1. Reference is made to your memoranda dated 24 February 1965 and 26 February 1965, Subject: [REDACTED] Espionage - Russia.

2. According to Pravda, "Swan Lake" was staged at the Bolshoi Theatre on both 3 November and 25 November 1959. On 16 October 1959, again according to Pravda, "Alladin's Magic Lamp" and "Under the Rustle of your Eyelashes" were performed at the Central Puppet Theatre.

3. According to available maps and street directories of Moscow, there is no street named Bolshoi Tajinsky. The closest name to this are the streets around Taganskaya Ploshchad: Taganskaya ulitsa, Taganskiy Verkhniy tupik, Taganskiy Nizhnyy tupik, and Taganskiy prospekt. There are many apartment houses in this general area. The nearest railroad station is the Kurskiy Vokzal, about one mile away, but it is possible that the subway station on Taganskaya Ploshchad is the "railroad depot" to which [REDACTED]

4. The train that runs between Moscow and Leningrad is known as the "Red Arrow" rather than the "Red Star Express." However, there is a train that makes the run from East Berlin to Warsaw to Leningrad and on to Moscow which is called "The Blue Arrow Express".

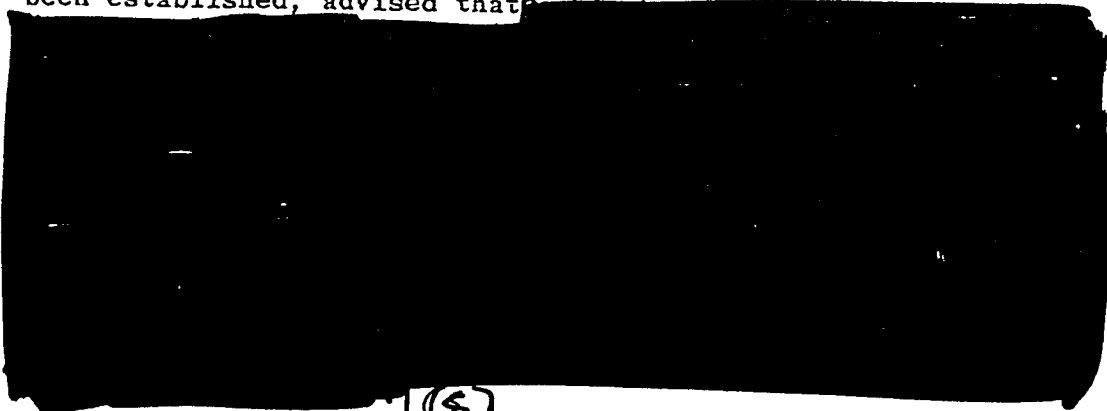

YURI I. NOSENKO (u)

On March 26, 1965, the Liaison Agent met with James Hunt and David Murphy, Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), in order to obtain a clarification of Nosenko's current status bearing in mind that this situation does have an effect on various Bureau cases. The Agent pointed out that the Bureau periodically has been encountering the following types of problems:

- (1) Will CIA approve dissemination of Nosenko information by the Bureau to interested agencies?
- (2) If dissemination is approved, can Nosenko be identified?
- (3) If identified, how should he be characterized as a source?
- (4) When we have occasion to interview an individual who has allegedly been recruited or has been a target of recruitment (all on the basis of Nosenko information), can we inform the person being interviewed that we have received certain information from a former Soviet intelligence officer, presently a defector to the west, who, at one time, held a high position in Soviet Intelligence Headquarters in Moscow?

Both Hunt and Murphy indicated that CIA is still very much involved in their efforts to resolve the bona fides of the subject. They obviously were reluctant to go into any detail but it was quite clear that Nosenko has not been "broken." Nosenko has allegedly admitted that he has been lying and he has failed to explain discrepancies and gaps in his stories. Nevertheless, CIA does not appear to have proved that the questionable items arise because Nosenko is a plant.

apologized for his statement on the latter date that
he felt the FBI had not provided him protection when
he was arrested by the Soviets, stating that he now
realizes the FBI is not in a position to perform such
functions outside the US. He said he was concerned
that the FBI would desire to interview him at this time
concerning an incident which occurred almost 2 years ago,
and consequently "over reacted" to confrontation with
Bureau agents. Subject's brother was not present during
some portions of the interview due to business telephone
calls and as a result a more favorable atmosphere existed
to conduct an uninterrupted interview. It was apparent
on both 4/8 and 4/9/65 that [redacted] exerts a
dominating influence on the subject. (S)(u)

