Your communication dated May 14, 1965, captioned as above, concerning [REDACTED] presented certain interesting conclusions: (S)(u)

Per CIA

You stated that intensive interrogation of [REDACTED] (S) [REDACTED] (S) indicated that these interrogations of [REDACTED] raised doubts concerning the bona fides of our source, referred to by you as [REDACTED] (S)

Our source has never claimed that he knew [REDACTED] and has merely reported information which he received from persons who claimed to know [REDACTED] and from the checks of his FBI residency. The various pieces of information relayed by [REDACTED] have not supported [REDACTED]'s various stories in their entirety. You have pointed out that [REDACTED] did not appear to know or denied knowing one of the individuals [REDACTED] source had reported [REDACTED] was supposed to know. That [REDACTED] has reported in [REDACTED]. It cannot be concluded, on the basis of the information provided regarding [REDACTED], that [REDACTED] is a willing participant in a disinformation operation. (S)(u)

You have pointed out that certain statements by [REDACTED] during his recent interrogation by your Agency suggested strongly that he is aware that you would have the capability of independently confirming his information through sources "in the [REDACTED] or out of the [REDACTED]." [REDACTED] is quoted as saying, (S)(u)

On June 23, 1964, ^{b7c} Sullivan stated, "First of all, Nosenko is the man whom I met in KGB. Second, Nosenko—the Nosenko who is in your country now—is that man. Nosenko, in fact, is the son of the ex-Soviet Minister, Nosenko, who died a few years ago. Nosenko is really a professional KGB officer; he is really the officer who worked at one time in the First (that means, American) Department of the Second Chief Directorate, more precisely in the First Section which is responsible for the activity against the American Embassy in Moscow. Also, Nosenko is really the officer who worked at one time in the Tourist Department of the Second Chief Directorate." (u) b7c

Sullivan also said, "As I told you at the beginning, he certainly tells the truth when he says that he worked in KGB for a long period, that he worked in the American Department against the American Embassy. That is the truth. That he worked in the Tourist Department is also correct. But he lies, he deceives, on very important points." (u) b7c

Sullivan is testifying from his own personal knowledge. His words are not hearsay and are particularly interesting in the light of your recent conclusion that Nosenko never served at all in the First (American) Department of the KGB's Second Chief Directorate." 5

This Bureau would be interested in receiving any further information which you may develop regarding Nosenko. We are also interested in your recommendations for action with regard to Nosenko. (u)

INTERNAL SECURITY - RUSSIA

By memorandum of 5/14/65, Central Intelligence Agency advised that further intensive interrogation of Soviet defector, Yuri Nosenko, had confirmed "beyond reasonable doubt" that Nosenko had never served at all in the First (American) Department of the Second Chief Directorate of the Committee for State Security (KGB) or as a staff officer in other claimed KGB assignments. Central Intelligence Agency states these circumstances not only establish that Nosenko is a Soviet "plant," but also raise strong doubts as to the bona fides of our KGB defector-in-place, [redacted] (S)(U)

[redacted] has never claimed to know Nosenko. He has been furnishing Bureau information on KGB activities since 8/22/62. After Nosenko's defection was publicized in 2/64, [redacted] furnished information regarding Nosenko's background, which he had received from Soviets who claimed to know Nosenko, as well as what purported to be the official record. According to Central Intelligence Agency, Nosenko has denied portions of information furnished by [redacted] regarding persons Nosenko allegedly knew. (S)(U)

Despite Central Intelligence Agency's current conclusion that Nosenko never served in the First Department of the Second Chief Directorate, the Soviet defector, Anatoliy Golitsyn, has stated positively he knows Nosenko and knows that he served in the First Department as well as in the Tourist Department of the Second Chief Directorate of the KGB. (S)(U)

ACTION:

Attached is a letter to Central Intelligence Agency pointing out that our source, [redacted] has never claimed to have known Nosenko and, information which he obtained and passed on concerning Nosenko, has not supported Nosenko in all details and it cannot be concluded that, on this basis, he is a witting participant in a disinformation operation. It is pointed out to Central Intelligence Agency that, while they state they have confirmed Nosenko never served at all in the First Department of the KGB, Second Chief Directorate, their source, the defector Anatoliy Golitsyn, has stated that Nosenko did

DETAILS:

