In 1959 Oswald being in Moscow as a tourist applied for "Intourist" that he wanted to stay in Russia, he lived in the hotel Berlin (a former Saly).

This fact was reported to me, I was a deputy chief of section 7 department, a chief of section Totushkin was absent. When I checked what we had I found out that there was a questionnaire, a tour, checkings of him in archives of KGB and 1 chief directory and nothing more. A translator of "Intourist", who worked with Oswald was not an agent or operative contact. I had given an order to Kostuzinskaya (a senior case officer) quickly to visit "Intourist" to check a diary of this translator or to speak with her about Oswald. I also ordered an other officer to find out about Oswald through possibilities of 3 section (hotels, restaurants) of 7 department.

When I received some materials about Oswald (a translator reported that from her point of view Oswald was a little bit crazy) I reported to a chief of 7 department Dybas K.N., who reported this fact about Oswald to one of leaders of 2 chief directory. There was decided that "Intourist" would explain to Oswald that he had to return from Russia to USA and to apply in appropriate form in the Soviet embassy in the USA, because "Intourist" was not dealing with questions. It was done.

Next day the translator has come in the hotel, where lived Oswald and was waiting him in lobby of the hotel, as it was fixed. She waited him a pair of hours then checked his room. But there wasn't any answer. Then the door was opened they found Oswald in blood, he tried to commit suicide. He was taken in a hospital and wound. The doctors of this hospital also found him a little crazy. He was insisting on staying in Russia, telling that in other way he would again to kill himself. Later as I heard, 'Intourist' reported to central Committee, they decided to allow him to stay, it was made through Red Cross. He was sent to live in Minsk and to work there at a radio plant.

In 1962 a chief of 6 section 7 department Alekseyev received a phone call from a deputy chief of a former 14 department 1 chief directory Turalin (they know each other). Turalin said that he had a call from Mexico that American Oswald applied to Soviet embassy in Mexico to get a permission to return in Russia. I was ordered by Chelukhov to give a call to KGB of Belorussians and to get a summary of the file on Oswald. The file on him was opened in the beginning of 1960 by a senior case officer of 1 section 7 department Kravtsov K.P. and then sent to Minsk

for \$2. Says one diplomat: "Louis is the greatest operator in Moscow."

Louis was born in Moscow 39 years ago. While a student at the University of Moscow during the Stalin era, he began working for Western embassies. But in 1947 he was accused of being—of all things—a Western agent and was sentenced to 25 years in labor camps. The sentence was cut short in 1956. When he returned to Moscow he worked for the Western press—translator for Daniel Schorr of CBS, secretary to Edmund Stevens, then of Look, and, finally, correspondent for the Evening News.

But in time it became clear that in addition to enjoying valuable contacts with both the Western press and the Soviet Government, Louis was also mining the gap in between. He soon became known as a "door opener." When Jess Gorkin, editor of Parade magazine, decided he'd like to do a story on Khrushchev's life after the fall, he approached Louis, who cleared the idea with the government. Louis's other specialty, some acquaintances argue, is subtly to undercut anti-Soviet information in the West. When Tarsis, who had denounced the Soviet system as "police Fascism," was brought to the West with Louis's help, it looked at first like a victory for free speech. But was it? "We outsmarted you that time," a Soviet diplomat in Washington remarked recently. "When Tarsis was making anti-Soviet pronouncements in Moscow, you listened to him like an oracle. Now you have him in the West and nobody gives a damn what he says."

The same acquaintances think Louis was on a similar mission when he arrived in London last month with a copy of Svetlana's manuscript, snapshots from the Stalin family album, and six Louis by-liners about "Uncle Joe" and his family. Some argued he was out to take the edge off the Svetlana memoirs—scheduled to be published by Harper & Row in October, a month before the 50th an-

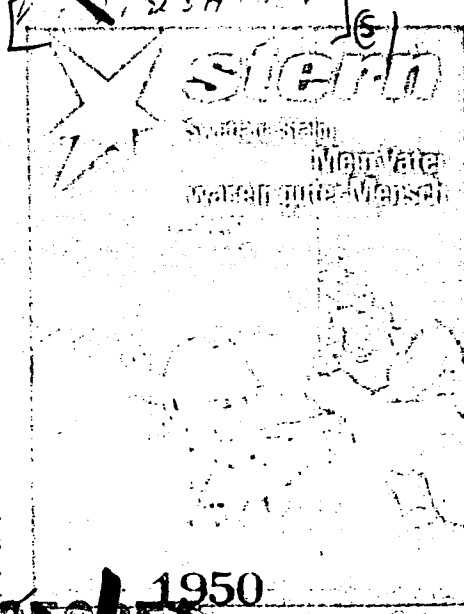
niversary of The Bolshevik revolution. Louis insists he was simply an honest journalist trying to set the Stalin story straight. He wrote two stories for the Evening News and in one of them quoted Svetlana's son, Joseph, 21, as calling her defection a "betrayal." He also sold photographs and interviews to the Daily Express, which ran them last week.