On April 8 and April 9, 1965, [REDACTED] was interviewed by Special Agents (SAs) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and he furnished the following information regarding his arrest and detention by Soviet police in July, 1963, while he was in the Soviet Union covering the Film Festival as a free-lance photographer: (S)(u)

[REDACTED] stated that since approximately 1950 he has made his living as a free-lance photographer and journalist, traveling extensively throughout Europe and South America. He related that he also does publicity type photography and as a result has made numerous contacts in the international society. set. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] said that he was previously in the Soviet Union to attend film festivals in 1956, 1959 and 1961. In the latter year, he advised that he had trouble with Soviet authorities for his possession of undeclared rubles which were found on his person after the police searched his hotel room in Moscow. [REDACTED] stated that he received only a reprimand on this occasion and confiscation of the rubles. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] advised that his last trip in the Soviet Union began on July 5, 1963 when he left East Berlin by rail, passing through Warsaw, and entering the Soviet Union at Brest. He claimed that the customs inspection (S)(u)

at Brest was cursory and his possession of Soviet, Polish and East German currency in excess of the permissible amount was not discovered. [REDACTED] said he realized that taking the currency into the Soviet Union was illegal. [REDACTED] continued on to Moscow, arriving on about July 7. There he was met by an Intourist representative named [REDACTED] whose last name he does not recall. [REDACTED] advised him that he could not stay at the Hotel Moskva as [REDACTED] had hoped but instead was to take a room at the Hotel Ostancko. [REDACTED] said he protested vigorously as the center of the festival activity would be at the Moskva. He was finally permitted to stay at the Hotel Moskva for the first night so that he could make contact with some of the other festival participants. He was moved the following day to the Ostancko. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] stated that after this inauspicious beginning his situation grew steadily worse; his isolation from the Moskva prevented him from mingling with the festival people resulting in less photography opportunities, and he discovered the apparent loss of theft of 1000 rubles in 10 ruble notes, part of his smuggled hoard. [REDACTED] went to the American Embassy on July 13 or 14 after discovering his loss to seek advice on whether he should report to the police. (S)(u)

One of the First or Second Secretaries told him that if he had not reported possession of the rubles on his entry into the country he was only asking for unnecessary complications by reporting their disappearance, particularly since he had already suffered from the loss of the money. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] said he was extremely depressed with the situation and decided to leave for West Germany or France even though his visa was good only until July 24 or 25. He, therefore, departed Moscow on about July 14 or 15 by rail, but left the train in Minsk after reflecting on his action. He explained that as his livelihood depends on the good will of the people he sees at the various film festivals he realized that his abrupt departure from Moscow might offend his friends. return to Moscow he tried to get back his room at the Ostanko but was told there were none available. The same Intourist representative then located him and expressed Intourist's displeasure with [REDACTED] failure to follow the itinerary originally agreed upon. [REDACTED] said he then left Moscow again, probably about July 16 or 17, at the insistence of Intourist. (§) (u)

On his arrival at Brest, [REDACTED] advised he was immediately singled out at customs and with all his baggage was taken into a separate room. He was subjected to a complete physical search and his belongings gone over with extreme thoroughness as if the customs officials were looking for something specific. During the examination of his clothing, one of the searchers, to [REDACTED] complete astonishment, found the missing 1000 rubles in the inside pocket of a jacket. He explained that he has his inside pockets tailored to an extra depth because he carries so many long and bulky papers in connection with his occupation. [REDACTED] said he can only surmise that he did not look through his jacket carefully enough when he first found the rubles to be missing. The customs officials then came up with the remainder of his undeclared currency, amounting to 200 United States dollars and a lesser amount in Polish zlotys and East German marks. He was then informed that he was under arrest and was placed in a detention cell. (§) (u)

At this point, [REDACTED] stated that he desired to explain why he took the risk of taking undeclared currency into a country with the strict currency controls of the Soviet Union. He said that he lives a precarious financial life, dependent as he is upon the whims of prominent society and film figures. Consequently he employs any means he can to add to his income. One means is juggling the currency exchange rates in the various (§) (u)

countries through which he travels which requires him to have a certain amount of free capital such as he took into the Soviet Union. Another means is exchanging the first class tickets he sometimes receives free for doing publicity for lower class accommodations and pocketing the difference. (S) (u)

