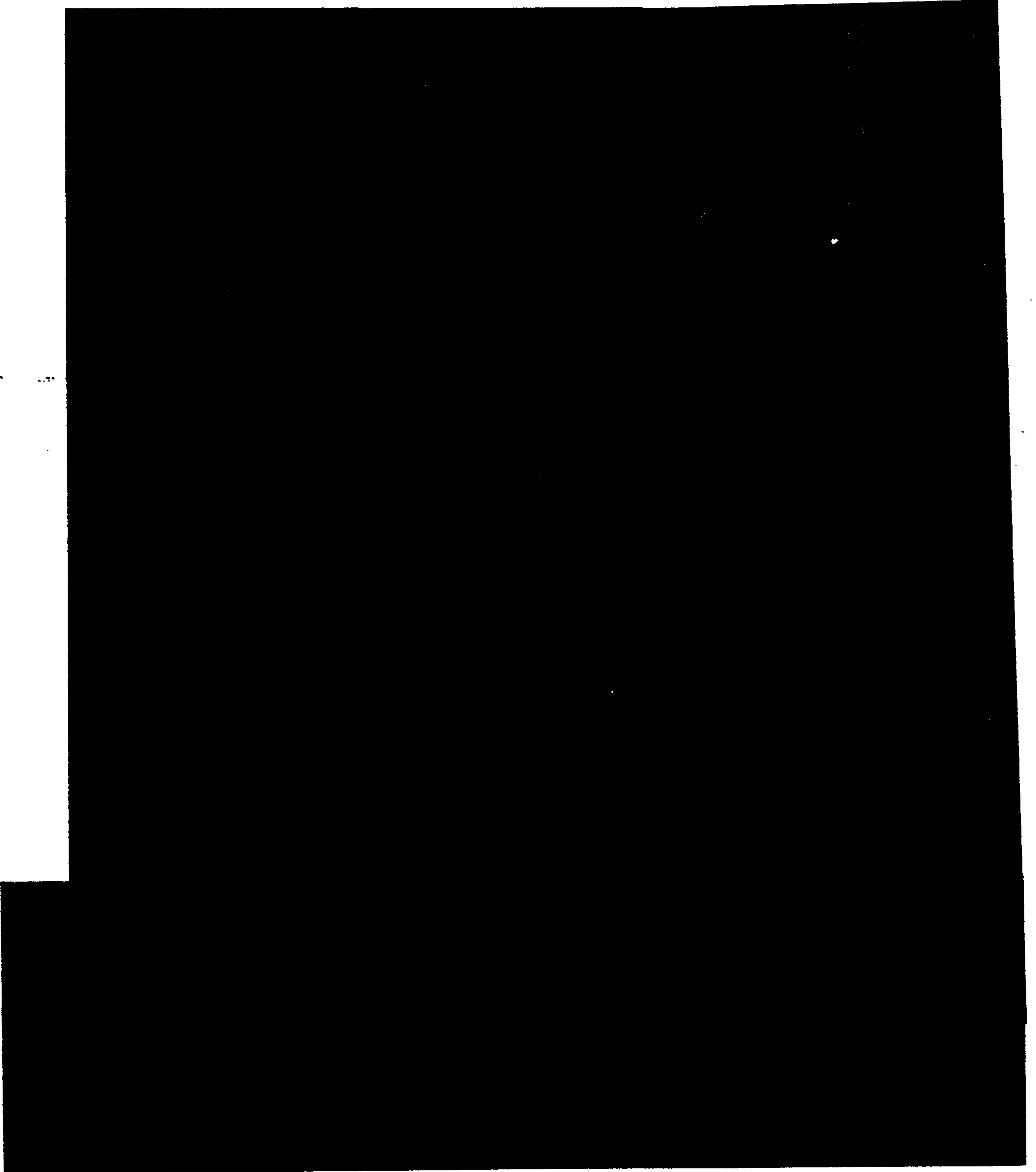

