In the Soviet Union, She's the Highest Ranking Woman

By ENID NEMO

The highest ranking woman in the Soviet Union strode briskly into the sitting room of her suite at the Plaza Hotel and said that America was just as she had expected it would be.

But Yekaterina Alexeyevna Furtseva, the Soviet Minister of Cultural Affairs, who leaves tonight after her first visit to this country, adeptly sidetracked what the expectations had been.

"Of course, I had read a lot and heard a lot and had a certain image," she said. "Nothing was unexpected for me."

Mrs. Furtseva, slimmer than most of her photographs indicate, carefully groomed, cosseted and coiffured, spoke through an interpreter although she obviously understood the gist of some of the questions addressed to her before they were translated into Russian.

She had, she said, heard of the women's movement here and, in her view, "the most important thing for the liberation of women is that there be an equal number of men and women in parliament. . . women elected as governors and senators. . . then there will be equality."

She did not think it important whether women were added to the cabinet, she said, "but I am not the judge; if American women are raising this matter, it is obviously important to them."

Mrs. Furtseva said she herself was always called by her first and patronymic names, "Yekaterina Alexeyevna," although the more formal appellation would be "Tovarich."

The wife of Nikolai P. Firyubin, the deputy minister of foreign affairs, Mrs. Furtseva said she had been asked if Soviet women, due to their political equality, went some after their husbands and toward domestic equality.

Mrs. Furtseva said, "I have heard that in the West, but in our country, we have a different situation."

twinkling as she turned for confirmation to Mrs. M. M. Butrova, head of the Western countries desk in the Ministry of Culture, who acted as interpreter.

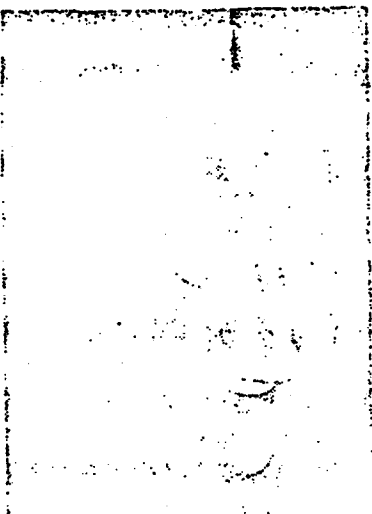
"But," she added hastily, "most men help, not specifically in cooking dinner but in other home chores. . . they go for a walk with the child or shopping. It is widely practiced that men do shopping."

"Any woman, no matter what post she occupies, should remain a woman," she continued. "She should know how to cook and how to keep house nicely. If she does not, she is not a woman."

The subject of payment for housewives drew another smile. The face, adorned with a bare minimum of cosmetics, and the blond hair, swirled in waves and finished with a chignon, shook negatively.

"The highest appraisal . . . payment . . . for women would be respect from the family," she said decisively. "They should understand that bringing up children and keeping the house is also important. There is no question of money. The best payment is of the heart."

The mother of one daughter and the grandmother of an eight-year-old who is a student at the Bolshoi Ballet, she said, she thought that communal centers for children were good "because children get used to living in society. . . it inflicts good qualities on them. . . they are less selfish."

"But naturally, we think that most important thing is family life. . . they should not be torn away from their families, they should be raised by the family. Nowadays, we attach great importance to the responsibility of family upbringing for a child."

The generation gap, she said, was "sometimes a problem misunderstood in the whole world."

"Naturally, youngsters should have a life of their own and parents should understand it," she said. "When parents don't, conflict arises."

As a whole, I would say there is no such problem in our country. Such things manifest themselves in a kind of unrest and there is none in the Soviet."

Went to Peking

Mrs. Furtseva, who is 61 years old, graduated as a chemical engineer from a Moscow technical institute, and entered the highest level of Soviet policy negotiations in 1954 when she accompanied Nikita S. Krushchev and Nikolai A. Bulganin on a visit to Peking. A long time friend of Mr. Krushchev's, she rose from a textile worker to a party organizer of youth groups and the city of Moscow's Communist leader. She is now a full member of the ruling Central Committee of the Communist party.

