GREGORY then started his speech and stated as follows:

"I don't usually talk to 'Niggers'," and he ridiculed his audience as being stupid for attending the white college when they should have been in a black college. He subtly questioned them concerning bad grades in school due to their color. Eventually five students raised their hands and indicated they had received bad grades because of their race. He then said, "You don't know it, but you have the white man afraid of you," and indicated that if he were a white racist speaking at Tulane, that they, the students, would be picketing and demonstrating, but yet no one was picketing or demonstrating him. He indicated that they were being brainwashed, but they were still "Niggers." He questioned them "What do you think would happen if one of your white friends took you home for dinner," and then compared that with bringing home BEULAH, the Negro maid who has four illegitimate children and introduce her as your girl friend.

He said that illegitimacy is nothing to be ashamed of and stated that many college girls are extremely promiscuous.

He then mentioned that he had attended a white school in 1954, and criticized the authorities there for being hypocritical in their racial harmony attitude. He described the United States as a "sickened, insane country" and that if the situation did not change in three years, it would be really sad. He indicated he knew children in Chicago who would, if he told them <sup>tanks</sup> were filled with narcotics, take on tanks if tanks were ever brought in for riots in Chicago.

His talk was followed by a short question and answer period, during which he was asked the following questions:

"What was his position on the boycott of the olympics by Negroes?"

He implied that the Negro must stop being an animal for white people, while they, the whites, are taking the credit. He stated many colleges are making money off black athletes and not giving them credit.

Regarding Negroes in the Army, GREGORY indicated that it was up to the fool involved and it was his business. Any Negro soldier who fights the foreigner he does not know is the fool, because he should be in Mississippi, fighting

the cracker rednecks, not the foreigners. If a man was sent to Europe, GREGORY indicated that this training could be utilized in the United States, and cited possible use of bazookas and dynamite by Negroes should riots break out.

When asked what can black people do, he answered that they must become more aware of what the Democratic system of Government is doing to them and that at eighteen years of age, they can die fighting a foreign nation, but do not have the right to vote. He stated that all Negroes must think of black as being beautiful and that with the genocide policies of the white man, eventually all Negroes will have to join together.

At this point, GREGORY indicated to his audience how intelligent he thought HO CHI MINH by relating that he had been contacted telephonically via Paris from Hanoi concerning a Negro pilot by the name of GREGORY who had been shot down by the North Vietnamese. They inquired as to whether the pilot was a relative of GREGORY to which GREGORY replied "Hell no, kill that crazy 'Nigger."

The theme of the speech given by GREGORY at Mc Allister Hall was the insanity of the United States, during which he compared it with HITLER's Nazi Germany. This comparison included that of the massacre of innocent people in Viet Nam with the destruction of ten million Jews by HITLER. GREGORY said that wealthy people in the United States have no sons in Viet Nam, and that they are profiting from the war. He stated the FBI is out in the audience watching me, little me. "I tell them I'm non-violent." GREGORY gave the impression that the FBI was always following him because they are afraid of the truth which he tells. GREGORY went so far as to estimate that seventeen to twenty FBI Agents were in the audience. He then mentioned the debate in Congress concerning the Open Housing Law and stated that the Negro has been in the United States for 400 years and that all Americans have rights under the Constitution, yet the United States Congress has to pass a bill for the Negro to live in certain areas. He said STALIN's daughter, who is a communist, has come into the

United States, and she can live anywhere. He indicated that RAP BROWN and STOKELY CARMICHAEL have the white man deathly afraid. He recalled how six years ago STOKELY CARMICHAEL was completely non-violent and said that when CARMICHAEL left the United States and visited Cuba, and other countries, he never told a lie in the speeches he gave, but that President JOHNSON lies everyday and that the one thing about him is his consistency. He indicated that the Negro is doing nothing more than echoing the words of PATRICK HENRY, "Give me liberty or give me death." He stated that when HENRY said it, it concerned a tax on tea, and now 85 percent of Americans do not even drink tea. He recalled that during the search for three murdered civil rights workers in Alabama, the authorities had uncovered the bodies of three Negroes and had immediately<sup>ly</sup> interred them when they found out they were not those they were looking for. He said that the United States is the most racist society in the world and that its society has created the Negro racist attitude. He mentioned the right of dissent contained in the Constitution, and yet the FBI follows him about. He said "They're all racists and J. EDGAR HOOVER is a fairy. To show how the United States lies, he suggested

