We made arrival at SW Pass pilot at 6:24 pm., Sept. 17, got a pilot right away and proceeded in, docking at Celeste Street Wharf at 3:42 am., Sept. 18. Cargo operations commenced at 8 am., Sept. 18 and ceased at 12 midnite same date.

2/

The vessel shifted under power and with tug and pilot to the Army Base at 6:24 am., Sept. 19, completing shift at 7:36 am.

Loading of MSTS cargo at the Army Base started at 8 am., Sept. 19 and completed at 3:45 am., Sept. 20th.

Four (4) passengers embarked at 3:30 pm., Sept. 19, bound for Le Havre.

5/

The vessel sailed from the Army Base, New Orleans at 6:24 am., Sept. 20, departing South Pass at 2:18 pm., same date, bound for La Pallice.

Shortly before dark on Sept. 20 we ran into heavy rain squalls and freshening SE winds and due to impaired visibility, we were forced to proceed on reduced speed. By the time visibility improved sufficiently to allow resumption of full speed, a heavy head sea had built up and it was necessary to proceed on reduced rpms during the nite in order to avoid shipping heavy seas forward. Wind and seas moderated sufficiently by 7:40 am., Sept. 21 to permit normal full speed. The weather continued squally and threatening thruout passage across the Gulf and thru the Florida Straits.

7/

During the nite of Sept. 22, Hurricane "GRACIE" developed in the lower Bahamas. However, by the time we received a warning on it, we were pretty well along in the Straits, and due to a large high pressure system known to exist along the Atlantic seaboard, I felt that GRACIE'S progress ahead would be rather slow, allowing us ample time to pass well ahead of it and into the open Atlantic. This proved to be correct. At about 8:30 am., Sept. 23 in the vicinity of Lat 28-20 N., Long. 79-40 W., we shaped a GC to Lat 42 N., Long 50 W., along which course we proceeded for the next few days, enjoying good weather and keeping well clear of the effects of Hurricane "GRACIE". In the vicinity of Lat 40-44 N., Lo. 55-19 W., we began encountering heavy swells from the NE and it was decided to shape a Rhumb Line Course to Lat 40-55 N., Lo. 50 W., and on arrival at this point a new RL course was shaped direct to La Pallice.

8/

We made arrival at La Pallice pilot at 5:54 am., Oct 5, having logged a distance of 4613 miles from PS to PS at an average speed of 13.38 knots per hour. Our distance logged was 28 miles more than the GC distance for the same passage. (GREAT CIRCLE)

We shipped a La Pallice pilot and proceeded. On boarding the pilot told me that he thought that we would be too late for the tide and would have to anchor. However, on arrival off the port, the harbor pilot and tugs were waiting to take us in. The vessel locked thru at 8:23 am., and made fast at the dock at 9 am., Oct 5, with cargo operations commencing at once. The head stevedore and the agent's representative informed me that cargo would be finished about 8 pm., and that the vessel could sail on the tide at 6 am., Oct. 6th. Accordingly we set sailing time for 6 am., Oct. 6th.

At about 7 pm., Oct. 5, vessel's agent informed me that cargo would not finish at 8 pm., as expected and that no work would be done after that hour, therefore, cargo operations would be resumed at 8 am., Oct 6 and would probably finish around noon, allowing vessel to sail on the pm., tide.

Cargo operations were resumed at 8 am., Oct. 6 and completed at 11 am. Sailing scheduled for 5 pm.

3 ✓ The vessel left dock at 5:06 pm., Oct 6., locked thru and proceeded seaward, departing for Le Havre at 6:18 pm.

On board sailing La Pallice, F/Oil: 4672 bbls., F/Water: 254 tons.
Draft " " " F. 23'07", A. 26'08", Mn. 25'01".

4 ✓ The vessel arrived at Le Havre pilot station at 3:48 am., Oct 8, got a pilot on at once and proceeded in, locking thru at 5:19 am., and docking at Quai Garonde #3 at 6:30 am. Cargo operations commenced at 8 am, continued until 11pm., resuming again at 8 am., Oct 9 and completing at Noon with vessel sailing at 2 pm., on the tide and departing for Dunkirk at 4:06 pm.

On board sailing Le Havre, F/Oil: 4391 bbls. F/Water: 223 tons.
Draft " " " F. 22'05", A. 25'01", Mn. 23'09".

We made arrival at Dunkirk pilot at 1:36 am., Oct 10, got a pilot right away, proceeded, arriving at Dunkirk Breakwater at 3:45 am., locked thru at 4:21 am and made fast at Berth #7 at 5:06 am.

Cargo operations at Dunkirk commenced at 8 am., Oct 10 and completed at 4:25 pm., with vessel sailing for Rotterdam at 5:06 pm., and departing at 6:36 pm.

