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Cash Offered U. S. Aide by Soviet Agent

VIENNA, Nov. 17 (AP)—A U. S. Embassy spokesman today said a Russian agent offered to pay "huge sums" to diplomat Donald Ullian for information.



The spokesman added that Ullian, a Californian, "acted with the complete confidence of the Embassy" when he went

to meet a Russian agent several weeks ago. Ullian is from the Embassy's communications department.

Vienna police announced last Friday night that they had questioned two persons who "behaved suspiciously" when they met outside Vienna's Sportshall, but both had diplomatic passports and were not detained.

An Embassy spokesman previously had identified the American as Ullian and said he had been approached by a Russian diplomat, but did not say what the Russian wanted. The Austrian news agency APA has said the Russian was "Mail B."

The Embassy spokesman said Ullian first met the Russian last spring and at that time the agent pretended to be a Belgian businessman.

"Several weeks ago the man contacted Mr. Ullian and requested a meeting in front of the Vienna Sportshall. There the agent revealed his true identity and offered to pay the American diplomat huge sums if he would work for the Russians," the spokesman said.

SOVIET RELAXES TOURIST RULES

Bid to Visiting Relatives Seen in Rate Cut—Guido No Longer Required

By THEODORE SHADAD
 Soviet tourist authorities are indirectly encouraging trips by Americans to visit relatives in the Soviet Union, travel agents here said yesterday.

The agents pointed to a recent Soviet announcement of a new, low rate of \$16 a day for room and board. The rate excludes the services of a guide-interpreter. A guide will no longer be required to accompany the visitor.

Robert Elynn of Union Tours, Inc., 1 East Thirty-sixth Street, said the reduced rate was plainly intended for persons who spoke Russian and were more interested in seeing relatives and friends than the sights.

The de luxe tourist arrangement of \$50 a day, which continues in effect, includes the cost of an English-speaking guide and the use of an automobile for three hours a day.

Mr. Elynn conceded that the Soviet Union had lifted travel restrictions in 1955, some of which had been in effect since the Bolshevik Revolution of 1917.

However, he emphasized that

such concern had been greatly lessened recently by the fact that growing numbers of persons had visited the Soviet Union and returned. He noted that Soviet tourist visas provided for both entry and exit and that there had been no reports of interference with a visitor's return to the United States.

The travel agent said plans were being made to publicize the new rate for Russian-speaking persons. The rate goes into effect Jan. 1. Advertisements are to be placed in Yiddish,

Ukrainian, Estonian and other foreign-language papers serving readers who are likely to have friends or relatives in the Soviet Union.

Mr. Elynn said that of the more than 10,000 Americans who visited the Soviet Union this year about 40 per cent were persons of Slavic or other East European backgrounds. The others were professional people, students and bona fide tourists.

The relative ease with which Americans could now be reunited with long-separated family members was illustrated Wednesday by a New York business man who recently returned from the Soviet Union.

He is George H. Bookbinder, assistant to the president of Rand Development Corporation, an industrial research concern of Cleveland. It has its New York office at 420 Lexington Avenue.

Mr. Bookbinder, a native of Bessarabia, now the Soviet Moldavian Republic, told in an interview of meetings with his brother and other members of his family whom he had not seen in twenty-five years.

On the first of several Soviet business trips this year, Mr. Bookbinder telephoned his brother, Shakhna Bookbinder (another form of the family name), who was living with his wife and two daughters, 8 and 10 years old, in the Moldavian town of Dordyushary.

Having been denied Soviet permission to visit Moldavia, Mr. Bookbinder asked his brother to come to Moscow. Shakhna was incredulous.

"How do I know you are my brother?" he said.

Assassination Files

By PAUL SCOTT

One of the most important decisions that President Johnson will make before leaving office next January concerns possible publication of sealed documents from the Warren Commission inquiry of the assassination of President Kennedy.

At least 20 per cent of the commission's files remain locked in the National Archives, where the full record of the Kennedy assassination probe is filed.

A list of more than 250 of the sealed documents was prepared recently by attorneys of the Justice Department for further re-examination to determine if their publication should be recommended to the President.