that the audience might obtain back copies of newspapers and add up the casualties shown for the Vietcong over the past four or five years. He said according to these, the Vietcong produce more children than rice. He then recalled how a redneck Sheriff in Alabama, had turned loose a lesbian on a four year old girl and how in Grenada, Mississippi, a five year old boy had been hit in the mouth by a brick during a demonstration. He said the FBI knows all about this and they did not do a thing when it happened. He then mentioned that the press condemned STOKELY CARMICHAEL for "reverse racism" when he kicked all the whites out of SNCC in 1966. He said CARMICHAEL was just being honest and that the whites are dishonest because they have do not have the guts to do what CARMICHAEL did in their organizations. He said the United States is sick and crazy and like HITLER, when a country starts killing it cannot stop. Here the United States is supposedly helping South Viet Nam and when the United States did not even sign the Geneva Treaty. The United States Government should worry about the treaty they made with the Indians who are still suffering on the reservations. The people of the world are now aware of what the United States really stands for and will not call on



the United States to fight communism for them because of what the United States has done to the South Vietnamese people.

GREGORY stated he is now in the twenty-first day of a forty day fast and during this time he will not shave, get a haircut, and will wear nothing but work clothes. In this regard, he recommended that the audience not get haircuts or shaves until the war ends and that this would really effect the economy of the United States. He also mentioned that eight cents on each pack of cigarettes goes to the Federal Government and that the audience might stop smoking, which would also hurt the Federal Government.

GREGORY recommended that policemen and firemen should make up to \$10,000.00 a year and that if people want them to do a decent job, they must pay them a decent salary. He asked them to support the local police. He ended his speech by stating that again Americans must make a stand and be willing to go into the poverty areas of the United States.

His speech ended at approximately 11:00 P.M.

CANCLER was a witness in Orleans Parish District Attorney JIM GARRISON's probe of the assassination of President KENNEDY. In this connection it has been alleged CANCLER was released from Orleans Parish Prison (when he was in custody there) by GARRISON for the purpose of planting

evidence in the apartment of CLAY SHAW, who is charged by GARRISON with conspiring in a plot to assassinate President KENNEDY.

On 7/12/67, CANCLER appeared in Criminal District Court, Orleans Parish, on a motion for new trial on a burglary charge, which was denied, and also a motion was refused to set aside a multiple offender charge filed against him.

At approximately 5:15 p.m., on August 6, 1968, DAVID RICHMOND appeared at the New Orleans Office and requested to be interviewed. RICHMOND furnished the following information:

He advised that at approximately noon, on August 6, 1968, he traveled to 700 Baronne Street, to see MAX HILL, who owns a frame shop at this address. He advised HILL is a personal friend and he obtained a \$50 loan from him. He stated HILL then accompanied him to lunch at Lennie's, which is located a few doors down on Baronne Street.

He advised after lunch he and HILL departed company and he walked to the corner of Baronne and Girod Streets. He advised he was standing at this corner waiting for a streetcar when a dark maroon Camaro, year unknown, pulled up and stopped. There were four white men in this vehicle and two of these men got out of the car and walked over to him. One of the men said "Someone from GARRISON's office will contact you in the near future about your association with DAVID FERRIE. If you want to stay healthy and keep your family healthy, you won't say anything. Let's get into the car and talk about it." He advised he entered the Camaro and sat in the back seat and the driver drove down Baronne Street and into the French Quarter. He stated that while in the car, these men asked him questions as to why he left his last job at Edwards Engineering, and how he liked his new job at Alliance Machinery and how the new baby was doing.

He advised that unsubs two and four are the individuals that got out of the car and spoke to him.

He advised that he had met DAVID FERRIE on several occasions, but he was not a close friend of FERRIE and knew nothing about him, except what he read in the newspapers. He advised he met FERRIE once at the Traveler Hotel in Miami, Fla., and met him again in 1960 or 1961 at the Lakefront Airport, in New Orleans.

RICHMOND advised that he desired protection. He was advised by SA THOMAS E. DUHADWAY that the FBI could not afford him protection and that he should contact the New Orleans Police Department. SA THOMAS E. DUHADWAY telephonically contacted the NOPD, Third District, and spoke with Lieutenant LACOSTE, at 6:10 p.m. Lieutenant LACOSTE was advised of RICHMOND's complaint and his desire for protection and RICHMOND spoke to Lieutenant LACOSTE on the telephone.

