At 3:00 PM, March 7, 1977, Special Agent [REDACTED] telephonically contacted [REDACTED] residence. A woman, who identified herself as [REDACTED] advised that her husband was not at home, and that she would give him the message to contact [REDACTED]

On the afternoon of March 7, 1977, efforts were made to contact [REDACTED] Internal Revenue Service, Dallas, Texas, but his secretary advised that he is at a meeting all week long. A message was left to have [REDACTED] contact Special Agent [REDACTED]

On March 14, 1977, [REDACTED] Internal Revenue Service, Intelligence, Dallas, Texas, telephonically contacted Special Agent [REDACTED], FBI, Dallas, Texas, and advised that he was at a school all last week, and therefore, could not get in contact with Special Agent [REDACTED]. He was advised that [REDACTED] to date has not made himself available to be interviewed by the Dallas office of the FBI. [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] has been furnishing information to Internal Revenue Service in connection with a special enforcement program that Internal Revenue Service Intelligence has concerning the criminal element. [REDACTED] has furnished information to Internal Revenue Service on local Dallas bookmakers. [REDACTED] advised that as far as he knows, that the information that [REDACTED] furnished has been reliable. [REDACTED] advised that when he last talked to [REDACTED] on March 4, 1977, that [REDACTED] asked him that if he talked to the FBI, what use would be made of the information. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that he might get a free trip to Washington to testify before a Congressional Committee concerning his information. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] might have had second thoughts after he told him that.

[REDACTED] advised that several weeks ago, specific date unrecalled, he met [REDACTED] at the restaurant located on the twenty-fifth floor of the Manor House, Commerce Street, Dallas, Texas. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] talked to him about [REDACTED] a former stripper in one of Jack Ruby's nightclubs. This conversation led to

[REDACTED] discussing his knowledge of Ruby. [REDACTED] told him that on the morning of the assassination, Jack Ruby called him on the telephone and asked him if he would like to go to the Presidential Parade with him, and if he would "like to watch the fireworks." [REDACTED] said that he was with Jack Ruby and standing at the corner of the Postal Annex Building facing the Texas School Book Depository Building, at the time of the shooting. Immediately after the shooting, Ruby left and headed toward the area of the Dallas Morning News Building, without saying anything to him.

[REDACTED] also told him that after Jack Ruby was arrested for killing Lee Harvey Oswald, that he was also arrested on an unrelated criminal charge, and incarcerated at the Dallas County Jail. [REDACTED] got to know Ruby better in the County Jail, [REDACTED] and as Ruby's mind began to deteriorate, he would perform services for him, like bring him his food and reading material, because Ruby became very suspicious and felt that someone was trying to poison his food and do him harm.

[REDACTED] advised that when he initially got the information from [REDACTED] he put this information in a memorandum for the Internal Revenue Service National Office to be disseminated to Congressman Downing's Committee. The National Office returned the memorandum to Dallas, Texas, and told Internal Revenue Service to disseminate the information to the FBI in Dallas.

[REDACTED] advised that he has not seen the memorandum since Robert J. Potrykus, Chief, Intelligence Division, Internal Revenue Service, Dallas, Texas, had it prior to delivering the letter to the FBI in Dallas.

[REDACTED] was requested to furnish a copy of the memorandum to the FBI, but he did not respond to that request, and stated that he did not know where the memorandum was.

[REDACTED] will attempt to call [REDACTED] to determine why he has not made himself available for interview.

[redacted] is being transferred to [redacted] Texas, as of March 15, 1977, and can be reached at [redacted]

Special Agent [redacted] FBI, Dallas, Texas, telephonically contacted [redacted] residence during the morning, afternoon, and evening hours on March 11; March 14; March 15,; March 21; March 22; March 24; April 4; and April 5, 1977, but no one responded.