'Disappointed': Whatever else he accomplished, Louis certainly managed to shake up international publishing circles. Der Stern's competitor, Der Spiegel, which had already bought the European serial rights from Harper & Row, was granted a court injunction to stop Der Stern from publishing the story. But last week Der Stern went ahead anyhow and ran the first of three or four installments—keyed largely to photos and a précis of the manuscript. German authorities left Der Stern alone for the time being, but the offending issue was banned in Switzerland on the ground that it was published without Svetlana's approval. And The New York Times and Life magazine announced they would move up their serialization publishing dates from October to September. And how does all the excitement—and notoriety—sit with Victor Louis? "I'm beginning," he says "to get disappointed with people."

Who is Victor Louis?
When Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev fell from power in 1964, who brought the story to the Western world? Victor Louis. When rebellious Russian writer Valery Tarsis was flown out of Moscow last year, who escorted him to London? Victor Louis. And when a pirated manuscript of Svetlana Alliluyeva's memoirs appeared in England and West Germany last month, who was holding on to it? Victor Louis. But who is Victor Louis? "It's not fair for the West to call me a Kremlin agent," he complained last week in Hamburg, where he had just negotiated the sale of the Svetlana story to the magazine Der Stern (circulation: 2.1 million). "Whenever I go outside Russia, someone is suspicious that I am an agent. That makes me sick."

There is also a good deal of suspicion about Louis when he stays in Moscow. Officially, he is a Soviet citizen and a correspondent for The London Evening News. But he knows too much, lives too lavishly and travels too freely to be simply that. He keeps a seven-room apartment in Moscow and a three-story dacha with a small swimming pool in the suburbs. By his own count he has toured 50 countries—"at my own expense," he says—and when he visited Washington last fall he was wined and dined by the State Department and had a friendly chat with Vice President Humphrey.

Insider: Louis's life style has convinced many Westerners in Moscow that he is exactly what he says he is not: an agent for the counterpropaganda office of KGB (secret police), the agency used by the government to pipe expedient information toward the West. As such, Louis is not really regarded as a villain. His information is usually accurate. Moreover, Westerners are fascinated by his entrepreneurial energy and ingenuity. Among other things, he and his British-born wife, Jennifer, produced an inside

Capital. Secret Police On Spot Spy Defections Put Soviet

MEMPHISVILLE, VA. —

The KGB is in trouble again. Soviet secret police agency has had a bad luck in recent months as a result of spy defections reported to be having occurred in the USSR.

A statement printed in Moscow, Feb. 10, in the newspaper "Pravda" announced that Vladimir Semichastny, a former leader of the Young Communist League (Komsomol) and a high-ranking officer of the KGB, was transferred to other work. He was succeeded by Yuri Andropov, a body man of the KGB, who was then a friend and close associate of Leonid Brezhnev, head of the Russian Communist party.

Now, according to East European Communists, Andropov is also in trouble and probably on his way out.

The removal of Semichastny in May was obviously related to the struggle for power between his

patron and mentor, Alexander Sholepov, and Brezhnev. But the Kremlin, it seems, also held Semichastny responsible for the death of Gen. Lukshin, a senior officer of the KGB.

An unprecedented official statement by the Kremlin revealed only that Lukshin "died tragically in the course of his duties." However, East European Communists insisted that he was killed near Khabarovsk, less than 50 miles from Red China, in a battle with Mao Tse-tung's secret army.

They recalled that the decline of Sholepov Semichastny's predecessor in the KGB coincided with the assassination of another high-ranking officer of the secret police, Major Gen. Georgy Naurauskin, who was also reported to have died "while carrying out his service duties."

The demotion of the "young Turks"—Shelenin, Semichastny and a third top official of the KGB, V. S. Titunov — marked

the end of the Komsomol's control of Russia's secret police. All three were appointed to their jobs by Nikita Khrushchev while they were still members of the Young Communist League.

There is no doubt that the Turks were better politicians than officials of the secret police. During their rule of the KGB the United States CIA managed to secure the cooperation of Col. Oleg Penkovsky, a top Russian secret agent who provided an invaluable stream of information to the West until he was caught by the KGB and executed. In addition, numerous Soviet agents had also been flushed out in Western Europe.

It was therefore the task of Andropov to tighten security measures and, above all, stop the defection of Moscow's secret agents.

Undoubtedly, too, Brezhnev slept better at night, knowing that the KGB was in the hands of a man he selected, rather than in the hands of Khrushchev's choice from the ranks of the Komsomol.

But Andropov was in office only three months when Yuri Logunov, a Soviet spy who posed as a Canadian citizen, defected in South Africa. He was an important agent who confessed to espionage in 23 countries.

Then came another blow for which Andropov was held responsible. Stalin's daughter, Svetlana Alliluyeva, eluded the KGB's widespread network and finally found asylum in the United States.

But the greatest blow to Andropov's prestige was the recent defection in West Germany of Lieut. Col. Yevgeny Runge.