On board sailing Dunkirk, F/Oil: 4293 bbls., F/Water: 222 tons..
Draft " " " F. 20'11", A. 25'01", Mn. 23'00".

We took a coast pilot thru the NE passage to Rotterdam, thus saving about 40 miles in distance. We made arrival at the Maas River Pilot at 11:36 pm Oct 10, docked at the Java Line Dock, Rotterdam at 2:30 am., Oct. 11.

Vessel idle over Sunday.

Discharge of Rotterdam general commenced at 8 am., Oct 12., continuing at a slow pace until 4:45 pm., the following day when all general was out. 6 pm., vessel shifted under power and with tugs and pilot to the Waalhaven Dolphins, completing the shift at 7:18 pm., with the discharge of Bulk Sulphur from #2 & #4 hatches to lighters commencing at once, to continue at a very slow pace until 9 pm., Octo. 14, when all was out and hatches covered. We sailed for Antwerp at 9:18 pm., departing at 11:42 pm.

On board sailing Rotterdam, F/Oil: 4125 bbls., F/Water 175 tons.
Draft " " " F. 14'08", A. 23'00", Mn. 18'10".

We made arrival at East Gat Pilot Station at 2:24 am., Oct 15, got a pilot at 2:43 am., proceeded, arriving at Flushing and changing pilots at 4:20 am., proceeding up river and coming to an anchor off Kruischans Lock at 8:41 am., to await our turn in the lock. We got a signal to go in at 10:06 am., and upped anchor, proceeded into lock, locking thru at 12:08 pm., and docking at Lykes Lines Pier at 12:48 pm.

Discharge of Antwerp general commenced at 2pm., Oct. 15 and completed at 4 am Oct 16.

5 am., Oct. 16, vessel shifted from Lykes Lines Dock to Berth #234, completing shift at 6:12 am., with the discharge of Bulk Sulphur commencing shortly there after and completing at 3:45 pm., same date. By the way, Antwerp is so far ahead of Rotterdam as regards cargo handling, both general and bulk, that there is no comparison. ✓

The vessel sailed for Bremerhaven at 4:30 pm., Oct 16, locking out and proceeding seaward at 6:15 pm., and departing at the East Gat Pilot at 10:42 pm., same date.

On board sailing Antwerp, F/Oil: 4011 bbls., F/Water 300 tons.
Draft " " F. 9'00", A. 17'00", M., 13'00".

With prospects of good visibility on departure Antwerp pilot, I decided to take the ship along the Dutch Coastal Route to Bremerhaven. This proved to be a good choice, as we enjoyed good visibility and logged a very good average speed on the passage, making our arrival at the Weser pilot at 2:36 pm., Oct., 17. However, on arrival, we found the pilot boat flying a "no pilot available" signal. We hove to until 4:03 pm., when we got a pilot that had just brought another ship out. We proceeded in and came to an anchor off Bremerhaven at 6:57 pm., to await the tide. We got a dock pilot, upped anchor at 9:10 pm., locked in and made fast at 11:06 pm.

Cargo operations at Bremerhaven commenced at 12 midnite Oct 17 and completed at 10:30 am Oct 18. Cleaning gangs working in #1 & #3 hatches.

The vessel sailed for Bremen on the tide at 3 pm Oct 18, docking at Berth 3, Europahaven at 9:06 pm., same date.

Discharge of Bremen cargo commenced at 6 am Oct 19, completing at 10:45 pm., same date.

Vessel shifted under power and with tugs and pilot to Berth "A" at 5:12 am., Oct 20, completing shift at 5:48 am. Cargo operations were resumed at 6 am.

Five (5) passengers embarked at 3 pm., Oct. 20th.

Sailing time was set for 6 am Oct 21, based on estimated finishing time furnished the vessel by our office. However, cargo operations did not finish cargo until 9:20 am Oct 21. Vessel sailed for Southampton at 9:30 am., departing at the Weser L/V at 4:12 pm.

All signs pointing to good visibility along the coast, it was decided to take the vessel along the Dutch Coastal Route instead of the longer route outside. Thus, we proceeded along the coastal route, enjoying moderate to good visibility, however, our speed was hampered a good deal by gale force winds from the West and SW, which persisted during most of the coastal trip.

The vessel arrived at Southampton pilot at 12:48 am Oct 23, got a pilot right away, docked at Berth #34 at 3:24 am., same date.

Cargo operations at Southampton commenced at 8 am., Oct 23, completing at 7:40 pm same date.

The vessel sailed from Berth 34, Southampton at 10 pm., Oct 23, departing Needle Pilot Station at 12:42 am., Oct 24 bound for New Orleans.

