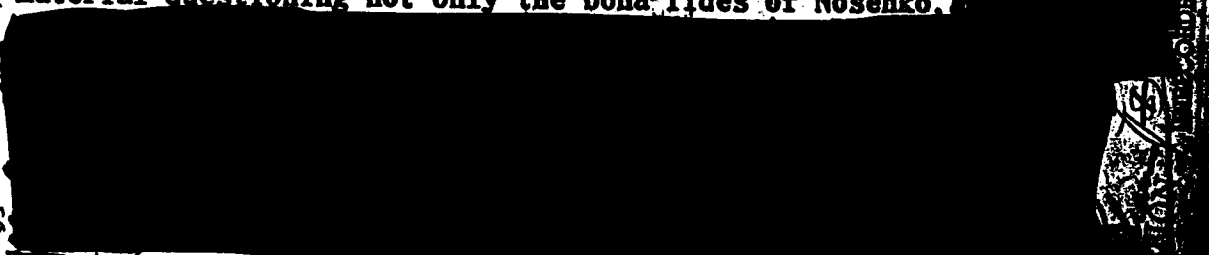
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This memorandum discusses the Central Intelligence Agency's (CIA) views with respect to the bona fides of the Soviet defector, Yuri Nosenko, and his part and the part of other Soviet defectors in a master Soviet deception plan.

On 1-5, 7 and 8-65 Bureau representatives met with CIA representatives principally headed by Mr. James Angleton and Mr. David Murphy who have been in charge of the CIA staff studying the bona fides of Yuri Nosenko.

It will be noted that Yuri Nosenko, who claims to be an official of the Second Chief Directorate of the Soviet Committee of State Security (KGB) first made an approach to [redacted] in Geneva, Switzerland, in 1962. After furnishing a quantity of information [redacted] he returned to the Soviet Union and contact was next made with Nosenko in January, 1964, in Geneva, Switzerland, when he arrived there as part of an official Soviet delegation. Shortly after this, Nosenko expressed a desire to openly defect and this was done with considerable world-wide publicity, including a confrontation of Nosenko by Soviet officials in Washington, D. C.

From the very inception, CIA expressed a doubt concerning the bona fides of Nosenko as a defector. Meetings were held with CIA in April, 1964, and since then, [redacted] and has furnished the Bureau with voluminous material questioning not only the bona fides of Nosenko.

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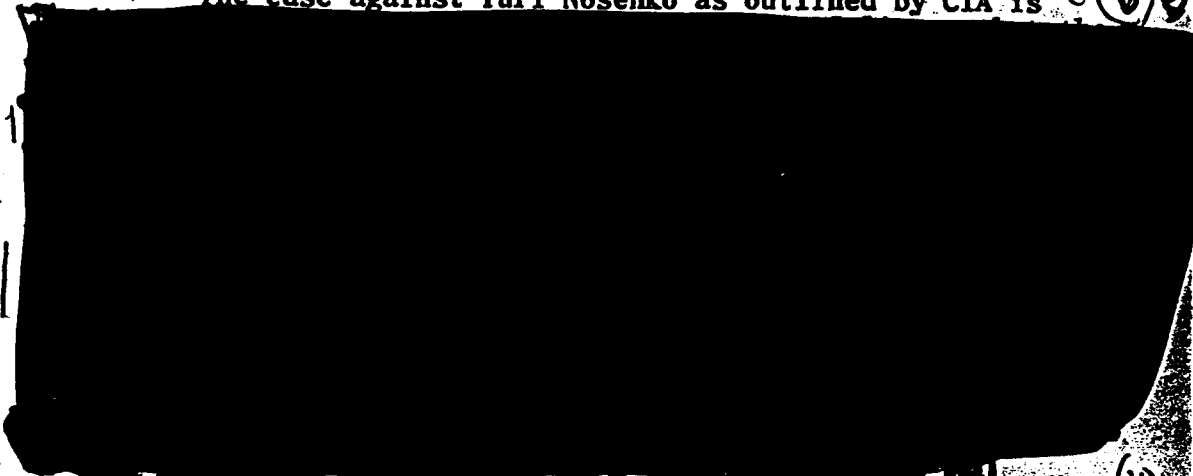