On March 22, 1977, Special Agent [redacted] FBI, Dallas, Texas, personally went to [redacted] residence, [redacted], but no one could be located at the residence. A message was left at the residence for [redacted] to contact [redacted]

On March 28, 1977, Special Agent [redacted] telephonically contacted [redacted] residence, and his wife answered the telephone. She stated that she gave him the message to contact Mr. [redacted] and that she also received the note that Mr. [redacted] left in the mailbox. She advised that her husband has been out of town, and should be home sometime this week. She advised that she will give him the message to contact [redacted]

On April 5, 1977, [redacted] Special Agent, Internal Revenue Service, Intelligence Division, Fort Worth, Texas, telephonically advised that he has utilized [redacted] as an informant since March 4, 1976, and another Internal Revenue Service Agent had contact with him beginning sometime in December, 1975. [redacted] advised that Internal Revenue Service has been using him in their special enforcement program concerning illegal criminal activities. As a result of information furnished by [redacted], Internal Revenue Service has opened up approximately fifteen tax investigations, and thirty audit examinations. He advised that in the past he has considered [redacted] reliable, but that he does not know whether or not [redacted] was truthful concerning the information he furnished about Jack Ruby. He advised that he has not personally talked to [redacted] since March 4, 1977, and that [redacted] has not returned his telephone calls. [redacted] advised that he has talked to [redacted] wife twice since

March 4, 1977, and left a message with her for [REDACTED] to call him. The last time he talked to her was last Wednesday or Thursday, and she told him that [REDACTED] was in the [REDACTED] area, trying to "make a buck here and there."

[REDACTED] stated that on March 4, 1977, [REDACTED] gave him every indication that he was going to keep his appointment with the FBI, and told him that he knew where the office was located. He advised that the possibility exists that [REDACTED] might have been untruthful, or he could have gotten cold feet because of all the publicity surrounding the reinvestigation of the President Kennedy assassination.

Enclosed for your information are the original and three copies of a memorandum setting forth information received by the FBI which indicates that George S. DeMohrenschildt may have committed suicide on March 29, 1977, following interview by a "Readers Digest" reporter, Edward J. Epstein, during which DeMohrenschildt allegedly made revelations concerning his knowledge of the captioned matter.

The FBI is continuing efforts to locate and interview Epstein, following which all logical leads will be expeditiously pursued. Investigation will include the interview of DeMohrenschildt's family members when appropriate and the identification and interview of the Dallas, Texas, attorney who allegedly possesses tapes and records of DeMohrenschildt.

NOTE: This is to provide the Department with information received by the FBI on 3/29/77, concerning the death (apparent suicide) of George S. DeMohrenschildt on 3/29/77, and the fact that he is alleged to have made revelations to a "Readers Digest" reporter shortly before his death on 3/29/77, indicating that he may not have been entirely truthful in past statements made to the FBI and the Warren Commission concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. Bufiles indicate that DeMohrenschildt was born in Poland of Russian parents and is a naturalized citizen. He was a social acquaintance of Lee and Marina Oswald in Dallas prior to the assassination. There was considerable speculation during the investigation of the assassination that DeMohrenschildt might have been involved, but no evidence was ever developed indicating this to be so. In 1964, he took up residence in Haiti where he worked as a consulting engineer for the Haitian Government. He has been described as an unprincipled adventurer who has lived primarily by his wits. He has also been characterized as a ~~braggart~~ of poor moral character. At approximately 9 a.m., 3/30/77, Supervisor Joe Ball, Miami Division, advised that efforts thus far to locate and interview Epstein have been negative; however, they have additional leads in that regard and are pursuing same. Also, at approximately 9 a.m. this morning, Bureau Agents were to have listened to a tape made of the interview of Epstein by the Palm Beach, Florida, Sheriff's Office, at which interview a representative of the State Attorney's Office was present.

At 7:10 p.m., March 29, 1977, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] residing in the Washington suburban area, telephonically contacted a representative of the Intelligence Division, Federal Bureau of Investigation Headquarters (FBIHQ), Washington, D. C. [REDACTED] advised that Mr. Edward J. Epstein, who is an outstanding investigative reporter doing research under a contract with 'Reader's Digest' looking into the Kennedy assassination, telephonically contacted him earlier in the evening. Epstein advised that he had been interviewing one (First Name Unknown) DeMohrenschildt, who had been deposed by the Warren Commission. Epstein debriefed DeMohrenschildt and on the first debriefing obtained 'extraordinary revelations.' Following an early morning debriefing on March 29, 1977, Epstein returned to DeMohrenschildt's residence and learned he had just committed suicide.

According to Epstein, DeMohrenschildt left with an unnamed lawyer in Dallas, Texas, a photograph of Oswald holding a rifle. This is not believed to be a new photograph, but one which the FBI has seen before. However, according to DeMohrenschildt, the photo he left with the lawyer was inscribed by Marina Oswald with the following: 'Long live the assassins.' According to [REDACTED] Epstein is staying at the Breakers, Key West, Florida, telephone number (305) 655 6611, extension #179. [REDACTED] furnished no additional pertinent information.