Apparently uninterested in fashion during her climb, and early years in power, Mrs. Furtseva is now a walking advertisement and spokesman for Soviet culture. Her trim, pleated tweed dress, worn with an abstract design gold pin and a simple gold bracelet, was custom made for her and her newly acquired dark mink coat ("Russian mink. . . Russian style") was created by Stanislav Zaitsev, the best-known Soviet designer. The coat, displayed with gobs, had a bodice of vertically worked skins and a skirt of horizontal skins.

"In Western Europe, they use our fashions very much

but don't say they are ours," she said, and went on to enumerate embroidered shirts, high boots and fur hats as some of the fashions with origins in Russia.

There are no so-called fashion leaders in the Soviet Union, she said.

The fashions change quickly," she said. "It was minis last year and the young still wear them . . . nowadays everyone wears what she likes . . . they mainly like to wear what is becoming."

Mrs. Furtseva, who said she had her first cheeseburger, hamburger and cheese cake during her 10-day visit here ("It's not what the dish is but how it is cooked; what we had was very good") also, according to an aide, discovered California white wines during her brief stay in Los Angeles and San Francisco.

"She thought them very good," the aide said.

"The most important thing I can tell you," Mrs. Furtseva said, "is that I met many people and we seem to have reached a good understanding. Naturally we communicated mainly about cultural exchanges, but everywhere I visited, I always heard the same sentence 'we would like to visit the Soviet.'"

She noted that of the 32 American artistic groups that had visited her country in the last 10 years, the symphony orchestras "attracted the most attention and are the

most popular . . . ~~also~~ the ballet."

Her three-day program in the city included visits to the Guggenheim Museum, Museum of Modern Art and Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Also on the agenda were lunches with Soviet and other government officials ("lunches, lunches, lunches") and a meeting with David Rockefeller.

Her few private engagements included a brief visit on Monday evening to "No, No, Nanette," a reunion with Maria Callas, and a cocktail party at the "21" Club, arranged by Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Hament. Mr. Hament is president of the Hament Corp., the company that is reproducing some of the works in the Russian arts and crafts exhibition now at the Corcoran Gallery in Washington.

Shopping? She threw up her hands in a mock gesture of despair.

"When do I have the time?" she asked. "I stopped in briefly to see a Safeway store in Los Angeles and I drove along Fifth Avenue here."

A well manicured hand was extended in a firm farewell clasp and she disappeared into the bedroom to retrieve her mink coat and get on to the next appointment. Outside the suite, in the corridor and an adjoining bedroom with the door wide open, five secret service men and women kept vigil.

Top Moscow Theater Director to Visit U.S.

Moscow's leading theater producer and director, Yuri Lyubimov, is expected to arrive here shortly on his first visit to the United States, U.S. and Soviet officials disclosed yesterday.

Lyubimov, who is director of the avant-garde Taganyka Theater, had been scheduled to arrive last Saturday along with poet Yevgeny Yevtushenko. Both men postponed their flight to New York, Lyu-

bimov due to a sudden illness, according to the officials.

Lyubimov, who is the most controversial figure in Soviet theater, has been repeatedly criticized by Soviet conservatives for the emphasis in his stage productions on individual freedoms in society. Several of his plays have been summarily closed after their premieres and he was dismissed from his post in 1963.

After he made a direct appeal to party leader Leonid Brezhnev, Lyubimov was rein-

stated but his foreign travel was restricted.

The 53-year-old Lyubimov has staged a series of classical and contemporary plays.

He gave each an imaginative and modernistic treatment that has made the Taganyka the most popular theater in Moscow.

A play that dealt with the assassination of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy was banned after the first night, though it received public acclaim.

Here's Tartuff, Lyubimov was accused by conservatives for betraying the principles of socialist realism in a fuore that lasted several months.

The decision to permit Lyubimov to visit the United States - - - as a tourist - - - was interpreted by U.S. analysts as a significant favorable development in Soviet cultural policies.

Lyubimov is scheduled to visit New York, Chicago, Philadelphia and Washington. He is said to be planning a new

play about the United States based on Yevtushenko's poems.

Yevtushenko, who will be guest of Doubleday Co., the New York publishers, is scheduled to make a coast-to-coast tour of the country. His new book of poems, "Stolen Apples," is being published by the firm.

