You are requested to advise if Sammy should continue to be described as a source whose bona fides has not been established. You are also requested to advise if your Agency has any objection to this Bureau describing Sammy as a Soviet defector whose bona fides has not been established. (S)(u)

In addition to the above, you are also requested to advise if this Bureau can automatically disseminate to all U.S. Government agencies the results of investigations that originated with Sammy and wherein his identity is concealed. (S)(u)

You are additionally requested to advise if this Bureau can automatically disseminate to interested foreign security agencies information that originated with Sammy, provided his identity is concealed and the above descriptive data concerning his bona fides is attached. (S)(u)

In addition, you are requested to advise, if in instances deemed necessary by this Bureau, the identity of Sammy as the source can be automatically furnished to other U.S. Government agencies or interested foreign security agencies. (S)(u)

In the course of conducting many investigations based upon allegations furnished by Sammy this Bureau has found it of enormous value to be in a position to confront a subject or interviewee with the fact that allegations have been received from a Soviet defector concerning him or an associate. (S)(u)

You are requested to advise if this Bureau can automatically confront a subject or interviewee with one or more of the following statements: (S)(u)

c. Yuri Nosenko, a Soviet defector who for years served as a Soviet intelligence officer, furnished U.S. authorities information, et cetera. (4)

NOTE:

Classified "~~Confidential~~" inasmuch as it relates to Sammy (Yuri Nosenko), Soviet defector whose bona fides has not been established, the unauthorized disclosure of which could be prejudicial to the national interest. (S)(u)

As the above letter indicates, the Bureau only has permission at the present time of automatically disseminating Sammy information to the Department of State. It is thus a burden to constantly ask CIA's permission to disseminate to other Government agencies results of investigations which originated with Sammy. In all known instances CIA has agreed to the dissemination. The procedure, however, has been cumbersome, particularly in the light that undoubtedly all Government agencies now have received either from the Bureau or CIA information that originated with Sammy. This letter to CIA attempts to clarify the issue of dissemination to other Government agencies. Additionally, this problem can arise in regard to dissemination of information to foreign agencies. The Bureau, therefore, seeks clarification on this issue. (S)(u)

While it is realized that CIA apparently still remains convinced that Sammy is a plant, the Bureau seeks clarification of how he should be described. The Bureau also desires freedom to use the fact that allegations have been received from a source or Soviet defector in conducting interviews or investigations and we, therefore, desire to clarify this issue with CIA. In regard to subject's first trip to Berlin, Germany, subsequent to his discharge from the United States Army on March 7, 1956, this Bureau has not been able thus far to establish the date of his departure. However, the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), San Francisco, California, indicate that subject returned to the United States at Los Angeles from Copenhagen, Denmark, on January 14, 1957.

Investigation has also determined that subject apparently never spent more than two or three months outside the United States on any of his trips. Therefore, if subject's recitation of events is correct in that he met [redacted] on his first trip to Berlin, Germany, he probably met him in October - December, 1956 or early January, 1957.

In regard to subject's second trip to Europe the aforementioned San Francisco INS records indicate subject departed Los Angeles, California, for Copenhagen, Denmark, on October 8, 1957, and returned to Los Angeles, California, on December 6, 1957 from Copenhagen, Denmark. Travel both ways was by the Scandinavian Air-Lines System.

In connection with subject's third trip to Berlin, Germany, in late 1959, this Bureau has not, thus far, been able to establish the date of his departure. Investigation has determined, however, that he was in San Francisco, California, on October 12, 1959, and was preparing for imminent departure for Europe. (S)(u)

Additionally, according to [redacted] German acquaintance of subject who was interviewed by United States Army personnel in Berlin, Germany, on March 30, 1965, subject, when he last visited Berlin, stayed in that city for approximately one month during which he made a three-day trip to Paris, France. According to [redacted] subject returned to the United States by Pan American Airlines. (S)(u)

Investigation has determined that subject registered at the Terminus Hotel, Orleans, France, on December 7, 1959, where he apparently stayed for several days. (S)(u)

IMS records New York indicate that subject departed Frankfurt, Germany, on December 27, 1959, as a passenger aboard a Pan American airplane and arrived in New York on the same date. (S)(u)

In view of the above dates, this Bureau believes the following chronology of travel is correct in connection with subject's 1959 trip. (S)(u)

Subject departed the United States in October, 1959, traveled to Berlin, Germany, and thence to Moscow, USSR. After completion of his espionage training he returned to Berlin, Germany, following which he traveled to Orleans, France, arriving there on approximately December 7, 1959. After meeting with [redacted] in Orleans, France, for the purpose of passing to him new espionage instructions, he returned to Germany. He departed Frankfurt, Germany, for the United States on December 27, 1959. (S)(u)

SUBJECT: NOSENKO - [redacted] (u)

1. In meetings held between representatives of the FBI and CIA on 5 and 7 January 1965, CIA put forth detailed arguments to substantiate our claim that NOSENKO is not a bona-fide defector but rather a KGB-dispatched provocation and deception agent. As a result of these meetings, the FBI agreed with the conclusion that NOSENKO is not who he claims to be and affirmed that the possibility that he is a deliberate provocation agent cannot be excluded.

It is noted that [redacted] visited the USSR in 1953 as a member of a student tour group and was compromised by Soviet Intelligence through homosexual activities. He returned to the United States and subsequently reported his recruitment to this office. An exchange of correspondence with a Soviet designated dead drop was initiated but the correspondence was not continued by the Soviets. Correspondence was initiated with a [redacted] a Soviet citizen [redacted] during his trip to the USSR, and [redacted] subsequently continued to correspond with [redacted] on an intermittent basis. The possibility exists that [redacted] correspondence is controlled by the SIS. (S)(u)

By letter dated 6/25/64, WFO advised that NOSENKO was then unavailable for interview pending CIA's decision regarding his bona fides. (S)(u)

On 9/30/64, [redacted] advised that he had received another letter from [redacted] in the USSR on 9/29/64. The letter was ostensibly an innocuous letter of a personal nature and [redacted] stated that he doubted if he would reply to the letter. He advised that nothing had occurred which would indicate any effort by Soviet Intelligence to establish contact with him. (S)(u)

On 2/9/65, [redacted] stated that he did not reply to the aforementioned letter and had received no subsequent correspondence from [redacted]. He said that there was no indication that the Soviets had attempted to locate or contact him. He continues to be employed as a stock broker for a San Francisco brokerage firm. (S)(u)