Assassination of President John F. Kennedy

Subsequent to receipt of the above, the Miami, Florida, Office of the FBI determined the following information:

George DeMohrenschildt, Professor, Bishop College, Dallas, Texas, and daughter have been visiting in Manalapan, Florida. On March 29, 1977, DeMohrenschildt spent a portion of the day with Edward J. Epstein, a reporter for "Reader's Digest" who was interviewing DeMohrenschildt for an article on Lee Harvey Oswald. DeMohrenschildt arrived at his residence following interview with Epstein and was advised by his daughter that a [REDACTED] of the House Committee on Assassinations of John F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King had been at the residence to see him. The daughter and others left the residence and DeMohrenschildt was later found dead with an indication he put a twenty gauge shotgun in his mouth and committed suicide. Epstein thereafter contacted one [REDACTED] and related that DeMohrenschildt had made extraordinary revelations during the interview concerning the Kennedy assassination.

Unsuccessful attempts were made by FBI Agents to contact Epstein at the Breakers Hotel, Palm Beach, on March 29, 1977, and thereafter were advised by [REDACTED], Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, that Epstein was now being interviewed by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office. [REDACTED] was contacted and he advised that investigation indicates DeMohrenschildt committed suicide and that the interview of Epstein had just concluded and that Epstein had just departed. [REDACTED] advised Epstein stated, during interview, that DeMohrenschildt had indicated he had not been truthful with the Warren Commission previously, claimed a close relationship with Oswald and wife (Marina) in Dallas and that he had maneuvered Oswald around to put him in touch with the "right people" in the Dallas area. Deceased also told Epstein he was in possession of the original photograph of Oswald which previously appeared on the cover of "Life" magazine. "Life" magazine had obtained a copy of that photo from Marina Oswald and the original photo in DeMohrenschildt's possession bore Oswald's autograph and a notation by Oswald, "To the Russian assassin." [REDACTED] advised Epstein was cooperative and some attorney in Dallas was in possession of tapes and records of DeMohrenschildt. [REDACTED] advised he would make tapes of the interview of Epstein available on March 30, 1977, if it is agreeable with the Florida State Attorney's Office.

Possible Publication Regarding
Assassination of President John F. Kennedy

According to a recent report from the FBI, [redacted] expects the Baltimore Sun to publish within about two weeks a report of an interview with him on the subject assassination. [redacted] is a reputable gun dealer and firearms and ballistics expert, having frequently testified for the United States on such matters. He is not regarded as eccentric. He has amassed a large quantity of materials on the assassination.

[redacted] said he agrees that Oswald did fire at the President (apparently scoring a hit) but that a higher powered weapon fired the shot which blew away a portion of the President's head.

[redacted] theory is that a Secret Service agent in the following car, probably Kenneth O'Donnell, fired ahead at the "grassy knoll." He claims O'Donnell's shots passed over the head of the driver who was heard by witnesses (unidentified) to exclaim, "For Christ sake, if we haven't killed him already don't start now." [redacted] said the Kennedy family was told of the accident, and a decision was made to cover it up. He said O'Donnell later suffered a nervous breakdown.

This information is furnished to alert you to a possible flurry of inquires on the subject when and if the interview is published. We recommend that all such inquiries be relayed to the FBI for such reply as may be appropriate.

Result of examination:

The photocopy shown in the Item 2 photographs does not reproduce the handwriting on the original document with sufficient clarity of line detail for adequate handwriting comparisons or any definite determination whether that handwriting was or was not prepared by LEE HARVEY OSWALD, whose available genuine writings consist of a large number of documents previously submitted in this investigation. However, from such comparisons and examinations as could be made, significant similarities in letter formations were noted as well as a number of unexplained handwriting variations. In the absence of the original document reproduced in the Item 2 photographs, or a clear photograph of the original document, it is doubtful whether OSWALD can be definitely identified or positively eliminated as the writer of the questioned letter.

It was determined that the typewriter used to prepare K1 was not used to prepare the typewriting on the envelope shown in the Item 3 photograph.

Items 2 and 3 are retained, as well as photographs prepared from the ALSO SUBMITTED negatives. The ALSO SUBMITTED items and photographs prepared from the ALSO SUBMITTED negatives are returned herewith to Dallas. K1 and K2 are retained to facilitate any future examinations and comparisons which might be desired.