The poet's trip was arranged well in advance. Yevtushenko, whose trips to America in 1963 and 1965 made him popular with college audiences, will tour a number of campuses and is to appear on major television shows, including Today, Dick Cavett and David Frost.

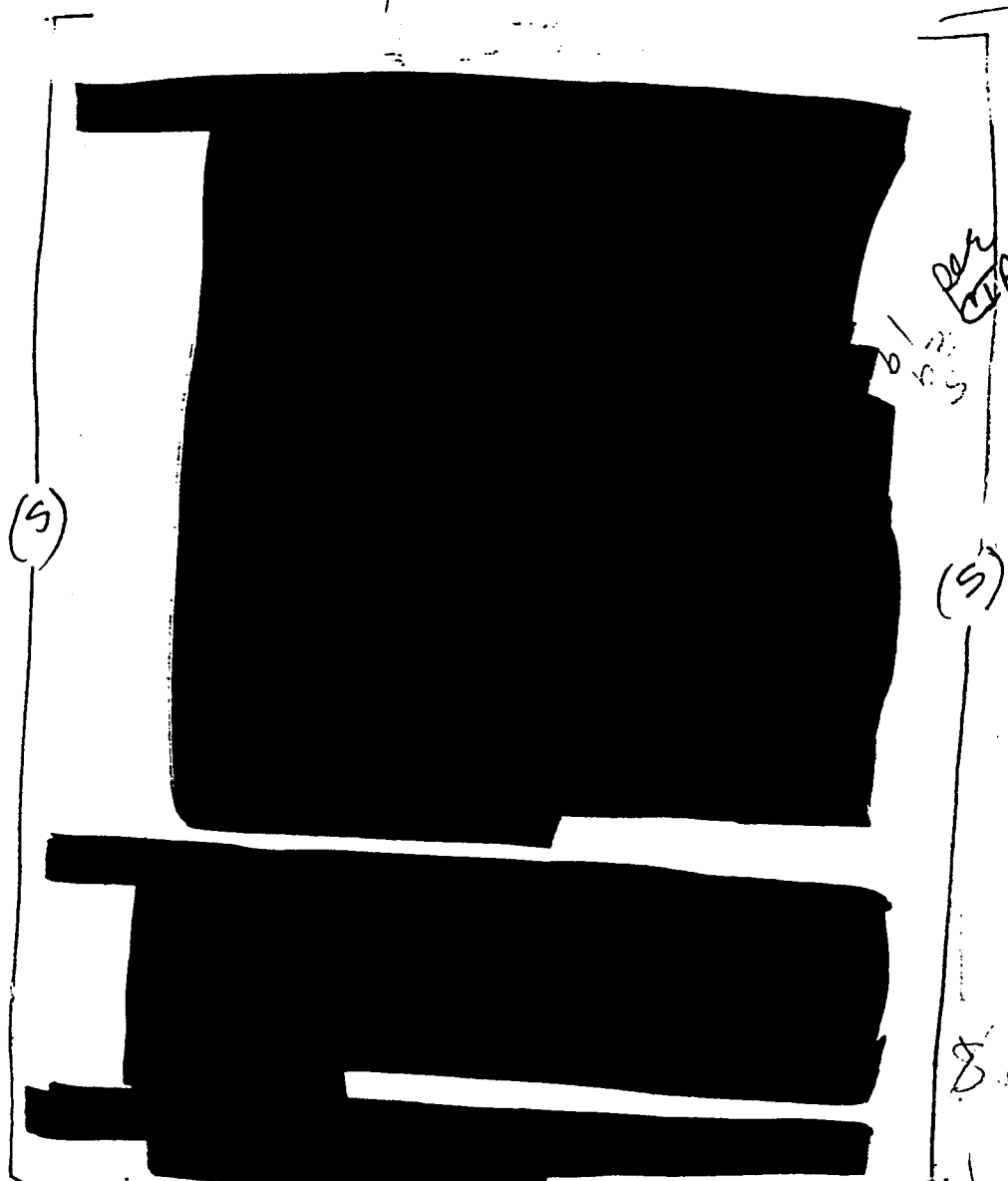
