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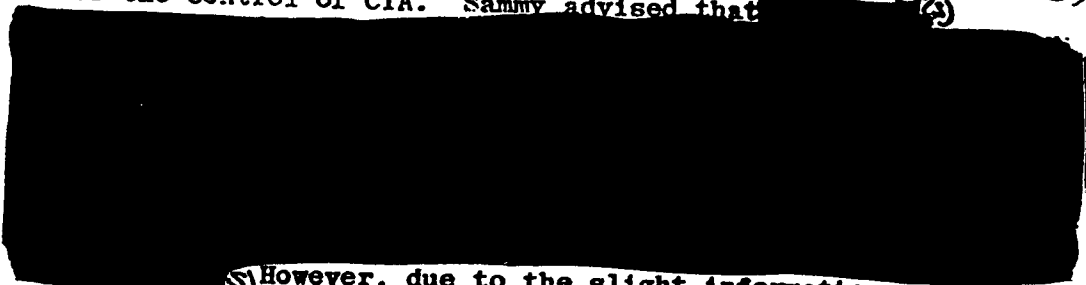

1. Reference is made to your memorandum dated 18 September 1964, Subject: [REDACTED]

2. In a recent interview with SAMMY, the following information concerning [REDACTED] was obtained:

a. SAMMY (Source) does not know when, where, or why [REDACTED] first came to the attention of the KGB. He stated that [REDACTED] was recruited in 1962, but he does not know when he was first contacted.

b. Source does not know the degree or length of effort which was mounted against [REDACTED] prior to his recruitment. He knows that [REDACTED] came to the Soviet Union several times but does not know specific dates or purposes. Source heard nothing about [REDACTED] in 1960 and 1961 when Source was in the 1st (American) Department, Second Chief Directorate, (Internal Counterintelligence). He only knows that [REDACTED] was in the USSR in 1962 and 1963.

c. Source never met [REDACTED] but learned about the case in 1963 when Gennadiy Ivanovich GRYAZNOV from the 1st Department, SCD, called Source and asked his help in obtaining a hotel room next to or near [REDACTED] room for a woman, name unknown, from Leningrad (not further identified). All the hotels were crowded, according to GRYAZNOV, so Source called the Chief of the 3rd Section (hotels and restaurants), 7th Department (Tourists), SCD, to arrange for the hotel room. (NOTE: At this time, Source was Deputy Chief of the 7th Department.)

d. Source learned that [redacted] had been recruited in 1962 by the [redacted] 1st Department, SCD, when he [redacted] was working [redacted] in Moscow. The recruitment was made on the basis of [redacted] love for the above noted Soviet woman from Leningrad. Source also learned that [redacted] was temporarily working in [redacted] and that himself said he was planning to work for [redacted]

[redacted] Source explained that it is a matter of common knowledge in the KGB that there was some housecleaning in the CIA, in that emigres and people who acquired United States citizenship by naturalization were asked to leave the CIA.

e. Source has no information about other agents in contact with [redacted] or any information about [redacted] staying or traveling with [redacted]. He does know that the 1st Department of the Second Chief Directorate made the recruitment, but cannot identify the case officers who accomplished the recruitment. Source knows, however, that Sergey Mikhaylovich FEDOSEYEV, Chief of the 1st Department, SCD, visited Leningrad and Kiev on unknown dates in 1963 to meet [redacted]

f. In Source's opinion FEDOSEYEV and GRYAZNOV are involved in the handling of [redacted] they will not turn him over to anyone else, but will await his return to the USSR. Source has no information on their present or long range plans for [redacted]. Source does recall that FEDOSEYEV and GRYAZNOV were thinking about gathering compromising material on two unnamed Americans [redacted]

However, Source does not know what, if anything, was actually done on this matter.

g. To Source's knowledge, [redacted] provided information in 1962, [redacted]

SUBJECT: SAMMY

1. Reference is made to your memorandum dated 10 September 1964, Subject: SAMMY ESPIONAGE - RUSSIA.

2. On 15 September 1964, SAMMY [redacted] Sergey Mikhaylovich GOLUBEV [redacted] however, knew very little about GOLUBEV; since the few contacts between them were concerning official KGB business and the initial meeting occurred only in 1959.

3. Although SAMMY can provide no information regarding GOLUBEV's pre-KGB career, the date he entered the KGB, or any position within the KGB prior to 1959, SAMMY stated that GOLUBEV was a senior case officer in the Fourteenth Department, First Chief Directorate, KGB then and is currently a senior case officer in Service Number 2 of the First Chief Directorate, KGB, the successor to the Fourteenth Department. SAMMY first encountered GOLUBEV in 1959 when GOLUBEV came to the Seventh Department, Second Chief Directorate, KGB, to speak to someone (name not recalled) about a topic which is not known to SAMMY.

4. SAMMY thinks that GOLUBEV has been abroad twice. SAMMY knows definitely that GOLUBEV was in New York in 1960 or 1961 with the Soviet Delegation to the United Nations General Assembly, but he does not know the length of his stay, the purpose of the assignment, or if GOLUBEV traveled

under his true name. SAMMY also believes that GOLUBEV went to Switzerland as a member of the Soviet Disarmament Delegation, but does not know when, the length of the stay, the purpose, or whether he used his true name.