Most intriguing are reports of the Central Intelligence Agency dealing

with the private reaction of high Cuban officials to the assassination.

Another deals with a top secret CIA memorandum from Richard Helms (now CIA director) to J. Lee Rankin, chief counsel of the Warren Commission. It is listed under the heading: "Report of conversations between Cuban President and Cuban Ambassador."

Also still under seal is a CIA memorandum from Helms to the commission which carries the following notation: "Discussions between Soviet Premier Khrushchev and Drew Pearson re Lee Harvey Oswald." Neither Helms nor Pearson ever commented publicly on this memorandum or its content.

Still unpublished among the many FBI reports in the Archives is the agency's interview with Yuri Nosenko, a high-ranking member of the KGB, the Soviet secret police, who defected to the U.S. 10 weeks after the assassination of President Kennedy.

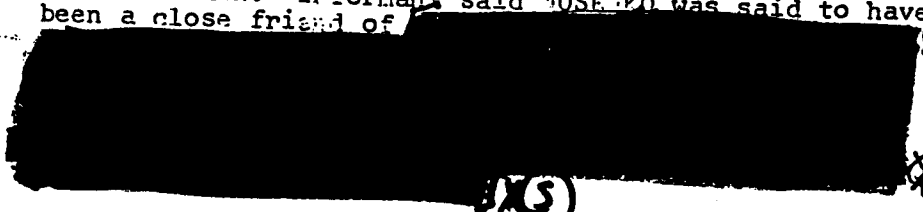

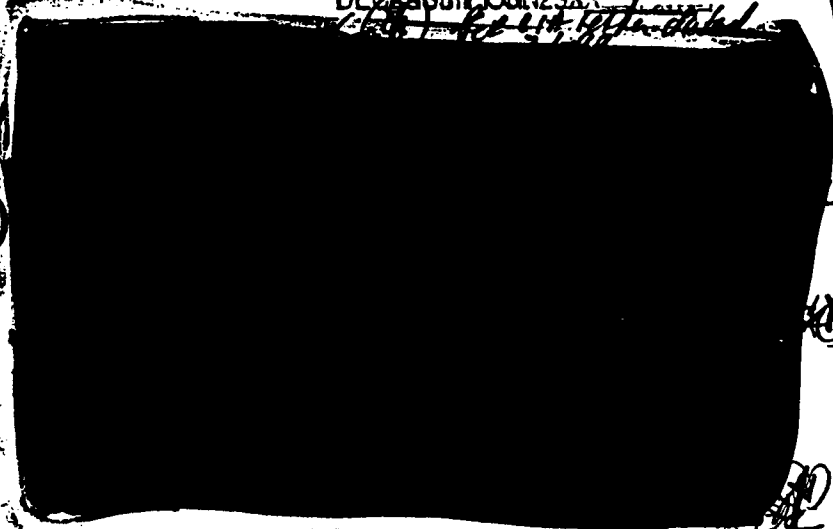

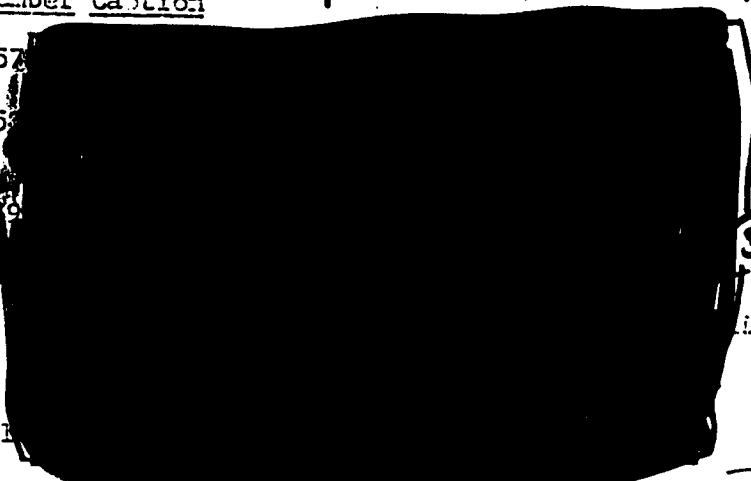