RICHMOND made inquiries as to whether or not he should contact the District Attorney, and he was advised by SA THOMAS E. DUHADWAY that this advice could not be given to him and that any decision made as to whether or not to contact Mr. GARRISON's office would have to be made by himself. RICHMOND decided that he wished to contact GARRISON's office and he made a phone call to GARRISON's office, but was unable to speak to anyone at this time. RICHMOND advised that he was going to his residence where he would remain for the evening and that

he planned to contact Mr. GARRISON in the morning of August 7, 1968. SA WILLIAM B. WOOD was present during the interview of RICHMOND.

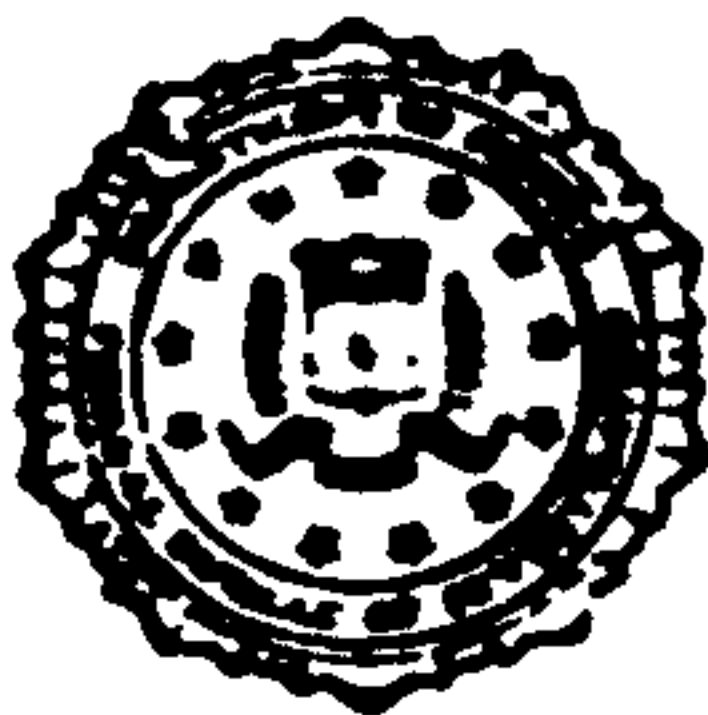

On December 1, 1976, at about 2:10 p.m., Supervisor [REDACTED] telephonically contacted GORDON NOVEL at 283-8885, in response to his desire to discuss a [REDACTED] allegation, as relayed by Complaint Clerk [REDACTED]

An individual who acknowledged he was GORDON NOVEL stated that in general he strongly believes he is the victim of a violation of Federal [REDACTED] statutes in that he has not been granted due process in his legal defense on recent charges of aggravated arson, tried in State of Louisiana District Court. Specifically he stated that he believed the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the United States Department of Justice and the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) must be in conspiracy with each other to deny him a fair trial. He did not receive a satisfactory response to a request generated by his lawyers to receive the results of a FBI investigation into a previous allegation made by NOVEL against a Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) agent. In addition, NOVEL alleged that Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) Agent [REDACTED] has been intimidating a witness for NOVEL's defense. NOVEL further alleged that local CIA Agent [REDACTED] perjured himself during NOVEL's recent trial, and besides this being another example of such a conspiracy by Federal agencies against NOVEL, NOVEL's lawyers are undertaking perjury charges against [REDACTED]

After Supervisor [REDACTED] explained that the FBI's responsibility in such matters is to determine the facts of such allegations and to forward them to the [REDACTED] Division of the United States Department of Justice (as had been accomplished with NOVEL's previous allegation), NOVEL stated that he would execute a detailed statement of these several specific allegations and would forward it to the New Orleans Office of the FBI.

In conclusion NOVEL stated frankly that he wanted to "stir the waters," in order to get effective action taken on his complaints, and that he felt the FBI and Justice Department had been "indolent" in not sufficiently responding

to NOVEL's past charges. He said that as part of his own countermeasures, in order to force Federal action, he has had lengthy conversations with an unnamed United States senator and the senator's staff, and had been promised a lengthy period of time to testify before the committee that will reopen the investigation of the assassination of President KENNEDY. NOVEL's purpose in so testifying would be to discredit Federal agencies, especially the CIA, showing that the CIA had engineered the assassination of the President.

NOVEL was polite on the telephone, but did state, "Are you reading me?" ANDERSON responded that, as in all cases where the FBI received information from the public regarding potential violations of [REDACTED] (b)(7)(c) the FBI is obligated to determine those facts and furnish them to the United States Department of Justice. Thus, ANDERSON stated, he would look for NOVEL's statement to be mailed to the New Orleans FBI Office.

As of December 10, 1976, the New Orleans Office of the FBI had not received any subsequent written or oral communication from GORDON NOVEL.