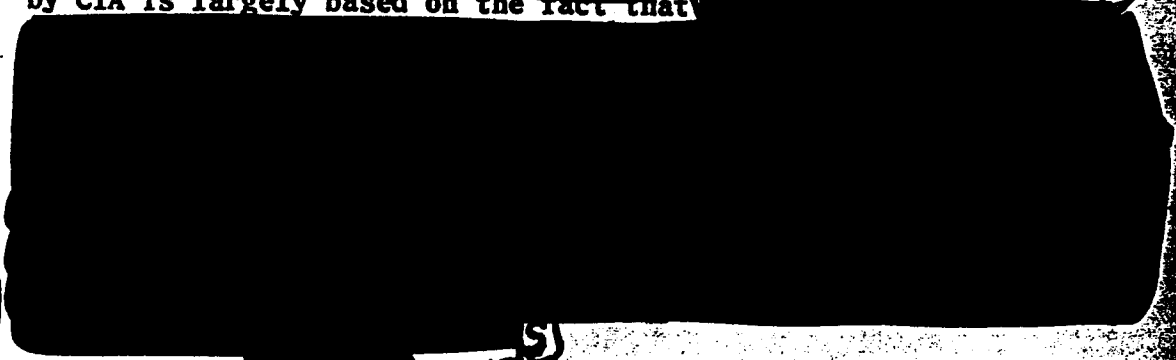

At the meetings with CIA and pursuant to Director's authority as reflected in memorandum of 1-6-65, we detailed to selective representatives



At the conclusion of the meetings, it was agreed that CIA would take the additional information furnished them of which they were not aware and study it in the light of their over-all conclusions concerning [redacted] on having done this, CIA now leans toward the position that Nosenko is an independent case.

ACTION:

There is attached a letter to CIA referring to the discussions with their representatives and outlining that this Bureau agrees that Yuri Nosenko is not all that he claims and that we have no objection to their Agency proceeding in a hostile interrogation of Nosenko at this time.

On January 28, 1947, and June 2, 1948, a confidential British source furnished to this Bureau a photograph of [redacted] and a resume concerning 19 individuals who were believed to be implicated in the murder of Ignace Reiss. In July, 1948, the photograph of Isurin was displayed to [redacted] who stated they thought the photograph closely resembled one of the sons of [redacted]

In July, 1948, the photograph of [redacted] was also displayed to [redacted] Ignace Reiss. She immediately recognized it as that of [redacted] whom she stated was the brother-in-law of [redacted]. [redacted] further stated that [redacted] was an agent of the GPU (a predecessor of the Committee of State Security - KGB) and had worked for Reiss as an illegal agent around 1934 to 1935. She said she had last known [redacted] in Paris from 1934 until 1937 in which year he and his wife had left Paris with [redacted] and his wife en route to Moscow, USSR.

[redacted] stated she did not believe [redacted] had anything to do with the murder of Ignace Reiss inasmuch as he was away at the time.

The above results of interviews were furnished to the aforementioned confidential British source.

The above resume is brought to your attention inasmuch as photograph number one displayed to Sanny is believed to be identical with the photograph of [redacted] furnished this Bureau in 1948. From the content of the aforementioned confidential British source's communication, it is believed the photograph of [redacted] was taken in 1937.

You are requested to comment on the above and furnish clarification of the identification of photograph number one as that of a son of [redacted]

Above info concerning the identification of both photos as one is being furnished CIA in order to determine how they came to the conclusion that photograph number one which was exhibited to Sammy (Nosenko) [redacted] Additionally, furnishing this info to CIA may result in determination that [redacted] posed as [redacted] in Europe during the 30's. We have obtained from several sources that [redacted] did serve in an illegal capacity years ago. (S)

Identification of foreign source was pinpointed as British in order that CIA may not misinterpret that the receipt of the info re Reiss and [redacted] came from French. It may be recalled that Reiss operation and his subsequent murder were carried out in France. (S)

During a conference held between CIA and Bureau representatives on 1/5, 7, and 8/65 concerning the bona fides of subject and other Soviet defectors throughout the world including defectors-in-place operated by the Bureau, CIA was told we would furnish to their representatives a compilation of all information obtained from our defector-in-place [redacted] concerning Sammy. The New York Office compiled the list of information and forwarded two copies to the Bureau. One copy was furnished to CIA via liaison. (S) (U) b7D PER FBI

On 1/26/65 SAC Joseph Schmit, New York Office, was telephonically advised that the aforementioned compilation was classified "Secret" by the Bureau prior to being forwarded to CIA. SAC Schmit was told to so declassify the New York copies. (S) (U)

SAC Schmit was also advised to add to their New York copies the New York letterhead [redacted]