[REDACTED] then continued with the details of his arrest. He said he was detained in Brest for approximately 3 days and then transported to Lefortovskiy Prison in Moscow on about July 20 or 21. [REDACTED] interrogation was exhaustive and penetrating with an obvious effort being made to obtain his confession as a United States "spy". He said no physical force or overt threats were employed and he received adequate food and was generally well treated. He was, however, kept in solitary confinement and did not see or talk with any other prisoner during his confinement. He said that after his release he learned that another American, [REDACTED] who was reportedly leading a tour of the Soviet Union, was arrested at about the same time for "playing with boys". [REDACTED] advised that he had never heard of [REDACTED] then nor has he met him since. [REDACTED] said that during his interrogation an initial emphasis was placed on his possession of the money found on him. To account for the rubles [REDACTED] concocted a story that he received them from a Secretary at the American Embassy who was acting as the intermediary for an individual in the United States who owed [REDACTED] the equivalent in dollars. At Lefortovskiy he was shown photographs of a large number, perhaps 40 or 50, of individuals named as Embassy personnel by his interrogator. He pointed out a photograph of the individual at the Embassy he had dealt with as the person who gave him the rubles. He told the Soviets he was unable to identify (S) (u)

any of the others either by name or position. The Soviets refusing to believe his story faced him with his previous difficulty in 1961 for having possession of undeclared currency. [REDACTED] said that he was also shown photographs of many individuals in the film industry and was asked to identify them and their particular activity or association with films. He said he complied to the best of his ability since neither then nor since has he had knowledge that any of these people are other than legitimately engaged in their profession. (S)(u)

His chief interrogator at one time during the questioning made the comment that if he was not working for the FBI he should be because of his "intelligence and foreign language ability". [REDACTED] said that his interrogation was generally conducted in English, though sometimes in Russian, one of nine languages in which he considers himself fluent. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] related that about a week or ten days before his release on August 29, 1963, he was transferred to Lubyanka Prison in Moscow. No explanation was offered for this move but his periods of interrogation slackened, and the general attitude of his jailors toward him improved markedly. [REDACTED] said he believes this was due to the repeated efforts of his father who spent in excess of \$2,000 in telephone and cable charges to the American Embassy in an effort to locate him. [REDACTED] said he was never permitted to contact the Embassy despite his protests that this was his right. In this regard, [REDACTED] stated that he does not feel he was adequately represented by the Embassy since he was imprisoned (S)(u)

for six weeks and he believes that his release was due solely to the Soviets becoming convinced that he was not an intelligence agent. [REDACTED] further advised he learned from his brother, [REDACTED] that until columnist, Drew Pearson, a personal friend of his brother's who was in Moscow at the time, suggested that he might be in jail, no active investigation to confirm this fact had been conducted. (S)(u)

On his release [REDACTED] stated he was escorted to the airport and placed on a plane for East Berlin from where he crossed to West Berlin. He was required to pay his passage of approximately \$100. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] declared that he was unable to recall the names of his interrogators, laying this loss of memory to a mental block caused by the unpleasantness of the incident. He did furnish the phonetic name of an interpreter who sat in on some of the questioning as [REDACTED]. He stated that this same mental block plus his solitary confinement is responsible for his inability to be more specific as to dates. (S)(u) b7c

[REDACTED] advised that he made his travel arrangements for the Soviet Union through [REDACTED], New York City, a travel agency operated by [REDACTED] whom he has known for a number of years. He related that he also used this agency for his previous trips to the Soviet Union in 1956, 1959 and 1961. (S)(u)

[REDACTED] advised that although another film festival is scheduled to be held in Moscow in 1965 he does not plan to attend since he feels the Soviets would either refuse him a visa or keep him under constant surveillance while in the country. He stated that he will return to Europe or South America in the very near future to pursue his photographic and publicity work. (S)(u)

When incorporating information furnished by [redacted] into communication suitable for dissemination outside the Bureau, Bureau authority is not necessary when the information can be paraphrased so that the identity of the informant is not jeopardized. When certain specific information is of such a nature as to prohibit dissemination, the Bureau should be advised of the basis for non-dissemination. (S)

Certain information furnished by [redacted] will be of such a nature as to necessitate a classification above "~~Confidential~~", since the disclosure of this information to unauthorized persons could have a detrimental affect upon international relations and the national defense. When disseminating information received from [redacted] no reference should be made to the time (date, month or year) the information was received. This should be set forth administratively. (S)(u)

He added, however, that in any case where there is a Soviet defector, he feels quite sure that some kind of a report would necessarily have to be prepared to assess the potential damage that that defector might be able to inflict.