Under date of 5/14/65 Central Intelligence Agency furnished memorandum, [REDACTED] CSCI- [REDACTED]. This memorandum pointed out that Central Intelligence Agency had conducted further intensive interrogation of the Soviet defector, Yuri Nosenko, which has confirmed "beyond reasonable doubt" that Nosenko never served at all in the First (American) Department of the KGB Second Chief Directorate or as a staff officer in his other claimed KGB assignments. Central Intelligence Agency states that these circumstances not only establish that Nosenko is a Soviet "plant," but also raised strong doubts as to the bona fides of [REDACTED] who is referred to as [REDACTED] by Central Intelligence Agency. [REDACTED] is a KGB defector-in-place who has been furnishing the Bureau information regarding KGB activities since 5/22/62. (S)(u) b2 b7D

Central Intelligence Agency Allegations:] (S)(u) b2 b7D

Central Intelligence Agency states that Nosenko never held the KGB positions he claimed and, since [REDACTED] has "affirmed" that Nosenko was in these positions, it is difficult for Central Intelligence Agency to construe [REDACTED] reporting as "innocent" passage of information. (S)(u) b2 b7D

Facts: [REDACTED] has never claimed to know Nosenko. All information which he has furnished, he has attributed to remarks of other Soviets who did claim to know him [REDACTED]

(S) Information furnished by [REDACTED] as coming from these sources was not detailed as to the precise periods that Nosenko held various positions in the KGB. The information was to the effect that Nosenko had served in the Second Directorate of the KGB during his entire KGB career. [REDACTED] was quoted as saying that Nosenko had at one time worked against personnel of the United States Embassy, later was assigned to work against journalists, and, during his last years with the KGB, worked against American and European tourists in Moscow.

[REDACTED] This last position was that of Deputy to the Chief of the Tourist Department of the KGB, Second Directorate. On the other hand, [REDACTED] has reported that KGB personnel who knew Nosenko indicated that he was a Deputy to a chief of a branch within [REDACTED] (S)(u) b2 b7D

a department of the Second Directorate, and since the Second Directorate had approximately 20 departments, Nosenko would not have appeared to be an individual in a high supervisory position (S)(u)

On the other hand, Central Intelligence Agency's KGB defector, Anatoliy Golitzyn, who defected from the KGB in Helsinki, Finland, in 12/61, states that he knows the defector, Nosenko, and knows that he worked in the American Department of the KGB, Second Chief Directorate, against the American Embassy. Golitzyn also insists that Nosenko worked in the Tourist Department of the Second Directorate. (S)(u)

Observation: It would appear that Central Intelligence Agency's source, Golitzyn, gives a stronger support for Nosenko's story because of personal knowledge than does [REDACTED] despite the fact that Central Intelligence Agency now says Nosenko never served in the departments that Golitzyn says he personally knows he served in. Central Intelligence Agency states that [REDACTED] has reported Nosenko was well known to various KGB personnel. In most cases, Nosenko has either denied or failed to support his friendship with these individuals as reported by [REDACTED]. (S)(u)

Observations: It does not appear unusual for the personal antecedents of an individual, who had worked from ten to fourteen years in the KGB in Moscow, to be known to a very large number of KGB officers. Among those who knew him, certain aspects of his background would be known. (S)(u)

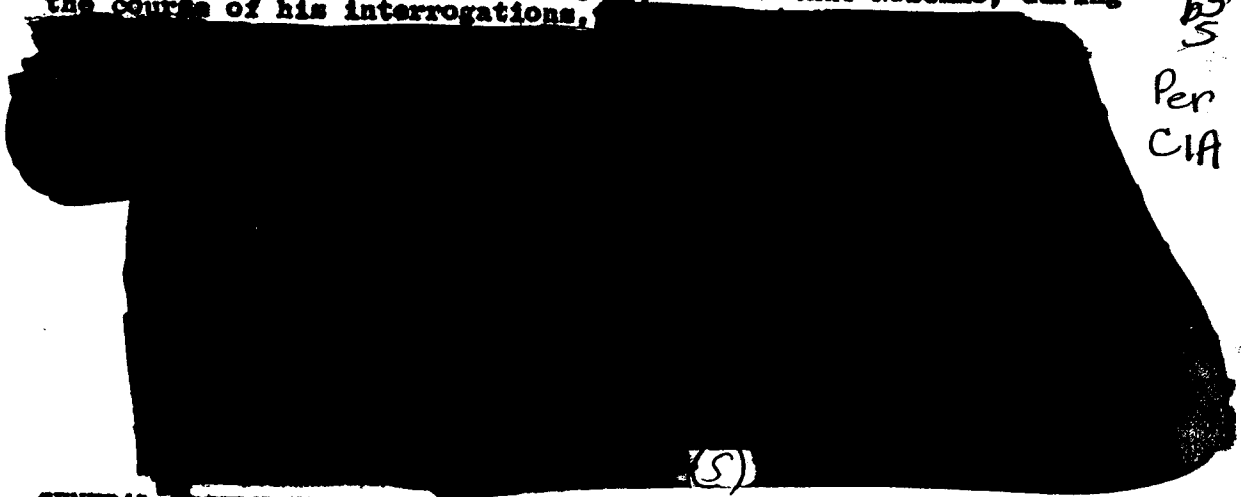

Observation: It would appear that Golitzyn has gone far behind affirming that "Yes, there was a Nosenko." (S)(u)