For the first few days out of the English Channel, westbound, we encountered long swells from the NW, which hindered our speed somewhat. However, after passing the Azores in the evening of Oct. 27, we began to experience fine weather and smooth seas, which prevailed until we were about 165 miles from South Pass on Nov 6, when a strong "norther" struck, causing vessel to pound, and thus necessitating a drastic reduction of engine speed. We proceeded under reduced speed for the next 23 hours, arriving at South Pass at 11 a. m. Nov. 7th. We got a pilot right away, proceeded up river, arriving at Quarantine at 7:16pm, clearing at 8:35 pm, and docking at the Army Base at 9:18 pm. Passengers debarked at 9:45 pm.

Cargo operations at the Army Base commenced at 8 a. m. Nov. 8, completed at 11:25 pm.

Vessel shifted from the Army Base to Cotton Warehouse at 4:36 pm, Nov 8, completing shift at 5:48 pm.

Cargo operations - discharge - at Cotton Warehouse commenced at 6 pm, Nov 8, completed at 5:25 am, Nov. 9, with vessel sailing for Houston at 6:15 am, departing SW Pass at 1:42 pm.

Both wipers, Alfredo Jackson, Z#762871 and Pedro Chamorro, Z#56393, missed the ship at sailing time New Orleans and ceased to be members of the ship's crew. They returned to the vessel at Galveston Nov 10 and removed their gear.

At 4:26 pm, Nov. 9, we received orders by radio to proceed to Galveston.

The vessel arrived at Galveston pilot at 8:18 a. m. Nov. 10, docked at Pier 36 S. at 10:24 am.

Discharge of inbound commenced at 1 pm Nov. 10 and finished at 7:45 pm.

Cleaning gangs working in No's. 1, 3 & 5 cleaning for Sulphur cargo.

Vessel shifted to Pier 14 at 6 am., Nov.-11, completing shift at 6:54 am.

✓ 9:30 am., Nov. 12, received notice to end V/110 as of 12 midnite, Nov. 10th.

Crew paid off for V/110 at 6 pm., Nov. 10, and new articles opened for V/111, effective Nov. 11, 1959.

Duration of voyage: 62 days.

✓ PASSENGERS: Nine (9) passengers were carried this time, four (4) eastbound and five (5) westbound. Mr. & Mrs. Geo. B. Church, Tampa, Fla., Mr. Billy J. Lord, Midland, Texas and Mr. Lee H. Oswald, Fort Worth, Texas made the eastbound passage with us. Westbound, we had Mr. & Mrs. Armando Acosta, Houston, Texas, Miss. Renate Fischer, Heidelberg, Germany and Mrs. June Hartenthaler, St. Petersburg, Fla., and Mr. Adrian Derden of Houston, Texas. All appeared to enjoy the trip.

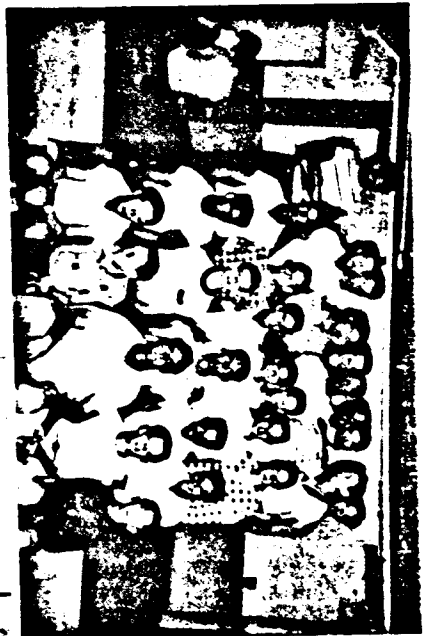

RADIO STATION WBEH

Beaurgard has the distinction of having the only student-owned and operated radio station in the world on a junior or senior high school level. It was started in 1949 by Mr. Robert Evans. It broadcasts on a frequency of 89.3 megacycles in the FM band, and can be heard for a radius of 10 miles. Programs vary from original plays and poems to recorded science lectures. I have just received your letter and it is apparent to me that there is a misunderstanding somewhere. My reasons for wishing to have the children return are due to the fact that when I marry I shall have to travel with my husband to such places as he may have to work. We are not able to establish a home now for the children because Mr. Ekdahl's work takes him from city to city. He was only in Dallas a few months when he was transferred to New York then to Denver, now Fort Worth. No written report received, however, Pastor Honold reported verbally on several cases as follows:-

A member of the Board of Directors of the Home for Incurables advised that they would return \$150.00 of the money paid them for the care of Miss. Hilda Poeck.

A case was submitted by Pastor Nau from Redeemer Church involving a boy 10 years of age, ¹ boy 8 years and another 2 years. The mother was married to a Mr. Pic ~~Wagner~~, later married to a Mr. Oswald who has also died. While she has some money left from insurance policies finds it necessary to seek employment and would like to have the children placed in the home. Pastor Nau was informed we could do nothing about the boy 2 years old, but something might be done about the other two children. Matter placed in the hands of the Committee with full power to act.