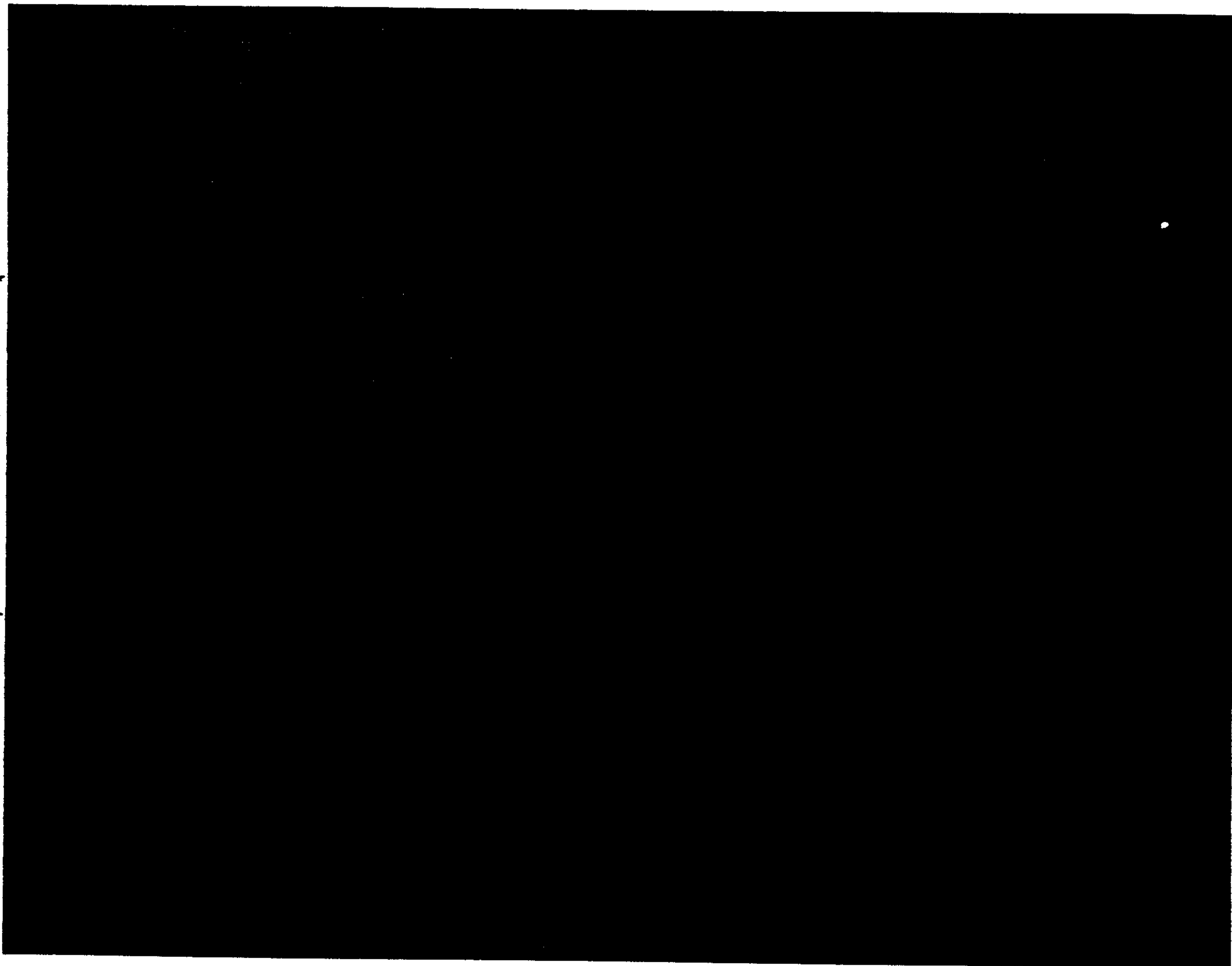