Central Intelligence Agency states that Nosenko, during the course of his interrogations,

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS:

Central Intelligence Agency's analysis establishes without question that Nosenko has told numerous conflicting stories, some improbable and some obviously false. In various details, Nosenko is at variance with information furnished by [REDACTED] particularly with regard to individuals he is supposed to have known. (S)(u)

It cannot be concluded, on the basis of these discrepancies, that [REDACTED] is a witting channel for disinformation. This is not to say that the KGB has attempted to lay down a "line" with regard to Nosenko. The removal from the United States of persons alleged to know Nosenko could have been part of a KGB plan to minimize the possibility of leaks of information regarding Nosenko which might have been at variance with the official "line." As an example, as of 2/10/64, [REDACTED] who knew Nosenko stated that he had been a deputy to a chief of a branch of a department in the Second Directorate. The KGB "line" laid down by [REDACTED] on 2/19/64 was that Nosenko's last assignment before his defection was Deputy to the Chief of the 7th Department (Tourist) of the Second Directorate. (S)(u)

Nevertheless, no individual quoted by [REDACTED] regarding Nosenko's background was as specific regarding essentials as was Anatoliy Golitsyn, who claimed to have known Nosenko and knew that he worked in the First Department as well as the Tourist Department of the Second Directorate (S)(u)

Central Intelligence Agency apparently does not let its left hand know what its right hand is doing because it now states that it has confirmed beyond reasonable doubt that Nosenko never served at all in the First Department of the Second Directorate or as a staff officer in his other claimed KGB assignments (S)(u)

Original information from Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in this matter forwarded to WFO by Bulet 2/12/64 indicates that data from Anatoly Golitsyn [redacted] furnished to Bureau under date of 2/12/64 and information from "Sunny" regarding [redacted] likewise furnished to Bureau under date of 2/12/64. Because of the similarity of [redacted] as well as the forwarding date in each case, WFO in its contacts with CIA should determine the precise date of data prior to 2/12/64 that Golitsyn furnished [redacted] and "Sunny" furnished to CIA [redacted] (S)

CONGRESSIONAL PUBLIC RELATIONS ACTION

PURPOSE

To submit a memorandum for signature by the Secretary of the Army forwarding to the Secretary of Defense for his signature a letter interim reply to the Subcommittee on Security, Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy, concerning access to and possible compromise of Restricted Data (RD) and Formerly Restricted Data (FRD) by Sergeant (E-5) [redacted] confessed espionage agents.

DISCUSSION

1. The Subcommittee on Security, Joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy by letter dated 11 June 1965, advised that SHAPE received 65 RD or FRD documents during 1962 and more than 600 individual RD or FRD documents or copies of documents during the period January through September 1963. The Subcommittee requested that a list of RD and FRD documents identified as having passed through the Armed Forces Courier Transfer Station, Orly Field, Paris, France, during [redacted] assignment to the station be made available to the Joint Congressional Committee, to include any of the SHAPE documents mentioned above, and information concerning [redacted] access to RD and FRD information while acting as agents of the Soviet Union. The Office of the Chief of Legislative Liaison, by memorandum dated 15 June 1965, requested that an action agency be designated to prepare a coordinated reply to [redacted] for signature by the Secretary of Defense, and a covering memorandum for the signature of the Secretary of the Army (TAB A).

2. A review of the US Army case file and Federal Bureau of Investigation report on [redacted] failed to reveal any access to RD or FRD information. [redacted] assigned to the Orly Courier Transfer Station. The FBI has reported that to date it has received no information indicating [redacted] had access to RD or FRD information. The Defense Intelligence Agency, which is responsible for the SHAPE portion of the damage assessment, has reported that their damage assessment report will not be completed until August or early September 1965. However, they will make every effort to obtain the list of RD and FRD documents desired by the Joint Committee in time to forward the list to this office for transmitting to the Joint Committee by 1 August 1965. The Army portion of the damage assessment is currently scheduled to be completed by early July. Should any RD or FRD documents be identified in the Army damage assessment report, their identity will be added to the list submitted to the Joint Committee.
