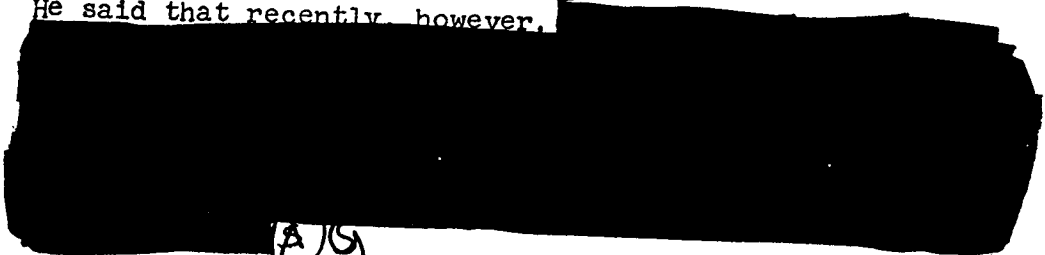

Informant said in response to a question, that according to [redacted] the envelopes were typed and sealed in Moscow and that the only thing remaining to be done to the letters in NY was to affix postage stamps to them. Informant said it was his opinion that the letters in question had arrived in the last regular mail from KGB Headquarters in Moscow, that mail containing diplomatic and KGB correspondence. Informant said he did not know the date that this mail might have arrived.

In answer to another question, informant said he did not know how many employees of "Line PR" might participate in the mailing of this letter. He said that [redacted] had told him that KGB had decided that no more than three letters would be placed in any one mailbox. He said that for this reason it seemed to him that perhaps those employees selected might travel to New Jersey, Nassau County, Connecticut, and other points in the NY metropolitan area in order to mail these letters. He said he could not conceive of how else this matter might be carried out. (Note: As the Bureau has been advised, informant stated during a subsequent interview that these letters might be mailed in large cities around Washington, D.C., but not in Washington itself.)

This opportunity was taken to thank the informant for the envelope and contents which he had furnished to SAC JOSEPH L. SCHMIT on Saturday, 11/20/65. He was told that we were deeply appreciative of this cooperation on his part. Informant said that he was very happy to do this for us, but that, of course, we must realize that it was necessary for him to steal this letter. He said he had not had an opportunity to look at it to determine the contents and nature of the material inside. He inquired as to what this letter was "all about." Informant was told that this letter contained material attacking President JOHNSON and Director HOOVER. Informant then asked if Mr. HOOVER had been advised of the nature of this material. He was told that Mr. HOOVER had been advised and was very grateful to the informant for having furnished us the initial information. Informant did not ask anything more, but said that he would be alert for any additional information he could get in this matter. He said that if he can find out in advance when the letters will be mailed, he will call us at the earliest possible moment.

Not Even Congress . . . .

Yuri Nosenko, high-ranking Soviet secret police official, defected and is now in the United States in the custody of the Central Intelligence Agency and the State Department. He is said to have given information about Soviet espionage agents inside the Central Intelligence Agency and the State Department, but he is being held incommunicado, and not even members of Congress and the Senate are allowed to talk with him. He has revealed that there are five Soviet spy rings operating throughout the western hemisphere including in their numbers certain American businessmen, newspapermen, scientists, as well as government officials. One of the spy rings, he alleges, operates in a very sensitive agency of the United States Government. Many of us are wondering why investigating committees of Congress have not been permitted to question Yuri Nosenko.