5. Prior to SAMMY's trip to Switzerland with the Soviet Disarmament Delegation in 1962 he invited GOLUBEV to his office to obtain his assessment of the MID employees in the delegation. SAMMY knew that GOLUBEV was acquainted with some of these MID employees and wanted to obtain some information about their personalities. SAMMY stated that GOLUBEV gave him an assessment of Semen K. TSARAPKIN, Valerian Aleksandrovich ZORIN and others whose names he does not remember.

6. SAMMY's last contact with GOLUBEV was in 1962 or 1963, when Dmitriy Alekseyevich DITYAYEV, a case officer of the Seventh Department, Second Chief Directorate, KGB, had some information on an American woman, [redacted] who was of no real value to the Seventh Department, but who would be of interest to Service Number 2. Reference previous SAMMY correspondence and your Bureau file no. [redacted]. When queried, Service Number 2 was indeed interested in the case and asked permission to send one of their case officers, GOLUBEV, with DITYAYEV for the recruitment of [redacted] whose KGB cryptonym is [redacted] was recruited and her file was turned over to GOLUBEV, who had a few operational meetings with her. Sometime later, SAMMY learned from Vitaliy Grigoryevich DERA that GOLUBEV had told DITYAYEV that "they" had a meeting with [redacted] in the United States soon after her recruitment. SAMMY was not told who "they" were, but he does not believe that it was GOLUBEV who met her.

7. SAMMY stated that GOLUBEV had been connected with counterintelligence with the Fourteenth Department, now Service Number 2, of the First Chief Directorate, KGB, since 1959 and is probably employed in the New York Direction of Service Number 2 since [redacted] is located in New York.

8. SAMMY's knowledge of GOLUBEV's career is limited to the few official contacts listed in the preceding paragraphs. SAMMY does not know GOLUBEV well, does not

know his first name and patronymic, has no knowledge of his personal life whatsoever, and has little information about his KGB career. SAMMY has heard neither good nor bad reports concerning GOLUBEV, has no knowledge whether or not he has ever been rewarded or reprimanded within the KGB and cannot provide an assessment of him.

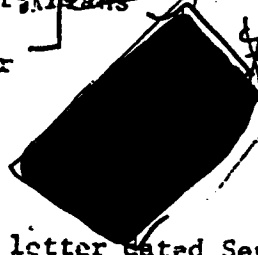

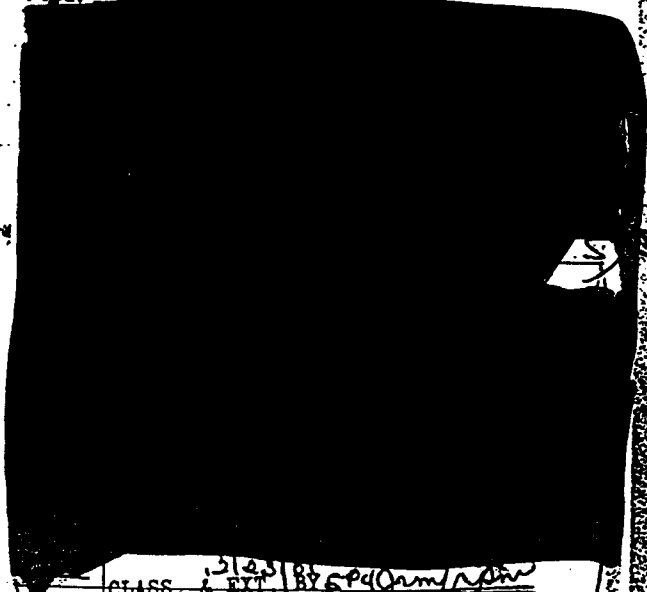

2. SAMMY was interviewed concerning the purpose of the travel of the [redacted]

[redacted] to the United States in [redacted] SAMMY was unable to provide any substantive information concerning the purpose of their travel; [redacted]

SAMMY stated that, in his opinion, their travel was connected with the agent at the American military installation near Paris. SAMMY speculated that the purpose of the trip to the United States may have been:

- a. to carry out their cover as Ministry of Foreign Affairs couriers.
- b. because there was a delay in the operational activity in Paris; the technicians may have gone on to the United States in hopes of carrying out the operation in Paris on their return trip.

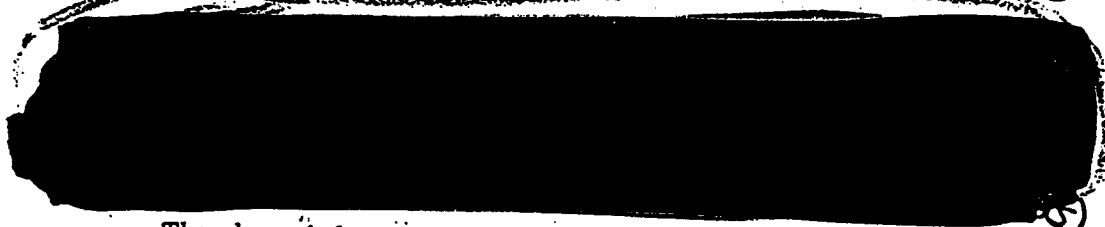