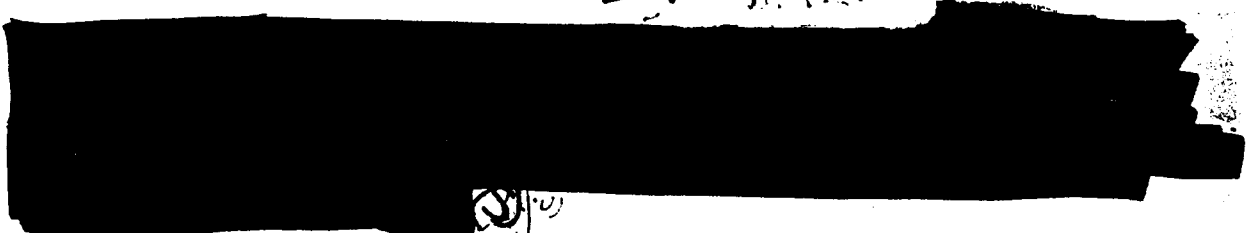

In order to adequately illustrate circumstances under which the informant has furnished information concerning YURI NOSENKO during a number of interviews commencing in February, 1964, it is felt that it is desirable to describe the procedure followed during each interview with him. This procedure evolved during the initial interviews with informant, and is now consistently followed by him and by interviewing personnel (S)(U)

Interviews with the informant generally range from three hours to five hours in length. Most of the interviews are nearer four hours than either of the extremes mentioned. For our purposes here, each interview can be appropriately divided into three categories or phases. (S)(U)

Phase One: During the initial portion of our interview, informant is encouraged to furnish all current Soviet intelligence information which has come into his possession since the last previous interview. This would include intelligence operations of the KGB NY Residency, the KGB Residency in Washington, D.C., and other KGB operations of which he might have knowledge, that have taken place throughout the world. During this phase, informant would also furnish the names of Soviets whom he is able to identify as employees of either the KGB or the GRU, and whom he had not previously identified in the past. Informant is expected to furnish information concerning any meetings of KGB personnel in NY or elsewhere which have come to his attention. Also, during this phase, informant is expected to furnish information concerning his personal efforts in behalf of KGB, his association with employees of KGB, with GRU employees, and other members of the Soviet colony. During this phase of the interview, informant usually comments on new arrivals in the United States of whom he has knowledge whether they be intelligence personnel or "diplomats." (S)(U)

In furnishing information such as that set out above, and in other fields, informant is not interrupted except for the purpose of elaborating on a given point. Every opportunity is afforded him to furnish all such information he has in his possession. (S)(u)

In this connection, it is noted that only rarely does the informant have any kind of notes. Occasionally, he will have recorded a name or a pertinent address, telephone, or other number in his possession. (S)(u)

Phase Two: After informant has exhausted all current information in his possession, it is the policy of interviewing personnel to begin to ask him pertinent questions regarding information he has furnished in the past which requires clarification or elaboration. This allows interviewing personnel to get the advantage of any additional information concerning matters he has talked about in the past, and which may have come to his attention since such matters were last discussed with him. This phase of each interview usually takes up a considerable portion of the interview time available during any given interview, since informant is continuously learning additional details regarding matters he has talked about and furnished information on in the past. (S)(u)

Phase Three: This portion of the interview is utilized by informant and interviewing personnel for the purpose of displaying to informant photographs of Soviets who have recently arrived in the US or at other duty stations abroad. Also, during this period, specific requests from Bureau case agents are taken up with him, as are matters of interest to other government agencies. (S)(u)

Time is also devoted during this phase to other matters requiring attention. (S)(U)

It is, of course, the prerogative of interviewing agents to interrupt informant at any time during any of the above phases to discuss matters which informant has touched on while relating information. Throughout each interview extreme caution is exercised to avoid giving informant any information of value. For this reason, it is the policy of interviewing personnel to wait until such time as the informant mentions a certain individual or topic in which we are interested, and then follow this point until all information in informant's possession is exhausted. (S)(U)

The above comments are not intended to be a completely detailed statement of the manner in which informant is interviewed, nor should it be considered as such. There are some variations at times as necessity dictates. The purpose of the comments is to clarify some of the conditions and circumstances under which informant has furnished information on NOSENKO, and to aid in making observations set out hereafter in this communication more clear to the reader. (S)(U)

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OBSERVATIONS

Information regarding NOSENKO, as furnished by the informant on 2/12/64, was brought forth during the initial phase of the interview at a time when he was relating his knowledge of recent developments. This was just subsequent to the publicized defection of NOSENKO in the US press. Never before had informant mentioned the name of NOSENKO or anything remotely connected with him. (S)(u)

In regard to that information from [REDACTED] about NOSENKO, it is noted that [REDACTED] furnished informant with news concerning other developments in the Soviet intelligence field, not related to NOSENKO in any way. No special emphasis was put on the NOSENKO item by informant. (S)(u)