Enclosed for the Bureau are five copies of a letterhead memorandum setting forth results of interview with [redacted] in response to CIA's questions in their letter, dated 11/22/65. *(S) (u)*

[redacted] was cooperative during interview and the interviewing agents are of the opinion that she answered all questions to the best of her knowledge and recollection. *(S) (u)*

SAS [redacted] and [redacted] interviewed [redacted] on 9/19/61; and SAS [redacted] and [redacted] interviewed her on 12/14/65. *(S) (u)*

[redacted] is identical with Bufile 105-83005, NYfile 105-38711 and BSfile 105-5180. He presently resides at [redacted] Boston, Mass. He, as well as his visits to the Soviet Union and results of same, are well known to CIA. *(S) (u)*

In view of this, no lead is being set forth to interview [redacted]. *(S) (u)*

Reference is made to your memorandum dated November 22, 1965, your file CSCI [redacted] in which you requested representatives of this Bureau interview one [redacted]

The subject matter of your memorandum was predicated upon information furnished by this Bureau to your agency in October, 1961, concerning [redacted] in August of 1961. On September 1, 1961, representatives of this Bureau interviewed [redacted] with regard to the above contact, at which time she advised the following:

[redacted] stated that during August of 1961 she telephonically contacted [redacted] several times in regard to a personal matter. She advised that a young Russian girl, who was a dancer in a cultural exchange group presently appearing in the United States, had requested her to contact [redacted] and request him to send some medicine home to her mother in Russia. [redacted] stated she did contact [redacted] with this girl's request; however, [redacted] seemed indifferent to the request. [redacted] stated that in view of this she made arrangements with an American exchange student who was going to Russia to take this medicine to the girl's mother.

[redacted] during this interview, readily identified a photograph of [redacted] as a person she had seen on a few occasions at the airport when various Soviet cultural exchange groups would arrive in the United States.

When incorporating information furnished by [redacted] into communications suitable for dissemination outside the Bureau, Bureau authority is not necessary when the information can be paraphrased so that the identity of the informant is not jeopardized. When certain specific information is of such a nature as to prohibit dissemination, the Bureau should be advised of the basis for non-dissemination. (S)(u)

Certain information furnished by [redacted] will be of such a nature as to necessitate a classification above "Confidential", since the disclosure of this information to unauthorized persons could have a detrimental effect upon international relations and the national defense. In all other instances, a classification of "Confidential" will be adequate if the information relates to Soviet nationals and can be adequately paraphrased. (S)(u)

When disseminating information received from [redacted] no reference should be made to the time (date, month or year) the information was received. This should be set forth administratively. (S)(u)

Suitable paraphrasing of the information to be disseminated, plus concealment of the time of its receipt, will materially assist in concealing the identity of the source. (S)(u)

If the attached memorandum sets forth a Soviet's GRU code name, no further dissemination of that code name should be made. Such information is of no investigative value and its indiscriminate and unwarranted misuse could endanger the informant's sensitive position. (S)(u)

IN VIEW OF THE HIGHLY SENSITIVE POSITION OF [redacted] EXTREME CAUTION MUST BE EXERCISED IN HANDLING ANY INFORMATION CONCERNING HIS IDENTITY, AND NO ACTION TAKEN WHICH COULD COMPROMISE OR ENDANGER THE SECURITY OF THE INFORMANT OR REVEAL HIS IDENTITY. (S)(u)

I then asked the subject if he had heard anything about YURI NOSENKO. He said he had heard about NOSENKO from various persons in Moscow. He said he had never known NOSENKO personally. He said NOSENKO was an important boss in the KGB. He said he did not know what directorate or department NOSENKO had been in. Subject continued that when NOSENKO was a young man, he was in the GRU Military Academy and then sent to the Information Department of the GRU for a short time; in all, perhaps a year. He said that he had heard NOSENKO had been a very undisciplined person while in the GRU and "not very good". He was to have been discharged from the GRU; however, his father, who was a very influential person in the Ministry of Shipbuilding, was able to get NOSENKO transferred to the KGB. He said it was the opinion of the persons from whom he heard the information about NOSENKO that NOSENKO had given very, very good information to the US after his defection and that NOSENKO had had great access to KGB information which included all means of KGB coverage of people in Moscow, microphone systems in the embassies, etc. He said that he had heard that the US Embassy had found many of the microphones based upon NOSENKO information.
